Pvt university in Bandarban builds reservoir with Tk 1.35cr from govt



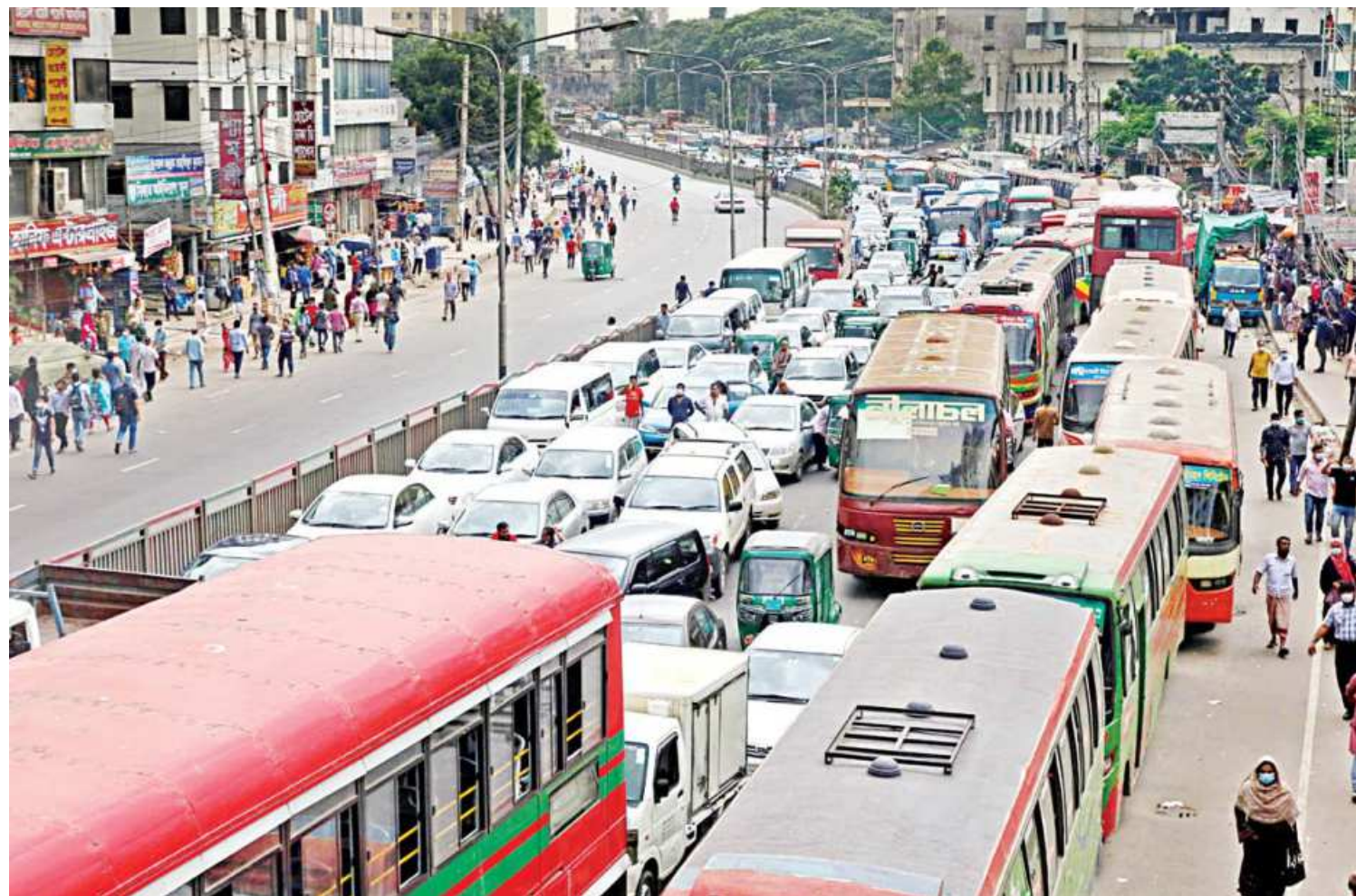

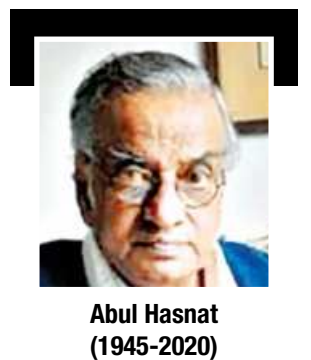
The university is founded by Bir Bahadur U Shwe Sing,

A legacy to lean on

Abul Hasnat left us yesterday at the age of 75.

His legacy, however, as a litterateur and literary critic will live on.

His magazine "Kali O Kalom" will continue its journey and so will the literary section of the Bangla daily Sangbad, in which his longstanding editorship was proof of his prowess.

The section was synonymous with Abul Hasnat. He was the editor of the section for over three decades before joining Kali O Kalom, a Bengal Foundation publication.

At the news of his death, people in literary circles have been talking about his role in the magazine. But to me, he will be best remembered as the editor of the Sangbad's literature section.

Born in 1945 in the old part of Dhaka, Hasnat was actively involved with Chhatra Union while studying at Dhaka University. He was the vice-president of Chhatra Union in 1971 and also played a role in the Liberation War while staying in India.

His wife Nasimul Ara is a journalist and their only daughter Diti Hasnat lives in the USA.

Imported onions won't be less than Tk 55 a kg Says commerce minister

The imported onion cannot be sold for any less than Tk 55 a kg by the Trading Corporation of Bangladesh or other retailers because it costs Tk 42-43 to import each kg of the spice, Commerce Minister Tipu Munshi said yesterday.

The TCB and some businesses have been importing onions from Turkey, Egypt, Myanmar and Holland after the largest source India banned onion export in September.

The state-owned TCB was then allowed to import onions to meet the demand, the minister said.

The importing cost of onions from India is usually about Tk 23 each kg. But India has unfortunately imposed the ban without prior notice because the prices also went up in Indian markets, he said.

The minister said these at the Economic Reporters Forum (ERF) Best Reporting Award ceremony at its office in the capital.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE 70

The much talked about Article 70 of the Constitution Bill relating to the vacation of seat on resignation or expulsion from political party is discussed today at the Constituent Assembly. There were three amendments moved by independent member Manabendra Narayan Larma, NAP(M) nominee Suranjit Sengupta and Awami League member Nurul Huq to Article 70. Deputy Speaker Md Baitullah did not allow Larma to move his amendment, which proposed to delete the whole article. The deputy speaker ruled out the amendment on the ground that it was negative and was, in fact, no amendment.

Suranjit Sengupta's amendment sought to restrict the ground of vacation of a seat by a member of parliament only to his resignation from the party, on whose ticket the member was elected to the parliament. Dr Kamal Hossain held that party discipline was essential for the smooth running of the parliamentary system. He cited the example of the British Parliamentary Conventions. The

NHRC body finds probing Jewel murder

It was just a rumour about desecrating the Holy Quran that led to the brutal killing of Abu Yunus Md Sahidunnabi Jewel in Lalmonirhat, says a NHRC probe body.

The 50-year-old victim, who was beaten up and burnt to death by a mob on October 29, had not desecrated the holy book, said Al-Mahmud Faizul Kabir, the head of the three-member team formed by the National Human Rights Commission.

Minister brushes aside allegations against Rab

UNB, Dhaka

State Minister for Foreign Affairs M Shahriar Alam yesterday brushed aside the allegations raised by some US senators against Rab, terming those propaganda against Bangladesh.

"It's nothing new," he told reporters after a programme in the capital, claiming that some lobbyists were engaged in spreading such propaganda against the country.

Responding to a question, he said the issue was raised by a few persons (US senators) as part of their internal process and

it has nothing to do with the government. "Rab is an organisation of our pride. We have all the answers ready..." he said, adding that Bangladesh will react only if a state or an international organisation conveys anything to it.

US Senator Marco Rubio recently joined Senators Bob Menendez, Todd Young, Ben Cardin, Cory Gardner, Jeanne Shaheen, Chris Murphy, Chris Coons, Jeff Merkley and Cory Booker in calling on the Trump Administration to impose sanctions on senior commanders of Rab.

'There's no alternative'

Reluctant Johnson locks down England again as virus surges in Europe

Britain's Prime Minister Boris Johnson has announced a new four-week coronavirus lockdown in England, which will join several European countries in imposing the measure for a second time, as Slovakia took a different tack and began testing its entire population.

Global infections are fast approaching 46 million, with close to 1.2 million deaths, and Europe is experiencing a dizzying spike in Covid-19 cases.

Under-pressure governments on the continent are scrambling to contain the outbreaks, with the reimposition of

restrictions sparking widespread exasperation and sometimes violent protests.

"Now is the time to take action because there's no alternative," Johnson said. "We have got to be humble in the face of nature. In this country, alas, as in much of Europe, the virus is spreading even faster than the reasonable worst-case scenario of our scientific advisers."

Under the new lockdown, planned to start on Thursday and end on December 2, England's population must stay at home except when exemptions apply, such as for work, education or exercise, while all but essential shops will close.
