

## Khadem called in some people

Burimari land port that day, he mentioned in the statement.  
Jewel had developed psychological issues after losing his job earlier this year, his family claimed.  
Sumon said they went to the mosque to offer Asr prayers. He prayed on the verandah of the mosque as he was a little late to join. At the end of the prayers, everyone left but Jewel was not coming out.  
Sumon entered the mosque and saw Jewel arguing with the khadem. He apologised to the khadem on behalf of Jewel, Sumon said in the statement.  
But the khadem called in people who started beating up Jewel and him.  
A local union parishad member rescued them and took them to a union parishad room next to the mosque, he said.  
"The mob broke down the doors and [window] grills of the union

parishad [building] and started beating up Jewel. At that time, the OC of Patgram Police Station managed to get me out and hide me on the second floor of the union parishad [building] and took me down to a nearby tin-roofed shop," he said.  
"First I was admitted to Patgram Upazila Health Complex and later to Lalmonirhat Sadar Hospital for treatment," he said.  
Abida told journalists that they were conducting raids and arresting those involved in the incident after seeing video footage.  
Police arrested five more people in connection with the brutal killing of Jewel.  
They were arrested at their homes in Burimari area early yesterday, said Patgram Police Station Officer-in-Charge Sumon Kumar Mohanta.  
So far, 21 people have been arrested, including the mosque khadem.

Of the five newly arrested, two are named accused in the case and the others were identified in video footage, the OC said.  
Jewel, 50, was beaten and burnt to death in Burimari area of Patgram upazila over rumours of insulting the Holy Quran.  
Saiful Alam, cousin of the deceased, SI Shahjahan Ali on behalf of the police and Union Parishad Chairman Abu Sayeed Newaz Nishat filed three cases in this connection.  
**5 MINS BLACKOUT FOR JEWEL**  
Lights in Shalbon area under Rangpur City Corporation went off for five minutes at 7:00pm yesterday as a protest for the brutal killing of Jewel.  
Shahidul Akter Firoz, former councillor of the ward, said the residents went down to the street turning off the lights in their homes and demonstrated.

a vehicle, including brakes, headlights, alignment and emission, taking between 12 and 15 minutes.  
**WHY OUTSOURCING?**  
Established in 1987, BRTA deals with a myriad of tasks -- from vehicle registration, issuance and renewal of driving licences, to fitness of vehicles and route permits for commercial vehicles.  
But its services are being hampered due to a lack of adequate manpower and technology.  
For example, only 109 motor vehicle inspectors, with the help of 86 mechanical assistants, checked the fitness of 7.5 lakh vehicles last fiscal year.  
The inspectors are always under pressure and the quality of inspections is often compromised due to the work pressure. Moreover, the shortage of vehicle inspectors causes service seekers to wait a long time for fitness certificates.  
The BRTA has only one VIC at its Mirpur office to check some elements digitally and some 100 commercial vehicles (bus and trucks) are tested there every day.  
Other vehicles have to be checked manually, which experts said could compromise safety as it leaves room for manipulation and irregularities.  
An automated system can get

exact performance data of a vehicle's key safety features like headlights, brakes, and speed capabilities, which is almost impossible to do manually, they said.  
Amid huge scarcity of fitness testing facilities, the Road Transport and Highways Division in August last year formed a committee to work out how fitness tests could be outsourced to private companies.  
A top BRTA official said CNS was selected for the job following competitive bidding.  
**A WAY FORWARD**  
Prof Mizanur Rahman, director of Accident Research Institute (ARI) at Buet, welcomed the BRTA's move. "This is the way forward," he said.  
He said with the existing manpower and equipment, it is not possible for the BRTA to check all vehicles "properly".  
In many other countries, private sectors are entrusted with the duty of checking vehicles' fitness and the entire process is monitored by the government authorities.  
Mizanur, however, said the authorities have to check whether the private company overcharges or does anything to "create a monopoly in the business".  
Replying to a question, he said road safety was very much linked with fitness of vehicles, because an unfit vehicle is

prone to road crash causing fatalities.  
"So, the government should increase the facilities to ensure proper fitness of vehicles," he told this correspondent yesterday.  
BRTA Chairman Nur Mohammad Mazumder said they have plans to set up more VICs so that fitness of more vehicles could be examined there.  
"We will establish more VICs in Dhaka and divisional headquarters on our own. Besides, we have plans to outsource the job to private companies," he told The Daily Star yesterday.

"The exit and re-entry visa reforms allow expatriate workers to travel... without the employer's approval after submitting a request, (and) the employer will be notified electronically of their departure," it said.  
Sattam Alharbi, a deputy minister at the ministry, said the reforms will abolish "runaway" reports against foreign workers who do not report for duty, which effectively renders them criminals at risk of being jailed and deported.  
"These changes are not small changes -- it's huge," Alharbi told Bloomberg News in an interview yesterday.

## Erfan, his bodyguard denied

report, the IO said Erfan, son of Dhaka-7 lawmaker Haji Salim, gave important information about the incident and that the information was being verified.  
So, he appealed to the court to keep them in jail until the investigation was over.  
The defence, however, submitted a petition seeking bail in the case, claiming that the two were being framed as part of a conspiracy to harass them.  
Upon hearing both the sides, the magistrate turned down their bail petitions and sent them to Dhaka Central Jail in Keraniganj.  
On Tuesday, another accused AB Siddique Dipu, one of Erfan's associates, was sent to jail on completion of his remand in the same case.  
Four other cases -- two against Erfan and other two against Zahid -- under the arms and narcotics control acts have been lodged with Chawkbazar Police Station.  
Lt Wasif filed the case with Dhanmondi Police Station on October 26 against four

named and three unnamed accused over the assault on him.  
According to the statement of the case, a vehicle, with number plate Dhaka Metro-Gha 11-5736, rear-ended his motorcycle in Dhanmondi area when he and his wife were returning to their Dhaka Cantonment home from Nilkhet around 7:45pm on October 25.  
A man came out of the SUV and verbally abused them and left the spot. When the car stopped at a nearby signal, Lt Wasif knocked on the car's window and introduced himself. After that, all passengers got off the vehicle and started hurling abuse and assaulted Lt Wasif.  
Following a drive, Erfan and Zahid were sentenced to one year in prison each for illegally possessing walkie-talkies and foreign liquor after their arrest on October 26.  
Rab Executive Magistrate Sarwoer Alam handed six months' imprisonment to them for keeping the radio transceivers illegally and the other six months for illegal liquor possession.
