Tk 1045 crore bad debts

Star Economic Report

Total bad debts of five nationalised banks and two development financing institutions amounted to Taka 1045.68 crores on December 31.1989.

Classification of bad debts for 1990 is not yet complete. This was stated by State Minister for Finance Mujibur Rahman in the Jatiya Sangsad on Saturday in reply to a question by Sardar Shakhawat Hossain Bakul (Narsingdi-4).

The State Minister gave the break-up of bad debts. The position on December 31, 1989 was as follows: Sonali -Bank Taka 363.68 crores, Janata Bank — Taka 153.00 crores, Agrani Bank — Taka

148.87 crores, Rupali Bank -Taka 165.53, Bangladesh Shilpa Bank — Taka 201.35 crores, Bangladesh Shilpa Rin Sangstha - Taka 89.08 crores and Bangladesh Krishi Bank -Taka 4.34 crores.

The State Minister informed the House during the question hour that total outstanding agricultural credits at the end of March, 1991 stood at Taka 5662.72 crores. He was answering a question by Mosharraf Hossain (Mymensingh-Netrokona).

Replying to another question by the same members, Mujibur Rahman said that unsettled certificate cases against defaulters in repayments of

agricultural credits numbered 4,26,539 in January, 1991. The claims relating to such certificate cases amounted to Taka 416.33 crores, he added. The State Minister told the

House that, the employees of Sonali Bank embezzled Taka 12.48 crores during 1982-90 and that the recovered amount of such embezzled funds till now stood at Taka 5.25 crores. Replying to a question by

A.T.M. Alamgir (Comilla-10), Mujibur Rahman gave the position of fund embezzlement during 1982-90 and recovery thereof in others nationalised commercial banks as follows: Janata Bank — embezzlement - Taka 19.47 crores and re-

covery -Taka 5.12 crore. Agrani Bank — embezzlement -Taka 8.53 crores and recovery - Taka 2.35 crores, and Rupali Bank — embezzlement — Taka 1.64 crores and recovery -Taka 4.73 crores.

Answering a question by Haji Rashed Mosharraf (Jamalpur-2), the State Minister for Finance told the House that smuggled gold, weighing 823.476 kilograms (Kgs), was seized from June 1982 to March 1991.

Punitive measures have been taken against he smugglers, he said.



Barguna-2).



Cases filed against Shah Moazzem, Chand

The Bureau of Anti-Corruption has filed a case with Ramna Thana against former Deputy Prime Minister Shah Moazzem Hossain and former State Minister for Food Nurunnabi Chand for causing financial loss to the government by their illegal order through abuse of power, an official handout said on Saturday. reports BSS.

According to the handout. the Directorate of Food in 1989 bought nine lakh pieces of jute sacks through tender to meet its demand. But afterwards, Shah Moazzem Hossain who was in charge of the Food Ministry then, passed an illegal order on the Food Directorate to buy nine lakh more pieces of jute sacks although there was no demand for those. The government thus suffered a loss of Taka 2.15 crore, the handout said.

Indian Muslims search for a saviour

NEW DELHI, Apr 27: India's Muslims, shaken by an unprecedented rise in Hindu fundamentalism, are searching for a saviour premier as the country inches towards the second general election in two years, reports AFP.

Over 100- million- strong community appears to be in a dilemma as political parties queue up before their leaders to seek Muslim votes for balloting to the federal parlia-

ment next month. Muslims say their choice is tough since no party looks set to win at the moment, while determined onslaughts by Hindu revivalists on traditional secular values have instilled a fear in them unseen before any previous election.

Added to their worries are recurring Hindu-Muslim riots across India.

"Minorities, particularly Muslims, have begun to feel threatened," said Ahmed Bukhari, deputy priest of the historic Juma Masjid (Mosque) here. There seems to be none who can protect

"Every government has made promises but failed to protect our lives and property," he said, "and now politi-

cians are again coming to us (asking for support)".

Muslims are the largest religious minority in Hindudominated India and popular optrion holds that they usually vote en bloc, giving them a power that can make or unmake contestants in scores of constituencies.

Many say this is a myth, but the belief is widespread.


As a result, all major political parties are wooing Muslim religious and community leaders in a bid to brighten their chances in what is widely expected to be an evenly fought

election.

Bukhari said representatives of both ex-Premier Rajiv Gandhi's Congress (I) Party and his successor Vishwanath Pratap Sing's centrist Janata Dal (People's Party) had met his father-cum-chief priest Abdullah Bukhari.

The widely publicised meetings drew the immediate irk of the Hindu revivalist

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP or Indian People's Party), which while making no bones about its Hindu platform accused the Congress and Janata Dal of pampering Muslims.
