Are the BBC signals roaring?

This intense man with his Oxford accent and blue striped shirt was ready to talk to me about his work, sitting in the Sheraton cafe, although he had only just got off the plane from

Kathmandu. Speaking about getting better equipment for clearer signals Peter Udell, Controller of the BBC Overseas Service, says, "Twenty years ago you could whisper like a mouse. Today the only way you can retain an audience is when you roar like a tiger. Over the last 10 years more than 1000 million pounds have been spent to improve BBC's audibility. There is a new relay station which broadcasts into N. China. Transmitters from the Indian Ocean are improving signals to E. Africa. There are good signals in the Arab world, in Iran, Afghanistan and down to Pakistan.

"The Subcontinent is now the highest priority. The short wave service from Masirah in the Indian Ocean takes care of the western

part of India. In cooperation with Radio Netherlands we are trying to approach authorities in Thailand to build relay stations there to improve the quality of reception in the eastern part of the Subcontinent, the BBC expert elaborates.

Discussing the number of listeners from S. Asia, Mr. Udell informs us that there are 8.3 million adults listening in Bengali and English from Bangladesh. He says of this 17% live in the urban area and 83% in the rural area. Of these 52% of the listeners are male. The Hindi figure in India is about 25 million while in Pakistan the figure is 8 million.

"The audience is predominantly male and we must in the future try to attract more women listeners," he comments.

Dwelling on the changes in the format of the programme Mr. Udell says that over the years "We have broadcasted once a week and only for 15 minutes a programme called 'South Asia Survey'. This is an attempt to look in depth at the developments, in particular, in politics. Beginning from the end of April instead of one broadcast a week there will be

"This will be an attempt," he elaborates, "to cover events in details and will include items such as interviews of politicians and experts from Bangladesh, for example. In terms of output in Bengali, we have increased it a few days ago by five minutes a day. This is to have a more coherent stream of broadcast. There will be further developments of journalism in the Bengali section."

Radio Bangladesh is letting out its transmitters for relays. Is BBC interested in relaying from Bangladesh ? To this Mr. Udell replies, "BBC may be interested in renting the relay transmitters as has been done in France and

When comparing BBC with CNN, the BBC expert informs us. There will be half an hour a day news TV bulletin for the international audience. The problem is that it has to operate on a commercial basis and cannot be like the radio programme which we offered free." He elaborates "BBC will be wholly comprehensive. It will cover sports, science, music, arts, as well as views on current affairs. We would be covering not only major world stories, which CNN is so good at doing. The BBC TV news service is more analytic while the CNN expertise is on the eye reportage. We try to combine news with analysis."

Discussing commercial broadcasting the BBC expert informs, "There will be a third commercial TV channel in UK. On the radio front there are a large number of local com-

mercial radios. There have been arguments that BBC should try to get revenues by advertising. But conparties have

reservations about commer cial funding. The system of licensing radio helps fund BBC for the last 50 years and this is likely to contin-

Discussing training of personnel the BBC chief admits that they are going in for recruiting younger people. "These people are easier to train. They will chase an interview like a dog biting away at a bone. They will ask tougher questions than they asked 10 years ago. They will aim at the impossible because if they don't they cannot move beyond what is easy. he comments.

Peter Udell, born at Newmarket in '41, and educated at Keble College, joined BBC as a trainee in '62, although he sent in his application late. By '88 he became the Controller of the Overseas Services, and Bengali is one of the languages that he is responsible for. He has three children, his eldest daughter works with a publisher of a children's books, his second daughter is a primary school teacher, while his son is studying to be an architect.

His interests include development in the Third World, keeping fit and oriental food.

14 'tempos' being requisitioned daily

Fourteen auto-tempos go off the roads in the metropolis for use on a round the clock patrol duty everyday. Three daily wage earners, the driver, an assistant and the owner, of each tempo do not earn a farthing for the day. The duties are carried out by patrol police in narrow lanes and bye-lanes on board the tempos throughout the year. Each group of 14 tempos are requisifioned at least once in a month.

is alleged that the three-


wheelers are virtually seized without any written order from the competent authority and pressed into service within the jurisdiction of 14 police stations in the metropolitan city.

A police source told The Daily Star that police have no smaller transports to ply in the narrow lanes and the three wheelers are, therefore, requisitioned daily. The source confirmed that no fare is paid to the owner nor the driver and the assistant for their day's duty.

Such practice continues for the last three years and each auto-tempo is thus pressed into patrol duty without fare.

The Deputy Commissioner of Police (Headquarters) said that he had not knowledge of any order authorising the officers in charge of metropolitan police stations for requisition of tempos been issued.


