Drought-hit areas are most affected: 35000 attacked

600 die of diarrhoea in 28 districts

Diarrhoeal diseases which have already claimed nearly 600 lives are spreading fast in other parts of the country, official sources said on Tuesday. Most of the areas are drought-

Thirteen more districts were affected Tuesday raising the number of the stricken districts to 28. None of the districts had a drop of rain during the last two months.

According to the official figures till Tuesday afternoon 511 people died of diarrhoea and more than 35 thousand were attacked with it across the country.

A pre-midnight official report recorded 45 deaths on Tuesday. The number of a fected people was pegged at 2534. But the unofficial figures are much higher than that of the government.

The stricken districts are Patuakhali, Jhalakathi, Pirojpur, Barisal, Barguna, Bhola, Noakhali, Satkhira, Bagarhat, Rajshahi, Naogaon, Magura, Nawabgang, Comilla, Bogra, Pabna, Natore, Kushtia, Lakshmipur, Jessore, Rangpur, Faridpur, Jhenaidah, Chandpur, Mymensingh, Sylhet, Nilfamari and Ja-malpur.
