

Rescue operation at Sripur continues: 13 bodies recovered so far

Many more trapped under rubble

The death toll in Wednesday's roof-collapse of Mita Textile, Mills at Sripur of Gazipur district rose to 13 with eight more bodies recovered from the debris Thursday.

The rescuers suspended their activities Thursday evening after a 12-hour operation since Wednesday evening. The rescue operations will resume this (Friday) morning. Till Thursday, the number of the construction workers trapped under the collapsed roof was 26. They include 13 dead and 13 severely injured.

The roof of the under construction mills building caved in when tornado lashed the area Wednesday afternoon trapping the labourers.

The members of Fire Service along with the technicians of Titas Gas recovered five bodies and 13 critically injured persons till Wednesday. The fire fighters continued their rescue operations till 6.30 pm Thursday recovering eight more bodies. They said there may be

some more bodies under the debris. But local people believe many bodies are till tapped under the rubble.

Private member's resolution rejected by voice vote

No more loan exemption in any sector, JS told

The Jatiya Sangasad (Parlia ment) on Thursday rejected by voice vote a resolution, calling for exempting interest payments on agricultural loans upto Taka 10 thousand. Finance and Planning

Speaker Abdur Rahman Biswas Thursday adjourned the House at 4.30 pm till 2 pm on April 21, reports BSS.

Minister Saifur Rahman told the Sangasad that the available resources of the government would not permit any new interest exemption measure for agricultural loans.

Winding up two and a half hours' discussion on private members' day, the minister

said, the government had already announced its decision to write off all outstanding agricultural loans upto Taka five thousand. The decision was taken to redeem the election pledges of BNP, he

He said the implementation of the decision on agricultural debt relief would involve about Taka 1000 crore. Besides, the land holdings upto 25 bighas have been made tax-free, he

The resolution, calling upon the Government to waive interest charges on all agricultural loans upto Taka ten thousand, was moved by indepenmember Nurul Islam

Khaleda visits tornado-hit Gazipur

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia on Thursday rushed to Sreepur Upazila of Gazipur where an under-construction textile mills collapsed as tornado hit the area Wednesday, reports BSS.

The district administration told the Prime Minister that nine people hed been killed and 14 others injured when Mita Textile Mills collapsed under the impact of tornado which lashed the areas at 4 pm Wednesday. The persons. killed and injured in the accident are construction workers who took refuge in the mills building. The Prime Minister was informed that medical teams were working in the

Begum Zia was told that because of architectural defects the under construction mills collapsed during the tornado.

Begum Zia went to the local Sadar Hospital to see the condition of the eight injured persons admitted there. She talked to the victims who narrated her how they were injured.

Crackdown on feuding prisoners in Chittagong jail: 35 injured

CHITTAGONG Apr 11: Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) and BDR took advantage of a clash between convicts and under-trial prisoners today to bring the situation in Chittagong jail under control following a crackdown on unruly prisoners, CMP sources said. reports BSS.

Thirty-five prisoner, both convicts and under trial, were injured during the crackdown.

Police and BDR men recovered lethal weapons including swords, iron rods. GI pipes. iron darts, blades, choppers. bamboo sticks and three tons of brick bats and pebbles during a search inside the wards and on the roofs. Two kg ganja, bomb making accessories, acid and sedatives were also recovered form the possession of some prisoners.

implemented in principle in Bangladesh. With the growth of its rural based industries, China has provided 100 million jobs to its rural population.

The annual TEC meeting. held in an atmosphere of cordiality, friendship and under standing was chaired by the **ERD Secretary Enam Ahmed** Chowdhury. The Chinese side was led by
