

# Verdict in rape case delivered after 13 years

## Rangpur man sentenced to life term

A Rangpur court yesterday sentenced a man to life term imprisonment 13 years after he had raped his domestic help in Pargachha upazila of the district.

Noya Mia (47) from the upazila was also fined Tk 1 lakh, according to court sources.

Judge Rokonzaman of Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal-2 delivered the verdict in absence of the convict, said Jahangir Hossain, prosecutor at the court.

Noya Mia has been skipping the court since he received bail 10 years ago, said the prosecutor.

According to the case statement, Noya Mia employed a teenage girl of his village as a house help in 2007.

He raped her when he found her alone at home. The girl filed a case accusing him on October 21.

Later, police submitted a charge sheet against Noya Mia on rape charge.

# Disabled-friendly healthcare training a must: speakers

Persons with disabilities regularly face challenges to access healthcare infrastructure and information. Therefore, there must be comprehensive training for healthcare providers on how to provide disabled-friendly health services, said speakers at a dialogue yesterday.

Titled "Policy Dialogue on Inclusive Health Services for Persons with Disabilities in Bangladesh: Challenges and Prospects", the dialogue was virtually organised by James P Grant School of Public Health, Brac University.

Dr Adrita Kaiser, assistant coordinator of the school, shared the findings of her research titled "Current Situation of Inclusive Health Services in Bangladesh: Findings from a Nationwide Study". According to the research, in which 5,000 persons with disability participated, an estimated 11.4 million persons have some form of disability in Bangladesh.

Dr Shafiqul Islam, executive director of Centre for the Rehabilitation of the Paralyzed (CRP), said along with health services, inclusiveness is also important for other facilities like rehabilitation, health professional services, and assistant devices for mobility.

Van Paula Schindeler -- deputy head of mission, the Netherlands embassy in Bangladesh -- in her speech as special guest said Bangladesh is doing quite well in terms of addressing disability-specific barriers.

She, however, stated three major points for the government to address. Firstly, establishing Disability Development Corporation in all upazilas to provide free treatment and assistive devices.

# HIKED POTATO PRICE 10 wholesalers fined Tk 1.4 lakh in port city

A mobile court yesterday fined ten wholesalers a total of Tk 1,40,000 for selling potatoes at inflated prices at Chattogram city's Riazuddin market.

The traders were selling potatoes at Tk 40-42 per kilogramme without keeping sales receipts, although the government has set the retail price to Tk 30 per kg.

Omar Faruque, executive magistrate of Chattogram District Administration, told The Daily Star, "Most wholesalers are selling potatoes at inflated prices without keeping sales receipts. When we conducted the drive at the market, we found 10 traders charging more than the government set price."

# DoE in Ctg fines 20 businesses Tk 11.65 lakh for flouting rules

Department of Environment (DoE), Chattogram region fined 20 businesses including a shipyard, 11 brick kilns and two hospitals a total of Tk 11,65,000 for violating conditions and polluting environment.

The fines were slapped after a hearing at DoE Khulshi office of the port city. Moazzom Hossain, director of DoE Chattogram region told The Daily Star that Master and Brother Shipyard in Sitakunda was fined Tk 20,000 while Banaful and Company was fined Tk 1 lakh for running operations without effluent treatment plant. 11 brick kilns from Cox's Bazar, Noakhali, Bramhanbaria, and Laxmipur were fined Tk 8,60,000 over different violations, he said. City Hospital of Maizidi in Noakhali was fined Tk 1 lakh while Laksam General Hospital of Cumilla was fined Tk 20,000. Yusuf Chemical, a rice mill and Moni Cable were fined a total of Tk 65,000 for breaking DoE clearance conditions.

# NAIMUL ABRAR'S DEATH Court defers indictment order

A Dhaka court yesterday set November 12 to pass order on charge framing in a case lodged over the death of Dhaka Residential Model College student Naimul Abrar, against 10 people including the editor of daily Prothom Alo Matiur Rahman.

Yesterday was the scheduled date for passing order in the case, but Dhaka Metropolitan Sessions Judge KM Imrul Qayesh adjourned hearing till November 12 as the order was yet to be ready to be passed.

Earlier on October 13, the court set yesterday to pass the order, as counsel of the plaintiff Advocate Omar Faruk Asif concluded his part of the hearing on charge framing.

Ninth-grader Naimul Abrar Rahat died after being electrocuted behind the stage during an event organised by the Kishor Alo, a publication of the Prothom Alo, at Dhaka Residential Model College ground on November 1, 2019.

On November 6, 2019, Abrar's father Mojibur Rahman filed the case with the court in this connection.

Md Mamun-ul-Rashid said the DNCC will implement the project by June 2023 with an estimated cost of Tk 319.23 crore.

The major project operations include development of 13.68km road, construction of 9.05km roadside drain and 6.58km pipe drain, development of 26.58km footpath, 7.74km road median, installation of 22.77km MS grill fencing, 22.31km SS grill fencing and 1,710 traffic signs, construction of 50 passenger camps and 36 new foot-over bridges, development of 47 such bridges, and installation of 17 escalators with them.

Md Ashadul Islam said though it was proposed that DNCC will finance Tk 63.85 crore for the project, the PM directed to finance it fully from the government fund.

Sheikh Hasina also asked the local government bodies, including city corporations, to enhance their capacity gradually to execute development projects with their own revenues in future.

The Ecneec meeting also cleared the first

revision of "SASEC Road Connectivity Project-II: Elega-Hatikamul-Rangpur Highway Four-Lane Upgradation" project increasing the cost by Tk 4,763.37 crore and extending the timeframe till December 2024 instead of August 2021.

The overall project cost has now increased to Tk 16,662.38 crore from the original outlay of Tk 11,899.01 crore, which was scheduled to be implemented from September 2015 to August 2021.

Mamun-Al-Rashid said the cost increased mainly for land acquisition, as compensation against land value was made three times as per the Acquisition and Requisition of Immovable Property Act, 2017.

The cost against the land acquisition saw a rise by Tk 2,253.16 crore and that against the resettlement by Tk 226.70 crore.

Besides, Ecneec endorsed the 2nd revision of Development of Sonapu-Sonagazi-Zoranganj Road Project, increasing the cost by Tk 107.09 crore and extending the timeframe till June 2021.

# Australia releases Covid-19 response plan for Bangladesh

Australia has released a Covid-19 Development Response Plan for Bangladesh, focusing on investments in long-term economic growth, inclusive education, skills development and private sector engagement.

The two-year Covid-19 Response Plan is part of Australia's recently released development strategy -- Partnerships for Recovery -- which outlines how the Pacific nation will work with its global partners to address the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Besides, humanitarian assistance for Rohingya refugees and the host community remains a priority for Australia, said a statement from the Australian High Commission in Bangladesh yesterday.

"Australia will place strong emphasis on protecting the most vulnerable, especially women and girls, and people with disabilities," it said.

Australia will work in partnership with the Bangladesh government to ensure its Covid-19 programmes remain closely aligned with key government initiatives, the statement said.

"Australia is committed to supporting Bangladesh's longer-term development priorities, as outlined in its 8th Five Year Plan."

Fatima Yasmin, secretary of the Economic Relations Division, said "The Government of Bangladesh is finalising the 8th Five Year Plan, where Covid-19 recovery strategy has been incorporated."

"We believe Australia's Covid-19 response plan for Bangladesh will be aligned with the government's priorities," she added.

Australia and Bangladesh have shared interests in a secure, prosperous and inclusive Indian Ocean region. Australia appreciates its strong development, people-to-people and trade ties with Bangladesh, the Australian High Commission said.

the right to use and drink water from rivers, beels, haors etc. But we have no proper management system, we have no equality of rights," said Syeda Rizwana Hasan, director of Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association (BELA).

"Water rights is one of the basic human rights, per capita availability of water in Bangladesh is much higher than India and Africa; but the actual scenario is vastly different," she continued.

"Some people in our country get more water than needed, while others don't get enough," Rizwana lamented.

During his speech, Dhaka University Professor Tanzimuddin Khan said, if the state wants to give equal water rights to the public, the state should get its fair share from neighboring countries. He also spoke of how political power is misused by land and river grabbers and demanded that they be cut off from their sources of power.

Anisur Rahman, director of Center For Natural Resource Studies, and Samsul Huda, executive director of Association for Land Reform and Development also spoke at the programme and echoed similar sentiments.

UGC said such universities can grade students taking the attendance, assignments, presentations, mid-term exam results into account held before online tests. They can also take results of previous semester into consideration while preparing results for outgoing session.

But it also said practical classes for all laboratory-based courses will have to be completed in the classroom once the situation becomes normal.

All private universities have been closed since March 17 to curb the spread of Covid-19.

Prof Shahidullah said they have also discussed the matter of allowing private universities to withdraw interest from the reserve fund, deposited to a bank.

"They will be able to use the money only to pay salaries of teachers and staff members. We are hearing from sources that many private universities cannot pay them salaries," he said.

According to Private University Act 2010, it is mandatory for each private university to have a reserve fund.

According to law, each private university in Dhaka and Chattogram has a reserve fund of Tk 5 crore, each university in other metropolitan cities has Tk 3 crore, and each university in other places Tk 1.5 crore.

said Prof Abdul Alim, a syndicate member.

However, details on how they plan to host the exams during the pandemic are yet to be decided, which will be finalised after the admission test committee's meeting.

In addition, on the issue of whether to permit honours degree holders to participate in the university's convocation, the academic council decided to let them participate alongside masters graduates, prof Alim told The Daily Star.

Meanwhile, a decision was reached to set up a "Bangabandhu Chair" in the Institute of Bangladesh Studies (IBS) of the university. The Bangabandhu Chair will be elected for every two academic years.

It will be awarded on the basis of work, literature, research, special contribution in the field of education etc.
