

More organisations give relief for the distressed

More organisations continued to donate funds for the distressed millions and carried out relief operations.

BDR

Relief and rehabilitation activities of BDR personnel are in full swing in Chittagong and Cox's Bazar. Besides relief activities, two platoons of BDR personnel have engaged themselves in burial of bodies and removing the debris of cattlehead. They have so far buried 2,289 bodies and removed 3,945 dead cattlehead in Banskhali upazila alone, according to a BDR press release.

Pubali Bank Ltd

The officers and employees of Pubali Bank Ltd have donated their one day's salary amounting to Taka 3,38,000 to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund. The board of directors of the bank also donated Taka 10,00,000 to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

Mohila tran-committee

Bangladesh Sammilta Mohila Tran Committee on Saturday donated Taka 50,000 to the PM's Relief Fund. It also sent relief materials which include bread-7560, chakra-55kg, molasses-23kg, 1785 pieces of clothes, candles 100 dozens, matches - 120 dozens and soaps-9kgs to the affected areas.

Dhaka University Rover Scouts and Ranger unit have sent relief materials and food-stuff to cyclone hit coastal areas.

Kamalkali - A juvenile organisation to implement the ideals of shahed President Ziaur Rahman has donated 6,000 pieces of chapatti, 3,000 pieces of old and new clothes, besides match boxes, candles and water purification tablets to the Relief Ministry.

Shandhani has sent a medical and relief team to Sandwip, Hatiya and Chittagong.

Bangladesh Palli Chikitsak Samity has sent 60 voluntary medical teams with emergency medicine and medical equipment to the cyclone affected areas.

Teachers, officers and employees of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology have donated their one day's salary amounting to Taka one lakh fifty thousand for the cyclone victims. The students of BUET also donated their stipends money for the affected people.

Shechhasebak

Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Shechhasebak today left for Chittagong with relief materials worth Taka 5 lakh.

Health For All

Health for all sent relief and medical teams to Cox's Bazar, Moheshkhali, Kuruskul, Mathabari, with tons of dry food, oral saline, water purification tablets utensils and other life saving drugs.

Banani Youths

A group of enthusiasts set out from Banani's UAE market

towards Gulshan's number one market. The aim of the walkathon, sponsored by numerous companies and organisations, was to raise money for cyclone victims. A spokesman told The Daily Star that over 1,60,000 Taka had been raised.

Imran Fan Club

Imran Khan Fan Club handed over to the ADAB officials 150 pieces of new lanterns, 929 pieces of saris, lungis, pants, shirts and other garments to distribute among the cyclone affected people.

SCF (USA)

Save the Children (USA) has raised about US dollars five lakh so far for cyclone victims. Last week SCF (USA) despatched food commodities worth 6.2 lakh Taka, medicines valued at 9.4 lakh Taka and cooking utensils for 2 lakh Taka for distribution in the highly distressed areas of Chokoria, Swandip, Moheshkhali, Kutubdia, Banskhali, Sitakunda, Morsharai and greater Chittagong. Working with NGO's such as Nijera Kor, CONCERN, UBINIG, Ahsania Mission and Unnayan Shahojay Teams, SCF (USA) is giving relief supplies for about 1,90,000 cyclone victims.

Pathfinder

Pathfinder International has drawn up an Emergency Relief Assistance Program worth of US\$ 294,000 to reach succour to the people affected during the cyclonic storm and tidal surge that lashed the coastal areas Chittagong and the offshore islands of Bangladesh on April 29, 1991 leaving a trail of devastation.

Sanskritik Jote

"Sammilita Sanskritik Jote" Bangladesh Mahila Parishad and "Bijoy Mela Parishad" in Dhaka have jointly undertaken and integrated Relief and Rehabilitation Programmes. These three organisations launched their relief works from May 3 and distributed 25,200 pieces of ruti, 1,370 kg chira, 4,000 kg potato, 770 kg gur, 36 bags of old cloths and 1,270 kgs biscuits.

Rotary Club

Rotary Club of Shyamali-Dhaka organised a relief op-

eration in collaboration with several organisations, especially the Dhaka American Women's Club and sent a team with more than Taka two lakh worth of food, clothing and other materials. The team left Dhaka on May 7.

Bangladesh police

Bangladesh police is conducting massive relief works in cyclone-hit areas of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts. Police forces sent 38,000 chapattis from their own ration to the cyclone-hit areas of Sandwip, Santoshpur and Nijhum Deep by helicopter on Sunday.

Chattagram Samity

Office bearers of Chattagram Samity are now working in cyclone-hit Banskhali, Chokoria, Anwara, Sandwip upazilas. They have taken with them 10 trucks of relief materials including rice, chira, molasses and medicines. Rejaul Huq Mustaq, Secretary of the Samity, S. M. Yusuf, Jalaluddin Ahmed, Dr. Mostafizur Rahman and Farid Ahmed Chowdhury are leading the relief teams. A liaison office to coordinate the relief works has been opened at 8 Momin road, Chittagong.

Ganachaya

A 10-member relief team of Ganachaya, a cultural organisation, has started its relief activities in Banskhali from Sunday, a press release said. Convener of the organisation Tabibur Rahman is leading the team.

CARE

CARE, an international relief agency, so far distributed 1,07,134 kgs of chira, 43,528 kgs of molasses, 6,925 pieces of blankets, 7,39,827 water purifying tablets and 7,10,750 packets of (ORS) oral rehydration saline to the cyclone-hit people of the coastal areas. Besides, the organisation also supplied 80,726 meters of 8-feet wide plastic sheets, 51,155 boxes of matches and 151,128 pieces of candles to 25,000 families in the coastal areas, who are the organisation's initial target of assistance, says a press release.

IEB

The Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh (IEB) donated Tk.1,00,000 (one lakh) to

the Prime Ministers Relief Fund for the help of the cyclone affected people of coastal areas.

OXFAM

Oxfam has been feeding the cyclone victims of Kutubdia island under its emergency feeding programme since May, 9. Under this emergency programme 60,000 people are being fed and this programme will continue for 10 days more, said a press release.

World Vision

The total relief and rehabilitation programme of World Vision of Bangladesh for the cyclone victims of Chittagong, Cox's Bazar and Bandarban districts now comes to Tk. 9 crore.

BIAA

A meeting of the Executive Committee of Bangladesh Indenting Agents' Association was held in its office at 18, Purana Paltan, Dhaka on 6-5-91. It has been decided in the meeting to donate Tk.50,000 to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

SU employees

Teachers, officers and employees of Shaikhali University of Science and Technology, Sylhet contributed two day's salary to Prime Minister's Relief Fund for the cyclone victims, an ISPR press release said.

BSS

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia received a cheque for her cyclone Relief Fund from Mr D P Barua, Managing Director and chief Editor of Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS) Sunday evening at Sugandha office, reports BSS. The cheque was presented on behalf of the BSS employees who contributed their one day's salary for the cyclone-affected people.

The BSS Chief Editor was accompanied by Mr Gias Kamal Chowdhury, Employees' representative in the BSS Board of Directors, Mr Md Afazuddin, President, and Mr Zainul Abedin, General Secretary of the BSS Employees Union.

Rajshahi police

A huge quantity of relief materials was sent on Sunday by the police of Rajshahi range for the distressed people of the cyclone and tidal surge battered coastal areas.

Sena Paribar

ECNEC okays two projects

A meeting of the Executive Committee of National Economic Council (ECNEC) was held in Dhaka Sunday with Finance and Planning Minister Saifur Rahman in the chair, reports BSS.

The meeting approved two projects, "LPG transport and distribution projects" and "LP gas storage, bottling and distribution projects" with some modifications at total expenditure of 267.30 crore Tk. including 183.57 crore Taka in foreign exchange.

Dr. Mosharraf Hossain, State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources, secretaries and members of Planning Commission were present.

BJMC

A Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) Relief Team leaves Chittagong for Banskhali today (morning) with a big consignment of relief goods for distribution among the cyclone affected people, a corporation press release said. The relief goods include rice, pulse, salt, old clothes, dry food, match boxes, etc. Earlier, BJMC officers, employees and workers donated Taka 35 lakh to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund.

CIRDAP

A team from the Centre on Integrated Rural Development for Asia and the Pacific (CIRDAP), Rotary Club of Dhaka Cosmopolitan and Rotaract Club of Sir Salmullah Medical College Dhaka, distributed relief materials to and rendered medical aid among the cyclone and tidal bore affected people of Char Baishak, Char Ganchil, and Char Dhansherish under Noakhali Sadar Upazila on 9 and 10 May. The relief goods worth about Tk. 400,000, included rice, chira, sarees, lungis, salt, brown sugar, biscuits, fitkary, some essential household items and medicines.

Dhaka Club

Dhaka Club relief team comprising of Mr. Enayet-e-Rabbi, Mr. Syed Bazley Hussain, Mr. Babu Sarwar, Mr. Momen and consisting of some more members and doctors had left for Hatiya and other adjoining areas on 7th May, 1991 carrying relief goods worth about Tk.1,60,000 which included chira, molasses, utensils, ORS medicines, matches, soaps, cloths etc.

During their stay in Bhola, the Bhola Zila Relief Committee volunteer's corps distributed relief materials including a cash money of Taka 4 lacs among the affected persons.

SCI

Service Civil International (SCI) has despatched a relief team to the cyclone affected offshore islands of Char Kukri Mukri, Char Patila, Char Monohar and Char Motahar of Char Fasion upazila in Bhola district. The team will distribute 20 tons of food stuff, 78,000 water purifying tablets, 3000 oral saline and clothes. SCI will also open six gruel kitchen for 10 days.

Vivekananda Parishad

Vivekananda Shiksha O Sanskriti Parishad of Jagannath Hall, Dhaka University has distributed chira and molasses among the 300 tornado-hit families of Basan and Gacha union of Gazipur district. The Parishad is collecting more relief.

Ahussunnat

A relief team of Bangladesh Ahussunnat wal Jamayyat Sunny Chatra Shangathan distributed relief materials among the cyclone victims. It's relief operation was conducted in affected areas of middle Potenga, Kumira and Hali Shahar in Chittagong.

Damage to Forest Research Institute irreparable

CHITTAGONG, May 12: The April 29 catastrophic cyclone inflicted irreparable injuries to Bangladesh Forest Research Institute (BFRI) when it lost most of the fruits of its 20 to 30 years of research pursuits, reports BSS.

"Some of the most invaluable research data have been lost forever while in some other cases the field-based research endeavours could not be re-gained in next 10 to 30 years, said the stunned BFRI Director and the research officials of different disciplines of the institute.

They said, the loss could not be measured in terms of money but the damage inflicted by the fateful stormy night to the institute was "irreparable".

The fiery cyclone completely shattered the Bambusetum (a garden of bamboos), established by the institute through 20 years of tireless efforts. The museum was enriched with the collection of 325 gene-types of 30 different species of bamboo from home and abroad.

The BFRI bambusetum was so famous that very recently a team of the "transtel", a German TV network came in Dhaka and made video of some rare species of bamboos for its science fiction entitled "Bamboo - The Wonderful Grass of the World" to be telecast soon in its worldwide channel.

Il Bonik, in-charge of the bambusetum, told BSS that 50 per cent of the 4,400 bamboo clumps were totally destroyed along with all their research data. The all devastating cyclone has pushed us back to 20 years in this field, he added.

The cyclone destroyed BFRI cane-garden which was set up by collecting 40 gene-types of eight species of cane in 10

years' time. 90 per cent of this 90-clump cane garden was destroyed by the cyclone.

The most commendable achievement of the BFRI was its garden of endangered species of trees which was raised by collecting 29 such rare species from the nook and corner of the country. The BFRI took 30 years to raise this garden 30 per cent of which was damaged totally. The research works would be seriously hampered owing to this destruction, said Director Dr A B M Salehuddin.

The chief of minor forest department Mr Harun-Rashid told BSS that the garden of Herbal medicines which was raised in 30 years by collecting 60 species of medicinal plants from various parts of this sub-continent was shattered by the severe cyclone.

Mr Harun, who achieved a breakthrough in propagation of 'patt-patha' (a kind of shrubs used in making bed) said, 40 per cent of this section was destroyed. The field based data of its propagation were also lost, he added.

The BFRI, in its seven silviculture centres, had successfully raised gardens of 216 provinces of 44 species of trees through research pursuits of elimination, growth

trials, planting techniques, fertilization, species, mixing and experimental block plantation. The institute to reach at this stage, had to traverse a path of 20 years. But the severe cyclonic storm destroyed 30 to 60 per cent of its achievements.

The institute in its six research centres, through selection breeding, raised 13-species tree gardens of graftings and a 7-species tree garden of seedlings, the progeny trails of these gardens destroyed along with 2,227 clones of high yielding varieties.

At Hinguli sub-centre of the institute gamar and teak plantations were totally damaged by the calamity.

The cyclone also destroyed the agro-forestry model activities on the lands of the settlers of Bandarban hill district being executed by the BFRI under its integrated farming system research in hill regions.

The suspension of power supply to BFRI for seven days following the cyclone caused great harms to the laboratory experiments including tissue culture.

The BFRI has submitted a Taka 65,00,000 rehabilitation project to the relevant authorities.

Dateline Khulna

All-party relief committee sends 5 truck loads to Barisal

Khulna, May 12: An all-party relief committee has been formed here to collect relief materials for the cyclone affected people in the coastal areas.

Meanwhile, the relief committee has sent five truck loads of relief materials which include chira, gur, old garments, medicines, biscuits, household utensils and water purifying tablets to the zonal relief coordination centre of Barisal.

A number of squads are collecting relief materials from different areas of the city and storing those in the local district collectorate premises. But a grim report has been received regarding distribution of inadequate relief among the cyclone-hit people of the offshore islands in Bhola district.

The district administration of Bhola with two naval boats and a few Japanese built rescue boats were trying to reach the offshore islands with relief materials. But the Deputy Commissioner of Bhola told this Correspondent over telephone Saturday that it could not be possible to conduct relief operation to remote islands due to shortage of deep draft river craft.

The Regional Relief Coordination Centre headquarters led by Major Gen R A M Golam Muktadir has been shifted to Bhola. The district administration has been working round the clock to redress the sufferings of half a million cyclone victims joining hands with army, navy and local political parties. Meanwhile, diarrhoea has

already broken out at different places of Bhola. Non-government organisations working at the islands fear massive spread of infectious diseases at Bhola as aftermath of 29 April's devastating cyclone.

According to district administration, some hundred thousands homeless people are yet to get any substantial materials for reconstruction of their damaged houses. More than 30 thousand families who live by the cross-dams of the river Meghna are passing their days with little food, no work to do and literally under the open sky. The two thousand bundles of CI sheets which were allocated for the hurricane-hit people of Bhola were reported to be meagre comparing to the need and yet to reach Bhola for distribution among the victims.
