19 univs gear up for uniform tests

VC meet hashes out details over admission exams, procedures

In a major development, 19 public universities announced the minimum requirement for appearing in the admission test and question patterns for what officials said would be the first-ever uniform admission test.

The universities agreed earlier this month to hold the test titled "Central Admission Test" to reduce the hassles faced by admission seekers.

Vice chancellors of the 19 universities at a meeting yesterday decided that there will be three exams in the test -- one each for science, humanities and business studies students -- based on Higher Secondary Certificate exams syllabus.

The test will be held at all the 19 universities and students who passed HSC-level exams this year and 2019 with a certain GPA will be eligible to participate in

The new method of admission has been in discussion since 2010. It was aimed at relieving the admission seekers from having to travel to different SEE PAGE 2 COL 3

>> Students need SSC+HSC GPA 6 for humanities, 6.5 for business, 7 for science to qualify for tests

>> Three 100-mark MCQ tests for each group

>> One exam for science, one for humanities, one for commerce students on HSC syllabus

>> Tests to be held at 19 universities

>> Tests to be held when Covid-19 transmission decreases

Eminent citizens ask the president to set up judicial council

Forty-two distinguished citizens have urged the president to constitute Supreme Judicial Council to investigate allegations of corruption and other misconduct against the Election Commission.

In a letter to President Md Abdul Hamid on December 14, they said the SJC should be formed under article 96 of the constitution.

12 killed as train rams bus

Gateman of level crossing near Joypurhat town 'left gate open'

At least 12 people were killed and eight others injured as a train hit a bus on a level crossing near Joypurhat town yesterday morning.

The gateman had left the crossing's gate open, said

police after primary investigation.

All the victims were travelling on the bus. The accident happened in Joypurhat's Puranpoil area around 7:00am when intercity train Uttara Express from

As the train was approaching the crossing, the bus, which was heading towards Dinajpur's Hakimpur, tried to drive through, finding the crossing's gate open, they said. The train then hit the bus and dragged it for around 300

Dinajpur was on its way to Rajshahi, said police quoting

On information, members from Joypurhat Fire Service and Civil Station, and BGB personnel from nearby Joypurhat 29 Battalion rushed there. Locals joined the rescue efforts.

Sirajul Islam, station-in-charge of Joypurhat Fire Service and Civil Defence, said they found 10 bodies on the spot


They also hurled abuse at some fellow examinees, and drove away a number of invigilators to stop the
