# An offbeat paradise

Astf Bahauddin who has had his recent solo exhibition at the Alliance Franchaise is an offbeat artist with notions of his own.

Unlike what is seen in other exhibitions, none of the paintings has any names or numbers. "I leave everything to the spectator's imagination." the artist said. "A work of art does not have the same impact on different people. The colour red, for instance, makes me happy but for some who have lost their beloved ones in recent political

turmoils red symbolises pain and suffering. I do not dictate terms to my them to make out and understand what they will of

my work". In the painting about a place called Pushkar, the incident of a camel fair in India is combined with scenes of a song forgotten fort. There are symbols of happiness and contentment scattered all over the piece . There are the figures of Indian gods and godesses, a butterfly and a happy child. These stand for the good elements in life. The armless ugly faces in the forefront represent people who talk, make promises but do nothing to sub stantiate their

statements. The painting with its soft pink and purple washes has a haunting charm. One is confronted with the unusual image of a pregnant girl in a second picture. One figure

slides into another. None of the images are complete in the traditional way. The painting has a poster like effect with dramatic use of black and navy blue. While swirling ribbons and happy musical notes stand for joy, there are ugly faces of

hollow people, with their false hopes and empty smiles in the backdrop.

The delineation of the Bangladeshi poet has the subject's face in a distorted form. The "baul" is shown with his traditional locks, flowing "Kurta" and necklace of beads. Swirls and stripes with brilliant colours in the background represent the poet's inspiration and achievements.

Yet another piece is marked "Hello, Goodbye" and once again the piece is decorated with symbols

of happiness and despair. There are he traditional lovers with the classical features and conventional sweep of clothes. The images are piled one upon the other and have a decidedly decorative effect.

Blues, blacks and pinks predominate as in the other works.

A rat and more ugly masks with doomed skull dominate yet another mysterious piece in startling black and red. Bits ofit suggesta game of dice, others bring to mind a game in a casino. Asif refuses to comment at length on his paintings "It is whatever you think


