Trade team to visit US

An investment mission from the private sector will leave for the United States in the first week of June headed by a senior government official, according to a message received in Dhaka Saturday, reports

The itinerary of the mission finalised by the sponsors --Bangladesh United States Business Council, is scheduled to visit Washington DC on June 11. New Orleans, Louisiana on June 13, and San Francisco, California on June 17.

The storm centered about 1060 kms south and south-west of Chittagong Port at 3 pm Saturday. The maximum sustained wind around 64 kms of the storm centre is 90 kms per hour which is rising to 115 kms per hour with gust and squalls. the Met office said

The maritime ports of Chittagong, Cox's Bazar and Mongla have been advised to hoist distant signal number 2 and fishing boats and trawlers over the North Bay have been asked to remain close to the coast so that they could take shelter at short notice.
