The attackers arrived at the scene by two CNG-run auto-rickshaws and escaped after the incident.

Shuvra's two companions --Siddiqur Rahman, 45, president of Awami League ward-6 unit in Gouripur municipality; and Al Amin, 25, member of Swechchasebak League Gouripur upazila unit -- were critically injured.

The three were rushed to College Mymensingh Medical Hospital (MMCH) where Shuvra died around 11:15pm on Saturday, said the

Shuvra's uncle Sadequr Rahman Selim alleged that Mayor Rafiqul, also president of the AL municipality unit, is the mastermind behind the killing. Minutes before the attack, a group of men led by Riad were seen coming

out of the mayor's office after holding

a meeting with him, alleged Selim. He said Shuvra had expresses his wish to contest the upcoming mayoral election in Gouripur municipality and two companions with sharp weapons was making preparations for that. This

Selim also alleged that a group of men, loyal to Rafiqul, attacked Shuvra in 2016 in a similar fashion. He was critically injured and admitted to the

Shuvra's another uncle Mohammad Morsheduzzaman said that as a young leader, Shuvra was popular, which made the mayor anxious about winning the next election. And a plot was hatched to kill him.

Despite repeated attempts, Rafiqul could not be reached for comments. His mobile phone was switched off.

Talking to this correspondent, Md Sohel Rana, president of Swechchasebak League Gouripur upazila unit, said there was a fight between Shuvra and Riad at a programme last year.

He claimed that the main reason behind the killing could be feud between the two, but a BNP leader would not dare to commit such a murder in Gouripur without backing of ruling party men.

25, and Ovi Hossain, 25. Speaking to The Daily Star, Ishtiaq Ahmed, assistant commissioner of the CTTC forensic team unit, said they arrested the three from the capital's Sabujbagh, Rampura and Pallabi areas

According to officials, a 15-year-old US girl first filed a complaint against Ovi on November 20 last year through the Facebook page of the CTTC's cybercrime unit.

Two months later, on February 2 of this year, another 14-year-old US girl filed a complaint on Facebook against In the complaint, the girl mentioned

that Borhan had been using her as a

victim of child pornography for the past five years. The unit also received five other complaints from local and international law enforcement

agencies, said officials. In the confessional statement, Borhan told the court that he started using social media site Instagram using a fake female ID in 2015, through which he was connected to a secret group for watching pornographic photos and videos.

After noticing Borhan's activities in

the group, the admin included him into another secret group called, which provided the manual with a 13-point task list about how to trick girls into providing nude content, court sources quoted Borhan as saying.

Borhan was then advised to open

an account in the dark web using a

separate browser at the cost of around

0.002 bitcoin -- a crypto currency. The present value of 1 bitcoin is around Tk 9.72 lakh. Borhan's task was to send private messages to different minor girls and if anyone responded, then to apply the 13-point task list to convince

them to send small nude video clips and photos, Borhan told the court. Once the victims sent videos and photos, he would upload them on secret Instagram groups and on the

dark web for trade. Borhan later included his cousin Mahmud one and half years ago. If any victim sent content once or

twice and then refused to send more, the accused used to threaten them of releasing the photos or videos on different websites, court sources said.

Similarly, Ovi also used to instigate

children and teenagers after connecting with them through different dating sites and social media profiles. AC Ishtiaq Ahmed said that the ultimate goal of these syndicate members were to collect bitcoins

through the dark web by selling pornography. "We are now trying to get details of the arrestees' associates by analysing their data and cellphones. We may be able to give a clear statement after we get the forensic reports of the arrestees'

cell phones," he said. Ishtiaq further suggested that guardian check what their children are doing on social media sites and remain alert regarding whether they are becoming victims of child pornography.

North Korean justice system treats people as 'less than animals': HRW

Torture, humiliation and coerced confessions are rampant in North Korea's pretrial detention system which treats people as worth "less than an animal", a rights group said yesterday in a report on the country's opaque legal processes.

drew on interviews with dozens of former North Korean detainees and officials to highlight what it called inhuman conditions at detention facilities that often amount to torture.

Nuclear-armed North Korea, accused of widespread rights abuses by the United Nations and other critics, is a "closed" country and little is known about its criminal justice system. Mistreatment of detainees -- beating

with a stick or kicking -- was "especially harsh" in the early stages of pretrial detention, interviewees said.

"The regulations say there shouldn't be any beatings, but we need confessions during the investigation and early stages of the preliminary

examination," a former police officer

"So you have to hit them in order to get the confession."

Former detainees said they were forced to sit still on the floor, kneeling or with their legs crossed, for as long as 16 hours a day, with even a flicker of movement leading to punishment.

But when the agitated workers refused to negotiate, police charged with batons and fired tear gas shells to disperse them, leaving 22 workers injured, said Kudrat-e-Khuda, convener of the parishad.

He told The Daily Star that police charged on jute workers without any provocation.

They beat the workers mercilessly and threw tear gas shells to disperse

them, he said. "Police detained five workers from

their residence," he added. There were at least 12 women among those injured. Among them, Nazma, Shumi Roy, Shafali Bala, Suchitra Biswas were seriously injured, he also said, adding that the injured were given primary treatment.

Visiting the spot during the clash, it was seen that a few hundred workers and members of Sammilito Nagorik Parishad blocked the Khulna-Jashore highway in Atra area, just opposite Eastern Jute Mill, in the city around 11:00am. Around 11:20 members of police tried to chase them away, which

resulted in a clash. Workers threw bricks and branches at police from inside the gates of Eastern Jute Mill, where they had gone

after the clash with police. Police then entered the premises

and arrested the workers. While police said they arrested nine people, Munir Chowdhury Sohel, convener of GanoSanghaty AndolonPolice said they arrested 14 leaders and activists. They include Oliar Rahman, Jute Mill Protection Movement, Al Amin Sheikh, convener of Chaatra Federation, Khulna district unit, SA Abdur Rashid, CPB leader of Khulna unit, Janardan Dutta Nantu, Bangladesh

Samajtantrik Dal, and Kudrat e Khoda. Police arrested them from inside the colony of Eastern Jute Mills, he said.
