It has been proved that trial proceedings can be done really fast, Panna added.

Criminal law expert and Editor of Dhaka Law Reports (DLR) Khurshid Alam Khan said the trial of the Bagerhat case was the rarest event in the history of Bangladesh.

"The prosecution must ensure that the trial has been held in a fair and faultless manner," he said.

Assuming that everything was done properly, the disposal of the case is laudable, Khurshid added.

Ensnaring children in the dark web According to officials, a 15-year-old

cybercrime unit of the Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime (CTTC) arrested three Bangladeshi men. The arrestees are Borhan Uddin, 26, his cousin Abdullah Al Mahmud, 25, and Ovi Hossain, 25.

Speaking to The Daily Star, Ishtiaq Ahmed, assistant commissioner of the CTTC forensic team unit, said they arrested the three from the capital's Sabujbagh, Rampura and Pallabi areas during a special drive.

The arrestees then gave their confessional statements under section 164 before a Dhaka court on Sunday,

Police also recovered around 3,316 photos and videos of 45 juvenile girls, sex toys and a "manual" about how to convince a girl to provide nude

Of the victims, 3 are Bangladeshis and 42 others are from the US, the

US girl first filed a complaint against Ovi on November 20 last year through the Facebook page of the CTTC's cybercrime unit.

Two months later, on February 2 of this year, another 14-year-old US girl filed a complaint on Facebook against

In the complaint, the girl mentioned that Borhan had been using her as a victim of child pornography for the past five years. The unit also received five

other complaints from local and international law enforcement agencies, said officials. In the confessional statement,

Borhan told the court that he started using social media site Instagram using fake female ID in 2015, through which he was connected to a secret group for watching pornographic photos and videos.

After noticing Borhan's activities in

the group, the admin included him into another secret group called, which provided the manual with a 13-point task list about how to trick girls into providing nude content, court sources quoted Borhan as saying.

Borhan was then advised to open an account in the dark web using a separate browser at the cost of around 0.002 bitcoin -- a crypto currency. The present value of 1 bitcoin is around Tk Borhan's task was to send private

messages to different minor girls and if anyone responded, then to apply the 13-point task list to convince them to send small nude video clips and photos, Borhan told the court.

Once the victims sent videos and photos, he would upload them on secret Instagram groups and on the dark web for trade.

Borhan later included his cousin Mahmud one and half years ago. If any victim sent content once or the accused used to threaten them of releasing the photos or videos on different websites, court sources said. Similarly, Ovi also used to instigate

North Korean justice system treats people as 'less than animals': HRW

Torture, humiliation and coerced confessions are rampant in North Korea's pretrial detention system which treats people as worth "less than an animal", a rights group said yesterday in a report on the country's opaque legal processes.

US-based Human Rights Watch

former North Korean detainees and officials to highlight what it called inhuman conditions at detention facilities that often amount to torture.

drew on interviews with dozens of

Nuclear-armed North Korea, accused of widespread rights abuses by the United Nations and other critics, is a "closed" country and little is known about its criminal justice system. Mistreatment of detainees -- beating with a stick or kicking -- was "especially harsh" in the early stages of pretrial

detention, interviewees said.

"The regulations say there shouldn't be any beatings, but we need confessions during the investigation and early stages of the preliminary

examination," a former police officer

"So you have to hit them in order to get the confession."

Former detainees said they were forced to sit still on the floor, kneeling or with their legs crossed, for as long as 16 hours a day, with even a flicker of movement leading to punishment.

He told The Daily Star, shortly before being arrested himself, that police attacked the jute workers without any

They beat the workers mercilessly and used tear gas to disperse them, he

"Police picked up five workers from their homes," he added.

There were at least 12 women among those injured. Among them, Nazma, Shumi Roy, Shafali Bala, Suchitra Biswas were seriously hurt, he also said, adding that the injured were given primary treatment.

Several hundred workers and members of Sammilito Nagorik Parishad blocked the Khulna-Jashore highway in the Atra area, just opposite Eastern Jute Mills in Khulna around 11:00am. Around 11:20 policemen tried to chase them away, which resulted in the clash.

Workers threw bricks and branches at police from inside the gates of Eastern Jute Mills, where they had gone after the clash with police.

Police then entered the premises and arrested the workers.

While police said they arrested nine people, Munir Chowdhury Sohel, convener of Gano Sanghaty Andolon said they arrested 14 leaders and activists. They include Oliar Rahman, Jute Mills Protection Movement; Al Amin Sheikh, convener of Chhatra Federation, Khulna district unit; SA Abdur Rashid, Communist Party of Bangladesh, leader of Khulna unit, Janardan Dutta Nantu, Bangladesh

Samajtantrik Dal; and Kudrat-e-Khuda. Police arrested inside the residential quarter of Eastern Jute Mills, he said.

Deputy Commissioner (north) Mollah Zahangir Hossain of Khulna Metropolitan Police said the three injured policemen were given primary treatment.

Hasan and Ripon Kumar Barua appeared for the photojournalist while Deputy Attorney General Sarwar Hossain Bappi represented the state during the hearing of the bail petition. Speaking to The Daily Star, Ripon

said Kajol was accused in three cases and he was yet to get bail in any of those. Kajol in the bail petition said he should be granted bail because of his illness and the DSA section, under which he was implicated, did not apply

to him as he did not defame anybody, the lawyer added. According to the case statement, Kajol was engaged in extortion by obtaining information illegally and publishing false, intimidating, and defamatory information via Facebook

and Messenger. On August 24, judge Emrul Kayes of a Dhaka court refused to grant bail to the photojournalist in the case filed under the Digital Security Act (DSA).

Dhaka Metropolitan Earlier, Magistrate Dhiman Chandra Ĥondol on June 24 had rejected his bail petition in the case.

Two other cases were filed against Kajol under the DSA on March 10 and 11 with Hazaribagh and Kamrangirchar police stations respectively. Kajol, now in Dhaka jail, went
