"We have nothing to say right now. We must concentrate on our league duties," said Napoli's sports director. Giorgio Perinetti, before driving to the San Paolo stadium for Saturday's Napoli-Inter league match.

Napoli, the defending league champions who along with Maradona's several well publicised problems this season have fallen to 11th in the Italian league standings achieved a surprising 1-1 draw with the second-place Inter.

The whereabouts of Maradona, who has not been seen in public since Thursday when a Rome newspaper first reported that he had tested positive for a banned substance following the March 17 Napoli-Bari game, were unknown to the club.

However, Mardona's manager Marco Franchi was quoted by the Italian news agency ANSA as saying that the player was secluded at his Naples home.

Franchi said he informed the player of the results of the drug test Friday night. He did not elaborate on Maradona's reaction, but said his wife Claudia broke into tears.


