Two given 144-year jail terms

MANILA, Jan 27: A Philippine court sentenced two communist rebel leaders to jail terms of 144 years each for killing army engineers in an ambush in 1988, the military said today. Ruel Ramirez and Rodriogo Samon were accused by the military of involvement in the attack by about 60 communist rebels on a convoy of army engineers aboard two trucks in the central province of Bohol, reports Reuter.

diqui as petitioner filed the writ petition challenging detention of her husband.

The detention has been challenged on various grounds including the impugned order being violative of the fundamental rights and right of personal liberty of the detenu guaranteed by Art 31 and 32 of the Constitution. He has not been furnished with the grounds as required under Art 33 for making of the representation. The petitioner has challenged the very Act, namely Special Powers Act, 1974 and Section 3 thereof in particular as the same are violative of fundamental rights of the detenue guaranteed under the Constitution.

The petitioner contended, inter alia, that the detenu left the country and stayed in India after the assassination of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and overthrow of his government on August 15, 1975. The detenu came back to Dhaka on December 12 after the fall of the autocratic government of Hussain Mohammad Ershad and was given ovation by thousands of people. He was also given nomination by Awami

paper has also been accepted. On 15.1.91 the detenu left Dhaka and reached Rajbari the same day. He addressed a political meeting at Rajbart the next morning and there after he went to Jehnidah. On the way he addressed several political meetings in Magura, Modhukhali, Kamarkhali, Jhenidah etc. The petitioner further stated that Mr. Kader Siddiqui was arrested on January 17 from the WAPDA Rest House, Jhenidah, A large contingent of armed police encircled the Rest House, before his arrest. When the detenu wanted to know the reason of his arrest, the police officer vaguely hinted at some conviction of the detenu, of which the detenu claimed to have no knowledge. When he wanted to see the warrant of arrest, the police officer failed to show any. He, therefore, refused to accompany the police officers. The police officers then produced an order of detention dated 13.1.91 under Section 3(1) (a) of a the Special Powers Act, 1974, stating that it was necessary to arrest the detenu for public safety and public order for a period of 120 days.


