
# 2 killed by dacoits

# Profiteers trading on human miseries

KHULNA, Feb 15: Rice, pulses, paddy, onion, chillis eggs, fish and chickens are being sold at abnormally higher prices in the markets of the

The producers do not get fair prices for their goods while consumers are being compelled to purchase these items at much higher rates. Marketing Act on agricultural products is not in force long since its promulgation.

According to the informed sources, dealers of these products should possess marketing licence and must not charge more than the fixed rates They should sell all goods weighing in metric system and hang charts showing daily prices under the act. In reality. things are not done properly as the authorities are inactive and the least bothered to check and control these acts.
