The elections, Mrs. Schaffer said, have been viewed by international observers, the press, the students and the diplomatic community as "the most free, fair and non-violent in the 20 year history of Bangladesh". She said, "we commend the interim gov ernment of Bangladesh, the political parties, the students, security forces and the voters who worked together in the spirit of compromise and cooperation to build democracy in Bangladesh.

The Deputy Assistant Sccretary told the Sub-committee: "we consider this election to be only the beginning of Bangladesh's progress toward stronger democratic institu tions, the next months will present the unique challenges of forming a parliament and then holding presidential elections or changing the Constitution to allow for a par liamentary democracy as preferred by some parties. We look forward to working with the new government".

She said US had actively promoted democracy in Bangladesh for many years. USAID-funded programmes have contributed to the process through voter education programmes and training of poll watchers and indigeneous election observers. "We con sider the recent elections to be a solid foundation for US cooperation with Bangladesh efforts to strengthen evolving democratic institutions.

Mrs. Schaffer said that the United States had contributed over 3 billion US dollars to Bangladesh's development since its independence in 1971 and continues to be interested in its economic development. She said Ban-

gladesh enjoys one of the largest US development assislance and PL 480 food and commodity assistance programmes totalling over 130 million dollars annually. She noted that because of Bangladesh's commitment to continue economic reforms and its efforts toward strengthening democratic pluralism, the administration has announced relief for Bangladesh's outstanding development assistance debt of 292 million US dollars during the current fiscal year. "We believe that debt relief can make significant contribution toward the country's economic and political development", she

She said US was satisfied with the government of Bangladesh's efforts to continue economie reform. She reported that last year's sharply falling foreign reserve had stabilized and that Bangladesh was again was sticking to its IMF Enhanced Structural Adjustment Programme negotiated in August, 1990, in spite of the impact of higher oil prices last Fall, and lost remittances from workers in Kuwait and Irag.

ongressman Solarz said that Bangladesh efforts to stick to difficult economic adjustment policies, combined with us commitment to a democratic transition, justify prompt debt relief.

In reply to a question by the Congressman if USAID had given any consideration to forgiving PL 480 Title III food debt, which announced to 1.3 billion US dollars, Assistant Administrator of USAID said that they were in favour of such forgiveness, but said it was upto USDA and the Treasury Department to take decision in this matter. Congressman Solarz requested the Assistant Administrator to hold consultations with the two Departments and report back to the Sub-committee.
