Severest cyclone hits coasts

The severe cyclonic storm formed in the Bay of Bengal crossed the Chittagong-Cox's Bazar coasts near the Meghna estuary at midnight last night leaving a trial of destruction. affecting at least seven million people.

The cyclone with a core of hurricane speed winds of upto 210 kilometres rising to 235 kilometres in gusts and squalls - battered the entire coastline from Satkhira to Teknaf razing houses, uprooting trees, and whipping up storm surges.

Under the pheripheral effect of the cyclonic storm the coastal districts in Khulna zone started experiencing a storm accompanied with a downpour from the afternoon. By the evening the coastal districts in Chittagong zone were affected.

The cyclonic storm uprooted electricity and telephone poles disrupting supply of electricity in the entire coastal belt. By midnight telecommunications of the coastal upazilas with respective district headquarters was snapped.

Hamiduzzaman Khan Chowdhury, Director, Bangladesh Meteorological Department told The Daily Star that the cyclone was the

severest in 20 years. He said that although all the

coastal districts were affected the real brunt of the cyclone had been borne by islands like Hatiya, Sandwip, Kutubdia, Moheshkhali, Patuakhali, and the low-lying areas of Chittagong, Feni, Cox's Bazar

The Deputy Director of Meteorological Department Azizul Hussain observed that never before had a cyclone affected the whole, coastal belt of Bangladesh.

The cyclone had a diameter of about 300 kilometres even though the maximum fury of

The maritime ports of Chittagong, Cox's Bazar and Mongla were asked to hoist great danger signals 10, 9 and 8 respectively.

Riverine ports in fourteen districts of Chittagong. Cox's Bazar, Noakhali, Feni. Laksmipur, Chandpur, Bhola, Patuakhali, Barisal, Barguna. Pirojpur, Bagerhat, Khulna and Satkhira were asked to hoist great danger signal number four.

The Cyclone Preparedness Programme CPP started alerting administrations and people of 24 coastal districts from Sunday. Over 20,000 volunteers of the Programme transmitted messages using sirens, microphones and megaphones advising people living in low-lying areas to move to cyclone shelters.

The Director of the Programme Emdad Hossain and volunteers of the Programme succeeded in Taking 3.2 lakh coastal people to about 250 cyclone shelters.

Worst in 20 years

The severe cyclonic storm packing hurricane-force winds which crossed the coast west of Chittagong at midnight last night was the worst ever in the history of Bangladesh experts

The maximum windspeed of the cyclone was over 148 miles per hour 235 (kilometres) compared to the maximum windspeed of 138 miles per hour recorded during the November 12, 1970 cyclone which claimed half a million human lives.

Monday's cyclone, like the one in 1970 hit in the period of a full moon high tide causing the surges whipped up by it to be at their highest. Cyclones formed in the Bay

of Bengal are essentially identical to the Pacific typhoons and the Atlantic hurricanes. But cyclones are more destructive than hurricanes, although hurricanes have higher windspeeds. According to experts sev-

JS adjourned for three days to face situation

The Jatiya Sangsad (parlia ment) session has been adjourned till 3 pm on May 3 in view of the emergency situa tion arising out of the cyclonic storm in the coastal areas.

Prime Minister and Leader Wi the floure Begun Khaleda Zia proposed on Monday evening this adjournment for three days to concentrate all efforts to force the natural calamity. The proposal was supported by the opposition.

Soon after the question-answer hour, the Prime Minister made a statement in the House informing the members of the latest situation about the storm which was approaching the Bangladesh coast. She said the severe cyclone with a core hurricane windspeed upto 210 kilometers was moving fast and was likely to hit the coastal belt sometime Monday night. She mentioned that a tidal surge upto 20 feet was

also feared The Prime Minister said all necessary steps had been taken to face the emergency and people were alerted

By Staff Correspondent against the storm by radio and

television immediately after the indication of the storm was received. The local administrations in the coastal districts are also advising the people over microphones to take shelter at safer places, she added.

Begum Zia told the House that Bangladesh Navy and other government departments, Red Crescent and voluntary organisations had been kept on alert to face possible disaster. She informed that a control room was set up at the relief Ministry to monitor the situation round the clock.

After the statement, the Prime Minister proposed adjournment of the House for three days and urged all the members of parliament to be ready to rush to the affected

The Deputy Leader of the Opposition Abdus Samad Azad thanked the Leader of the House for their statement and proposal. He mentioned that after the cyclone of 1970, the people unitedly faced the disaster under the leadership of

Bangabandhu and stood by the side of the affected people. He said the members of parliament were unanimous to combat the disaster.

When the break for Asar prayer was over, munajat was offered in the dieuse sreking blessings of Almighty Allah to tide over the natural disaster. Tofael Ahmed of Awami League then took the floor and requested for smooth operation of relief work. "We want to carry on relief operations jointly", he urged.
