UK businesses more attracted to trade and invest in Bangladesh

British High Commissioner to Dhaka tells webinar

UK businesses are finding more prospects for trade and investment in Bangladesh, which is on its way to become a middle-income country in the next few years, said UK High Commissioner to Bangladesh Robert Chatterton Dickson.

He made the remark at a webinar -- organised by Diplomatic Correspondents Association of Bangladesh (DCAB) -- yesterday.

Presently, bilateral trade between Bangladesh and UK is worth £4 billion, which he said is very encouraging.

Recently, Chatterton said UK's export credit agency -UK Export Finance (UKEF) -- has tripled its capacity for Bangladesh to £2.5 billion (\$3.2 billion).

This will make it easier for UK companies to sell high quality goods and services to Bangladesh. It is getting easier for Bangladeshi companies to use British expertise in projects, he said.

Apart from trade, UK and Bangladesh are working together on global issues that affect Bangladesh, including Covid-19 vaccines, Rohingya crisis and climate change, he UK is working at the UN level to ensure equitable

distribution of vaccines. The country will help ensure that Bangladesh has access to vaccine candidacy of Oxford University, Dickson said. When asked whether Oxford will conduct stage-III

vaccine trial in Bangladesh, he said it does not matter if it is conducted in Bangladesh or not, but it will be made available here.

DCAB President Angur Nahar Monty and UK High Commission Senior Press Officer Meher Jerin moderated the webinar.

UP chairman arrested in extortion case

A union parishad chairman in Savar was arrested on extortion charges on Monday night.

The arrestee is Saidur Rahman Sujon (45), chairman of Birulia Union Parishad and a member of Savar upazila unit of Awami League, said Saiful Islam, inspector (investigation) of Savar Model Police Station.

The arrest was made following an extortion case filed by one Ashraful Islam, who was constructing a five story building in Birulia.

As per the case statement, Sujon on Sunday demanded Tk 5 lakh from Ashraful. As he refused to pay the money, Sujon and his associates beat him. The incident took place at Savar upazila administration premises.

He said work is underway to achieve the Category-1 set by the US Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) to start direct flights between the

Earl Miller said this aviation agreement would further enhance the friendship between the two countries. The introduction of direct air communication will give a new dimension to the people-to-people relations. The agreement will have a positive impact on tourism, including trade.

Chairman of Bangladesh Civil Aviation Authority Air-Vice Marshal M Mafidur Rahman, Additional Secretary to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Sabbir Ahmed Chowdhury, and Additional Secretary to the Ministry of Civil Aviation Janendra Nath Sarkar also were present at the signing
