INVESTIGATION IN MANY CASES COMPLETED
The War Crimes Investigation Agency has completed investigation of a large number of cases against the Pakistani occupation forces including top-ranking officials, informs a spokesman of the agency. Asked about the nature of the charges, the spokesman says those include genocide, murder, torture, rape, loot, wanton destruction and waging war against the people of Bangladesh. He refers particularly to the alarming number of rape cases estimated at about two lakh. Many families are also reluctant to disclose rape cases and other atrocities, he adds.

Detective Branch of police, prayed for another five-day remand in the case filed with Dhanmondi Police Station.
Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate Ziaur Rahman granted two-day remand for each.
Dhaka-7 lawmaker Haji Salim's son Erfan, 37, suspended DSCC ward-30 councillor, and his bodyguard Zahidul, 35, were placed on a three-day remand each on October 28.
Navy officer Lt Wasif Ahmad filed the case with Dhanmondi Police Station naming four people.
The two other accused are AB Siddique Dipu, 45, protocol officer of Haji Salim's Madina Group, and Mizanur Rahman, 30, the driver of the car Erfan was in.
All four are now behind bars.
Mizanur was on a one-day remand and admitted his role in the assault, police said.
Dipu was placed on a fresh two-day remand on Saturday after completion of the previous three-day remand.
According to the case statement, a vehicle, with the plate "Dhaka Metro-Gha 11-5736", rear-ended his motorcycle in Dhanmondi area when he and his wife were returning to their Dhaka Cantonment home from Nilkhet around 7:45pm on October 25.
A man came out of the SUV and verbally abused them and left the spot. When the car stopped at a nearby traffic light, Wasif knocked on the car's window and introduced himself. At that, all the passengers got off the vehicle and started hurling abuse and assaulting him, the complainant said.
When his wife came to save him, they also assaulted her. They then abandoned the car and left the scene.
Some witnesses got the incident on video, which later went viral on social media. In the video, injured Wasif is seen describing the incident to bystanders.
Earlier, police said the incident was not recorded by any CCTV cameras in the vicinity but they have proof of the assault and that they would now look into the roles of the accused and to what extent they were individually involved.
On October 26, Erfan and his bodyguard Zahidul were sentenced to one year in prison for illegally possessing walkie-talkies and foreign liquor, after the Rapid Action Battalion, assisted by an executive magistrate, conducted a raid on Haji Salim's building -- "Chan Sarder Dada Bari" -- at Debidas Ghat Lane in the capital's Chawkbazar area.
Besides, four separate cases were filed against Erfan and Zahidul with Chawkbazar Police Station for carrying illegal firearms and possessing narcotics.
An officer at Chawkbazar Police Station told this correspondent that they have sought a 14-day remand each for Erfan and Zahidul. The hearing will be held on November 4.

China starts once-a-decade census of world's largest population

Millions of census-takers yesterday began knocking on doors across China for a once-a-decade head count of the world's largest population that for the first time will use mobile apps to help crunch the massive numbers.
Around seven million community workers and volunteers will drive the two-month data-collection effort, visiting homes ranging from residential skyscrapers in downtown Shanghai to remote Tibetan mountain villages.

"It's as if every road is turning into a killing trap. People of all ages are getting killed on the roads, even the people standing beside the road are not safe from reckless bus drivers."
"The procession of death on the roads is getting longer..."
About the convicts the court said they had thrown him into the Fuldi river, although he was alive at that time.
"We do not know how many people are getting killed like Payel," the court added.
At least 37,170 people were killed and 82,758 injured in 26,902 crashes since 2015, according to Bangladesh Jatri Kalyan Samity.
According to a report Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) submitted to the High Court in July last year, 4.79 lakh vehicles without fitness certificates are on the roads across the country.
Around 20 percent of 19,000 kilometers of roads under the Roads and Highways Department (RHD) are in "poor, bad or very bad" conditions, according to an RHD survey, published in July this year.

According to rights group Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK), the number of extrajudicial killings has dropped significantly as only nine such cases were recorded since August.

THE SPECIFIC OBSERVATIONS

The judge said it would be possible to reduce the number of road accidents if the drivers followed traffic laws.
In the first observation, the court said drivers, supervisors and helpers must undergo a dope test before they are allowed to board vehicles. The tests should be carried out at departure, resting and at destination points.
Recently, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina also asked the authorities concerned to bring drivers under a dope testing system.
Transport workers must be polite and courteous to the passengers. They need to be given training on how to drive and deal with passengers, it said.
Bathrooms and toilets with modern facilities should be installed at every three kilometres on the highways for transport workers and passengers. Transport owners will have to pay an annual subscription for it.
Monitoring systems should be beefed up through installing CCTV to watch over traffic movement on the highways, it added.

Turkish FM in Azerbaijan as tensions mount over Karabakh

Turkey's foreign minister arrived in Azerbaijan yesterday for talks over the breakaway region of Nagorno-Karabakh after Baku's arch-enemy Armenia requested security assistance from Russia.
"We are once again in Baku with our brothers to renew our strong support for dear Azerbaijan and exchange on the latest developments in Nagorno-Karabakh," Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu said on Twitter.
On Saturday, Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan formally asked Russian President Vladimir Putin to begin consultations on security assistance, invoking the two countries' defence pact.
Pashinyan said hostilities were approaching Armenia's borders and reiterated that Turkey was backing Baku.
Moscow's defence pact with Armenia does not extend to Nagorno-Karabakh and Russia said Saturday

Kabir, director (complaints and enquiry) at the NHRC, said they visited the scene of the incident, Burimari Jame Mosque and adjacent areas, and took testimony of witnesses and locals since yesterday morning.
"After talking to the imam and the khadem at the mosque, we are convinced that the victim, Jewel, did not desecrate the Holy Quran," he said.
Some of the witnesses gave different versions of the incident and it is being investigated whether the incident was pre-planned or not, mentioned Kabir.
"A rumour about Jewel desecrating the Holy Quran spread... we are working to get answers to a number of questions. The whole thing will be clear to us as soon as we get the answers."
He further said it is also being probed why outsiders were at the scene and where did they come from.
"We are investigating and will submit a report to the commission within a week," he added.
