Meanwhile, an official source said, ten Burmese nationals were recently captured with smuggled goods worth about Taka 13 lakhs by BDR personnel from a point along the Bangladesh-Burma border.

Many other consignments of smuggled goods were setzed on various occasions by security personnel from different Informed sources said, ille-

gal trade through Bangladesh-

Burma border had been con-

tinuing unabated involving smugglers of both countries. The illegal trade is mainly carried out in a dubious barter system.

Under the illegal trade rice, spices, betelnuts, plums, fancy goods, optum and other drugs from Burma while expensive medicines, motor parts-both old and new, electronic goods, cloth and chillies are taken into Burma from Bangladesh across Naf River dodging the eyes of the law enforcing agen-

Security sources believe, illegal trade is carried out in connivance with some Burmese infiltrators who have already settled at Teknaf and other parts of Cox's Bazar and Chittagong city.

Some influential smugglers reportedly stay in busy trade centres and big hotels in Chittagong city to carry out their illegal deals, the sources added
