CARE to launch mid-term rehabilitation project

CARE Bangladesh, will launeh a mid-term rehabilitation project for a target period of 60 to 90 days in the coastal areas of Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts soon.

Dr. Philip Johnston, President CARE-USA, told a press conference at Sheraton Hotel on Monday after his return from the cyclone-battered areas. Robin Needham, CARE Bangladesh Chief, was present at the conference.

The rehabilitation project will mainly include restoration of transportation and communication, agricultural, poultry and livestocks development, Johnston said. CARE will also provide 1000 tons wheat under this project, he further added.

He stated that CARE was renting three Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation (BADC) warehouses in Chittagong with a total capacity of 3,000 tons as part of its programme. It was also purchasing ten low-lift pumps to clean out contaminated ponds, he maintained.

CARE will participate in the task of constructing multipurpose shelter centres in the cyclone-battered areas of the said districts, said Johnston adding that such shelter centres would be used for schools and health complexes.

He said he had detailed discussion with Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, concerning the erectment of multipurpose buildings.

It will take time to assess of how many buildings will be re-

quired the entire area," he

pointed out. Robin Needham, CARE Bangladesh Chief told the press conference that CARE had compiled a damage assessment in Dhalghata union of Moheshkhali upazila where it is working now.

According to the assessment, six among 11 thousand peoples of the union died, 97 percent of the areas with 1,300 houses were washed away, 90 percent of cattlehead have been lost while three salt finilis were destroyed fully.

CARE will also provide emergency relief goods including 61 tons of high protein biscuits, 5,000 (one) litre bags of IV saline 860,000 essential drugs and 8,600 cotton blankets to the cyclone victims, Robin added.


