Boro farming plan in 5.23 lakh hectares

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Feb 23: The Agricultural Extension Department has taken up a programme to cultivate Boro paddy on 5,23.850 hectares of and in eight northern districts of the country during the current season.

According to the sources. high-yielding variety of Boro will be cultivated on 508000 hectares of land and pyjam will be eultivated on 2,250 hectares of land and the rest 13.600 hectares will be brought under local variety.

The districts under the programme are · Bogra, Rashahi, Naogaon, Natore, Chapatnawabganj, Pabna, Sirujganj and Joypurhat.

According to reliable sources 4,34.230 metric tons of paddy will be produced on 1,69,770 hectares of land in Bogra, 65,830 metric tons on 26,000 hectares of land in Raįshahi. 1,22,650 metric tons on 48,000 hectares in Natore, 2.31 760 metric tons on 90 730 hectares in Naogaon, 35,240 metric tons on 13,880

hectares in Chapainawabganj, 1.12.465 metric tons on 44,840 hectares in Pabna. 2,41,175 metric tons 94,480 hectares in Straigani 93,115 metric tons on 36,140 hectares in Joypurhat of Boro paddy will be cultivated.

It is expected that a total 13,67,000 metric tons of paddy will be produced under this programme.

To make this programme successful the Agricultural Extension Department will provide the farmers with necessary irrigation facilities, fertilizers, seeds and other agricultural equipment.

Pilferage of telephone wires rampant

PABNA, Feb 23: Pilferage of Telephone wires from different telephone lines in northern zone of the country is

According to the sources, nearly 30,000 metres long telephone wires worth Taka 2 lakh were stolen from different telephone lines during last three months and 300 telephones have been disrupted causing untold sufferings to the subscribers of the district in contacting Dhaka and other distant places.

On the other hand, due to lack of proper tele-communication the railway authorities are facing much problems to contact other railway stations. As a result trains are not able to maintain correct timings. The most affected areas of

the district are Singa, Lashkarpur, Nazirpur of Sadar upazila and Ishwardi, Bera and Santhia upazila of Pabna district. Several cases have been lodged by the Telephone and Telegraph Department but no action has yet been taken by the police, it is alleged

College building needs renovation

Law College of Pabna has been facing multifarious problems including acute shortage of accommodation and furniture, paucity of safe drinking water and faulty electric lines.

The college housed in an old building in 1973 has become dilapidated due to lack of renovation work. There are only two class rooms to accommodate 300 students. Due to shortage of space the students cannot sit comfortably. No separate common room is provided for the girl students. Besides, due to absence of staff room the teachers are seen sitting in the verandah.

Moreover, the library is running short of necessary books and the students are hardly able to prepare their lessons. On the other hand, the college is facing financial hardships. As a result teachers and staff members do not get salaries in time.

Despite good academic atmosphere, the college is not able to admit new students for want of accommodation.

People of the district urged the concerned authorities to take immediate steps for providing assistance for smooth running of the college.
