Dhaka to lose \$30m due to US quota on three items

seven-member team leaves Dhaka today (Saturday) for Washington at the invitation of the US government for consultation on the recently-given call notice to impose quota restriction on export of three garments and textiles products of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

Solution of jail problems demanded

The First Secretary Incharge of the Sramik Krishak Samajbadi Dal, Nirmal Sen, Friday demanded of the authorities concerned to take permanent measures towards resolving the problems of jails and their inmates, reports

In a statement issued in Dhaka, Sen said violence began anew in different jails with undesirable incidents and deaths. The fail authorities are trying to solve the problem locally but to no avail, he said.

Sen suggested the concerned ministry to take initiative for the solution of this long standing problem.

Sajeda demands enquiry

Begum Sajeda Chowdhury General Secretary of Bangladesh Awami League on Friday demanded a judicial enquiry into the firing at Comilla Central Jail on Wednesday in which eight prisoners were killed.

In a statement Begum Sajeda Chowdhury demanded that those responsible for the killing be brought to book and legal actions be taken against US market for its own products.

After the Bangladesh government refuted the plea with facts and figures the US side called for consultation on the matter under the provision of the Multi Fibre Agreement (MFA), sources said.

Garments and textiles manufacturers and exporters say that, Bangladesh, being already hard-hit by the Gulf war, will lose about 30 million US dollars in trade per year if the call on three items is not withdrawn.

The country will incur a loss of about 100 million US dollars in remittances due

to the Gulf war. The total loss due to the Gulf war was earlier estimated at about one billion US dollars including the remittances, repatriation, rehabilitation and export earning. Besides, the country has lost millions of dollars in other businesses due to the impact of the Gulf war.

The US government has recently doubled the garments export quota of Turkey to help develop the economy of the country wrecked by the Gulf war and it increased earlier the export quota of the Philippines to help the democracy in that country. The United States, being the

Ban on synthetic industries urged

Industries Minister Shamsul Islam Khan on Thursday said the new government within the short span of its rule had tremendously earned the confidence of donors who are now coming up with generous investment offers, reports UNB.

The BNP government would utilise it for optimum benefit of the country, he told a function arranged to accord him reception by the Bangladesh Jute Spinners Association (BJSA) in Dhaka Thursday

afternoon. Khan, himself an industrialist and founder-member of the association, said the coming industrial policy would take in serious consideration the suggestions regarding development of jute industry.

Contribution of jute sector to the economy has not yet been properly evaluated, he said, adding the BNP government would attach special importance to the growth of the

sector. The function was presided over by BJSA chairman M. Mahmood. Some members of the association apprised the minister of various longstanding problems crippling the sector.

Criticising the economic policies of the previous regime, the Industries Minister said both the two industrial policies framed between 1982 and '86 were a "total fatlure."

Production in mills and factories declined and growth in the industrial sector dropped from 10.2 per cent in 1980-81 to 8 per cent in 1989-90, he pointed out. The BNP government is

well aware of the fact that industrialisation has no alternative for national development, Khan said, adding everything possible would be done for the country's industrial develop-

"Human capital - honesty and entrepreneurship - would be duly patronised," the minister said, outlining the new government's broad economic philosophy.

The BJSA chairman and other members urged the minister to impose restriction on setting up synthetic industries for saving local jute products from extinction.

They also appealed for waiving interest on outstand ing bank loans of the spinning units which are on the sick
