Saudi Returnees

Arrange more flights for their return to KSA

Momen urges Riyadh DIPLOMATIC CORRESPONDENT

Dhaka has urged Riyadh to increase flight frequency between Bangladesh and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) to facilitate quick return of

Bangladeshi migrant workers to their

workplaces in the gulf nation. Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen made the call during a telephone conversation with Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal Bin Farhan Al-Saud vesterday evening.

Momen welcomed the Saudi Araba's decision of renewing visa and extending iqama (work permit) period of the stranded Bangladeshi

He also requested his Saudi counterpart to allow Biman Bangladesh Airlines to operate flights between Dhaka and Dammam.

DGs run by a driver!

Malek used to know every move made at the DGHS. A section of the staff members and officers used to give him the information.

Two administrative officers, two personal assistants of top officials and several office assistants joined hands with Malek to lobby for appointments and transfers of officers and other employees at the DGHS, the official

Mohammad Shahjahan, personal assistant to the DG, used to inform Malek about every move the DG made at the office, the source added.

An employee of the Institute of Public Health, which operates under the DGHS, said two administrative officers and one store keeper of the institute used to inform Malek about important files and documents.

Malek knew how to capitalise on the information and make money.

Whenever an officer disagreed with Malek, he fed newspapers information against the officer and made sure everyone read the news when it got published.

"This is why officials did not cross him," a source said.

Through lobbying, he not only gained large amounts of money and assets, but also reportedly had 27 of his relatives recruited at the DGHS.

Malek's properties include 24 flats in three multi-storey buildings he owns in the capital and a dairy firm, all of which has a combined value of over Tk 100 crore, according to Rab. Malek's name was in a list made

by the Anti-Corruption Commission ACC) in early 2019 of 45 grade III and IV health sector employees who were possibly involved in corruption. THE RISE OF MALEK'S WEALTH

Malek started the job in 1982. He first tasted power in early 2000 when Syed Modasser Ali was the DG. He became a close aide of Modasser and started exercising power.

Sources in law enforcement agencies said the driver started making a fortune in 2009 when he chauffeured around the then DGHS chief Prof Shah Monir Hossain.

Malek successfully lobbied for the appointment of over 100 assistant directors in upazilas and earned over several crores, an officer said, preferring anonymity.

Shah Monir also got financial benefits from Malek's lobbying, he

qama yesterday using a recommended application. "The app showed my iqama was still invalid'," said the migrant worker, who

lived in Saudi Arabia for more than two decades. "I am very worried now," he said, adding that he saw some other workers' iqamas get renewed automatically.

Alam said the app showed his igama had been invalid for the past two months. He communicated with his employer in Saudi Arabia who advised him to communicate with Saudi

EMBASSY Migrant workers were not allowed to

Saudi Arabian embassy has provided a list of the service offices that police distributed among the workers. Firoz, who was on duty, said those

offices will provide the required services to the workers on behalf of the Saudi embassy He added that the migrant workers were asked to communicate via those

agencies as giving such a large number of people access to the embassy was difficult amid the pandemic situation. SAUDIA TO OPERATE TWO MORE WEEKLY FLIGHTS

In another development, the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) has given permission to Saudi Arabian Airlines to operate two more weekly flights from Dhaka to the KSA from October 1.

operate two more weekly flights from us and we gave them that permission," CAAB Chairman Air-Vice Marshal M Mafidur Rahman told The Daily Star over the phone.

He also said CAAB is ready to allow Saudia to operate as many flights it wants from Dhaka so that stranded Bangladeshi migrant workers can return to their workplaces without any problem.

A top official of Saudi Arabian Airlines' Dhaka office said that from October 1, the airlines will operate two more flights in addition to its existing two weekly flights, meaning Saudia will operate four weekly flights from Dhaka.

Earlier in the last week, CAAB chairman said Bangladesh is also ready to give permission to other airlines of Saudi Arabia to operate from Dhaka to carry Bangladeshi expatriate Bangladeshi workers.

The government on September 23 said the Saudi government has agreed to extend igamas and visas for 24 days for the Bangladeshis who returned home on holiday but could not go back to the kingdom due to the pandemic

Around 50,000 Bangladeshi migrant workers have been worrying about losing their jobs if they fail to return to Saudi Arabia before the expiry of their visas and igamas.

Home to more than 22 lakh Bangladeshis, Saudi Arabia is also the prime destination of Bangladeshi migrant workers and the biggest remittance-generating country Bangladesh.

Chief Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain, Speaker Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury, Deputy Speaker Fazle Rabbi Miah, deputy leader of the House and Jatiya Party Chairman GM Quader, Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader, Law Minister Anisul Huq, Railways Minister Nurul Islam Sujan, Finance Minister AHM Mostafa Kamal, Planning Minister MA Mannan, among others, expressed grief at the attorney general's death.

They prayed for the salvation and eternal peace of the departed soul and expressed deep sympathy for the bereaved family members.

Mahbubey Alam had been receiving treatment at the CMH since September 4 after being infected with Covid-19. He was taken to the ICU on

September 18 after his health condition suddenly deteriorated. Mahbubey Alam was born in Mouchhamandra village under

Louhajong upazila in Munshiganj on

February 17, 1949. He completed his honours degree in political science from Dhaka University in 1968 and obtained a master's degree in public administration from the

same university in 1969. Later, he obtained an LLB degree

from Dhaka University in 1972. Mahbubey Alam attained a certificate from Bangladesh Bar Council, the statutory body that gives licences to lawyers for practising law in courts, in 1973.

He became a member of the Dhaka Bar Association in the same year.

He got permission to practise law in the High Court Division of the Supreme Court in 1975 and he got permission to practise law in the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court in 1980.

Mahbubey Alam was enrolled as a senior lawyer of the Appellate Division

He achieved a diploma degree on constitutional law and parliamentary law from the Institute of Constitutional and Parliamentary Studies in New Delhi in India in 1979.

He served as the additional attorney general of the state since November 15. 1998 to October 4, 2001.

He served as an elected executive nember of Bangladesh Bar Council from 2004 to 2007

Advocate Mahbubey Alam was appointed as the attorney general of the state on January 13, 2009. At the same time, he also performed as the ex-officio chairman of Bangladesh Bar Council.

He placed arguments before the Appellate and High Court Divisions on many important cases including Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's assassination case, and the cases regarding the constitution's fifth, seventh, 13th and 16th amendments.

Besides, Mahbubey Alam had placed arguments before the apex court to ensure punishment of war criminals Matiur Rahman Nizami, Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed, Muhhammad Kamaruzzaman, Abdul Mollah, Mir Quashem Ali, Salah Uddin Quader Chowdhury, Delwar Hossain Sayedee and ATM Azharul Islam for their crimes against humanity and war crimes during the Liberation War of the country in 1971.

coronavirus-driven lockdown According to the World Bank report, the income losses were widespread across the three areas. In Dhaka and Chattogram, about 80 percent of wage earners and 94 percent of business owners said their earnings were lower

compared to usual earnings immediately before the Covid-19 struck. The decline was higher in Dhaka -- 42 percent -- and in Chattogram, it was 33 percent. Among waged workers, daily and

workers declined by about 37 percent

Median wages for salaried and daily

weekly wage labourers faced much higher losses in income (49 percent) compared to salaried workers. Given the low rates of female labour force participation, women appear to be disproportionately affected by the pandemic and have experienced relatively

higher job losses, the report said.

To cope with the income losses, 69 percent household reduced their food consumption; the same number of people took help from their friends. Thirty-eight percent household surveyed received government help while

42 percent used their savings, according to the World Bank data. This is mentionable there is a widespread uncertainty among participants in Dhaka and Chattogram about keeping jobs and business running. Only 58 percent of active workers surveyed thought they would be able to keep their job or activity running in the coming

months. In Chattogram, it was 69 percent. In the meantime, high levels of uncertainty in the job market are generating stress and anxiety that may further exacerbate health impacts associated with the pandemic, notably in mental health, the report said.

In poor areas of Dhaka and Chattogram, eight in 10 adults reported experiencing stress or anxiety that affected their ability to carry out their day-to-day

"Reductions in wages among salaried

and daily workers were significantly higher for women, consistent with their high engagement in the garment sector and housemaid services, both of which have been severely impacted by the pandemic. Among those who lost jobs, cleaning

workers or housemaid received the

biggest blow because 54 percent job losses were reported in these arenas. Second highest job loss was reported in the garments sector with 19 percent. About the pre-pandemic situation regarding poverty, the report said a large share of the population -- eight in 10

Bangladeshis -- were poor or vulnerable to falling into poverty before the pandemic. About 25 percent of population was living in poverty and another 54 percent could be considered vulnerable as they had consumption levels very close to the poverty line, according to the Household

That indicates income losses related to Covid-19 are likely to push a large share of the population into poverty. And in most of the cases, the people are from the informal sector. Incomes of informal workers and in

affected sectors are assumed to decline by

50 percent and international remittances

Income and Expenditure Survey 2016-17.

are also assumed to fall by half. Comparing with a scenario without Covid-19, in 2020, average household per capita consumption would decline by an estimated 13 percent with an estimated loss in annual consumption of about \$ 10.7 billion.

The national upper poverty rate is estimated to rise from 23 percent to 35 percent. This represents approximately 2.1 crore additional people falling into poverty in 2020.
