Dacoits loot valuables

May 11: A gang of about 300 armed dacoits Thursday stormed 17 houses at village Jhethor-Bhabanipur in Sadar upazila, injured at least 20 people and looted valuables.

Witnesses said the dacotts in broad day light from neighbouring village Dohakula attacked the houses and beat the inmates indiscriminately. They decamped with valuables

Of the injured, one Afsar Ali (45), was rushed to the Sadar Hospital where his condition was stated to be critical. The villagers informed the matter to local MP Shahiduzzaman.

When contacted the MP confirmed the incident.

A case has been filed in this connection.

Property worth Tk 8 lakh gutted

May 11: Property worth about Taka eight lakh was gutted in two separate fire incidents at Gopara village in Sadar upazila. Fire Brigade sources said here yesterday. reports UNB
