"We were supposed to leave for Sri Lanka tomorrow but we are not being able to do so. Head BCB CEO [Nizamuddin Chowdhury sat for a meeting and decided to give a three-day break also informed that the BCB was to the players. # No surprises in store for Barcelona



Barcelona fans would have imagined this season as a fresh start after ending a dismal campaign with an 8-2 hammering to Bayern Munich. Instead, things
