In many countries, video footage acts as evidence to investigate an incident. The death of George Floyd at Minneapolis in the US that sparked "Black Lives Matter/I Can't Breathe" movement is a glaring example.

Two body-worn camera videos from the day Floyd was killed by police were publicly released by a Minneapolis court, after a coalition of media companies intervened and argued for their unrestrained release.

Prof Omar Faruk of Department of Criminology and Police Science at Mawlana Bhashani Science and Technology University said usage of body cameras will take law-enforcement agencies one-step ahead in modernising the force and ensuring transparency.

"But our police force should keep in mind that these devices are introduced to modernise the service. If they are misused and applied to stage incidents, the consequences will be bad," he said.

He also said transparency will be ensured if all police check-posts are brought under coverage of body cameras and CCTV.

When used, body cameras would record law enforcers' interactions with people, or gather video evidence at crime scenes.

There are many allegations that police take advantage of people in the name of searching at check-posts, like demanding money after putting yaba pills or other drugs in their pockets, and confiscating valuables from their possession but not recording them properly in the seizure list.

Crime analysts say the use of such information technology will also help prevent such irregularities.

At least 196 people have been victims of extrajudicial killings and custodial deaths this year. It was 388 in 2019, according to data compiled by Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK) from media reports.

Prominent rights activist Nur Khan said CCTV, body cameras and other possible technical facilities may help in identifying police involvement with

crimes and criminals' actions.

He, however, said the effectiveness of those devices depends on enforcement.

"Say for example, the CCTV footage of Teknaf Police Station before and after the Sinha killing was missing, as police claimed there was a technical glitch," he said.

About incidents like "gunfights", Nur Khan said, "If the state wants, only then will such incidents stop. Body cameras may help to some extent, but it cannot be reduced to zero if the state does not want so. The incidents of 'gunfights' came down significantly in the last few months," he noted.

Inspector General of Police Benazir Ahmed, at the inauguration of tactical belts on December 15, said many officers of Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) have been using body cameras for the last few years, but the initiative have not yet been expanded.

Although the cameras are quite expensive, and it will be impossible to give them to all officers in the next year, the devices will be gradually distributed, he said.

The traffic department and check-posts will be prioritised in this regard, he added.

Asked, Walid Hossain, deputy commissioner (media) of DMP, told The Daily Star that DMP will soon start using body cameras at every check-post, subject to the home ministry's approval.

"It's now being operated at some check-posts and traffic points," he added.

"We have applied to procure 200 high-quality body-worn cameras for officers to use at check-posts," the DMP official said, adding that earlier, GoPros and body-worn cameras were mostly used by the traffic department since December 2014.

Talking to The Daily Star, Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal said the initiative is still at discussion level.

"We do it in some places on trial basis. But there is no decision yet to implement it across the country," he said.

the run, Mohammad Shishir Manir, a defence lawyer for Khaleque and Bahadur, told this newspaper on December 7.

The HC appointed Shahnaz Haque as a state defence lawyer for Shukkur as he is absconding.

He said the HC bench acquitted the three as it was proved that Khaleque and Bahadur were tortured and forced to give the confessional statements. Their statements were recorded at the same time in the magistrate's room violating relevant provisions of law, he said, adding that there were inconsistencies in the confessional statements.

Shishir Manir said there is no other evidence and documents in the case to prove the allegations against the three who were sentenced to death. The lawyer said he prayed to the HC to order the government to conduct further investigation in order to find out the real kidnappers and killers.

The HC may issue necessary directives to this effect in the full text of its verdict, he added.

Md Hridoy, a nursery student and son of Nurul Haque from Uttar Nurichara in Cox's Bazar, was abducted while he was returning home from school on July 4, 2013. The kidnappers then phoned Hridoy's elder brother Md Yousuf, demanding Tk 3 lakh for his release.

The following day, police recovered Hridoy's body from Kalatali Road area. Later, Victim's father filed a murder a case with Cox's Bazar Model Police Station.

with their two children -- aged three and a half years and two and a half years -- at the home of Washima's mother Momena Begum in Old Dhaka.

Momena Begum had filed a case with the Metropolitan Magistrate Court in Dhaka on December 2 against Tofail and Washima on charge of threatening and attempting to beat her (Momena).

Metropolitan Magistrate of Dhaka Mamunur Rashid then issued an arrest warrant against Tofail and Washima in the case.

Bangshal police arrested Tofail and Washima on December 18 and produced them to the magistrate the same day. The magistrate then sent them to jail rejecting their bail petition.

On December 22, the magistrate had again rejected their bail petition in the case, following which their children started crying profusely at the court premises, he said.

The children are now with their neighbours, Shishir Manir said.

Scientists achieve quantum

fidelity. This network was built with off-the-shelf equipment, which would be compatible with existing internet infrastructure.

Qubits work by replacing traditional bits -- the '1's and '0's' used to encode digital information -- with quantum bits, or qubits.

These are able to function as both a '1' and a '0' at the same time by existing in a state of superposition, meaning each new qubit added to the computer increases its power exponentially rather than linearly.

Quantum teleportation, therefore, is a transfer of quantum states from one location to the other. This transfer was done using quantum entanglement, where two particles are linked in such a way that information shared with one is shared with the other at exactly the same time.

This is because the particles exist in states of probabilities, where their exact position, momentum, and spin is not determined until the particle has been measured.

Photons behave in this way, becoming a wave or a particle depending on how they are measured.

Family members and locals took Khairul to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital where doctors declared him dead.

The body was sent to the morgue for autopsy, said Md Mahmudul Hasan, officer-in-charge of Haluaghat Police Station.

The incident might have happened when the man was attempting to go across the border, said Lt Col Tauhid Mahmud, commanding officer of BGB Battalion-39.

The BGB is looking into the matter, he added. At least 48 Bangladeshi citizens have been killed along the Indo-Bangla border this year, according to Rights Body Ain o Salish Kendra.

At least 15 people were killed in 2018 while the number rose to 43 last year, it said.

The five-day director general-level conference between the BGB and BSF started in India's Guwahati on Tuesday.

Killing of Bangladeshis by BSF, smuggling of drugs and illegal arms into the country from India, illegal trespassing by Indian nationals including BSF members, and sharing of intelligence between the two forces are among the key issues being discussed at the conference.

BGB DG Maj Gen Shafeenul Islam is leading the 11-member Bangladesh team while BSF DG Rakesh Asthana is heading the BSF team.

The last BGB-BSF DG-level conference was held on September 19 in Dhaka where the BSF DG said they are working out a strategy to bring the killings at the India-Bangladesh border areas down to zero.

different types of pesticides and anti-fungal medicines to protect the plants during fog and cold," said Ahsanur Rahman of Chhoto Balia villager of the same upazila.

"It will increase our production cost. We don't know how we will meet our additional expenses," he told The Daily Star.

Contacted, Aftab Ahmed, deputy director of the Department of Agricultural Extension in Thakurgaon, said they are giving advices and assistance to farmers for protecting their crops.

Meanwhile, yesterday's lowest temperature in the country was recorded at 8.3 degrees Celsius at Tentulia in Panchagarh, says the Met Office.

"Mild cold wave is sweeping over the regions of Sreemangal, Tentulia, Rajarhat and Chuadanga," read a weather bulletin.

"It may continue," said the bulletin of Bangladesh Meteorological Department.

Their flight was cancelled and the workers were sent back to Dhaka from Abu Dhabi.

Returning to Dhaka, many workers were seen crying helplessly.

Among the expatriate workers, Sabina Akhter and Taslima Akhter, hailing from Cumilla, said they spent Tk 2.5 lakh each to go to Saudi Arabia.

They said they had not informed their families about their return and now they could not return to their homes.

Later, Brac arranged food and accommodation for them at its safe home.

Contacted, Fakhru Islam, assistant director of Probashi Kalyan Desk at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport, told The Daily Star that they have information that around 79 Bangladeshi workers were sent back to Dhaka Monday night.

"We don't have complete information about the migrant workers who were sent back from different airports on their way to Saudi Arabia as the airlines concerned didn't report to us. We are trying to collect information," added Fakhru.

On Monday, Saudi Arabia suspended all international flights for a week amid reports of the appearance of a new mutated strain of the novel coronavirus in the UK.

The suspension casts uncertainty on the return of Bangladeshi expatriate workers to their workplaces in the Gulf country.

Biman Bangladesh Airlines also suspended its all flights to and from Jeddah, Riyadh, and Dammam for a week from Monday due to the suspension imposed by the Saudi authorities.

Govt plans 4 terminals on city fringes

Dhaka South City Corporation Mayor Sheikh Fazle Noor Taposh, who led the committee, said it had proposed 10 locations for inter-district bus terminals earlier, selected four of them and visited Birulia in Savar yesterday to inspect the location.

Taposh said they think four terminals can be accepted and they will also visit three other proposed locations.

"We will make a decision on it in the next meeting of the bus route rationalisation committee in January after visiting all four locations," he said.

Taposh said they will send the proposal to the ministry concerned to make a final decision. "Our main target is to set up bus terminals on the periphery of Dhaka to reduce pressure on the city," he said.

In other countries, inter-district buses do not enter the city but in Dhaka there are three inter-district bus terminals and inter-district buses using the terminals creates traffic congestion, the DSCC mayor said.

But the city's bus terminals are not effective, which leads to bus drivers parking on the street and further worsening traffic congestion and contributing to the chaotic situation in the city, he said.

"We want to bring the whole transport system under discipline and these proposed bus terminals are part of it," he said.

Taposh said they are continuing their activities so that they can prepare a master plan by next year.

DNCC Mayor Md Atiqul Islam said because of the new bus terminals on the capital's periphery, inter-district buses will not be able to enter the city.

He said the public transport vehicles operating in Dhaka will stay inside the city while inter-district buses will stop at certain fixed places.

After the bus route rationalisation system is implemented, inter-district buses will not get permission to enter the city, he added.

Atiq said they have decided to bring all public buses of Ghatarchar-Motijheel route under a single company. Currently, more than 160 buses owned by 29 people are running on the route.

"We want to bring the city's whole traffic system under a disciplined system, and as part of the government's initiative of bus route franchise system, we are going to start the bus service on Ghatarchar-Motijheel route from April 1 [next year]," he said.

Bus owners and transport workers are also helping the authorities implement their initiative, he added.

Revealing a hitherto undisclosed chapter of the struggle, Bangabandhu says during the last days of non-cooperation movement he asked Dr Nurullah of Dhaka Engineering University to produce a radio transmitter which he would use for giving his last call to the people. The transmitter was produced. The prime minister also says on that fateful night of March 25, 1971, he had no other way but to pass on his last message to Chittagong.

The HC also issued a rule asking the state to explain in four weeks why the case proceedings against Matiur Rahman should not be scrapped.

The HC bench of Justice Md Rezaul Haque and Justice Md Ataur Rahman came up with the order and rule following a petition filed by Matiur seeking cancellation of the trial proceedings.

On November 12, a Dhaka court framed charges against Matiur and nine others in the case.

The lower court, however, discharged Prothom Alo Deputy Editor Anisul Hoque as it found no grounds to frame charges against him.

The other accused are Kishor Alo Head of Events and Activation Kabir Bakul, the youth magazine's events and activation assistants Shuvashish Pramanik Shuvo and Shah Paran Tushar, its Senior Assistant Editor Mahitul Alam Pavel, and stage decorators Jasim Uddin Topu, Mosharraf Hossain, Md Sujon and Kamrul Hawlader.

Matiur and eight others, now on bail, pleaded not guilty and demanded justice after Judge KM Enrull Kayesh of the Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court of Dhaka read out the charges to them.

The court had earlier dismissed five other petitions submitted by their lawyers to discharge them from the case.

The court then fixed December 14 for starting the trial of the case.

Abrar's father Mojibur Rahman filed the case with the 4th Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court in Dhaka on November 6.

In the complaint, Mojibur said his son was electrocuted and became unconscious around 4:30pm on November 1 while attending the programme.

Dhaka's Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Aminul Haque took the case into cognisance and ordered the OC of Mohammadpur Police Station to submit an investigation report. On January 16 this year, Abdul Alim, inspector of Mohammadpur Police Station, submitted the probe report to the court, saying the charges brought against all 10 accused were found to be true.

Dhaka's Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Kaisarul Islam issued arrest warrants to Matiur and nine others in the case that day. Matiur then got bail from the High Court while nine others got bails from different lower courts.

On September 20, Dhaka Metropolitan Magistrate Mohammad Jasim ordered that the case be transferred to the Dhaka Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court for trial.

On October 1, the Dhaka Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court took cognisance of the charges against Matiur and nine others.
