The match will start from 5 pm with the second match beginning at 7 pm.

teams. Top club teams from Jordan, Oman, China, Indonesia, Iran North Korea, Thailand and Bangladesh — will participate in the final round of the championship.

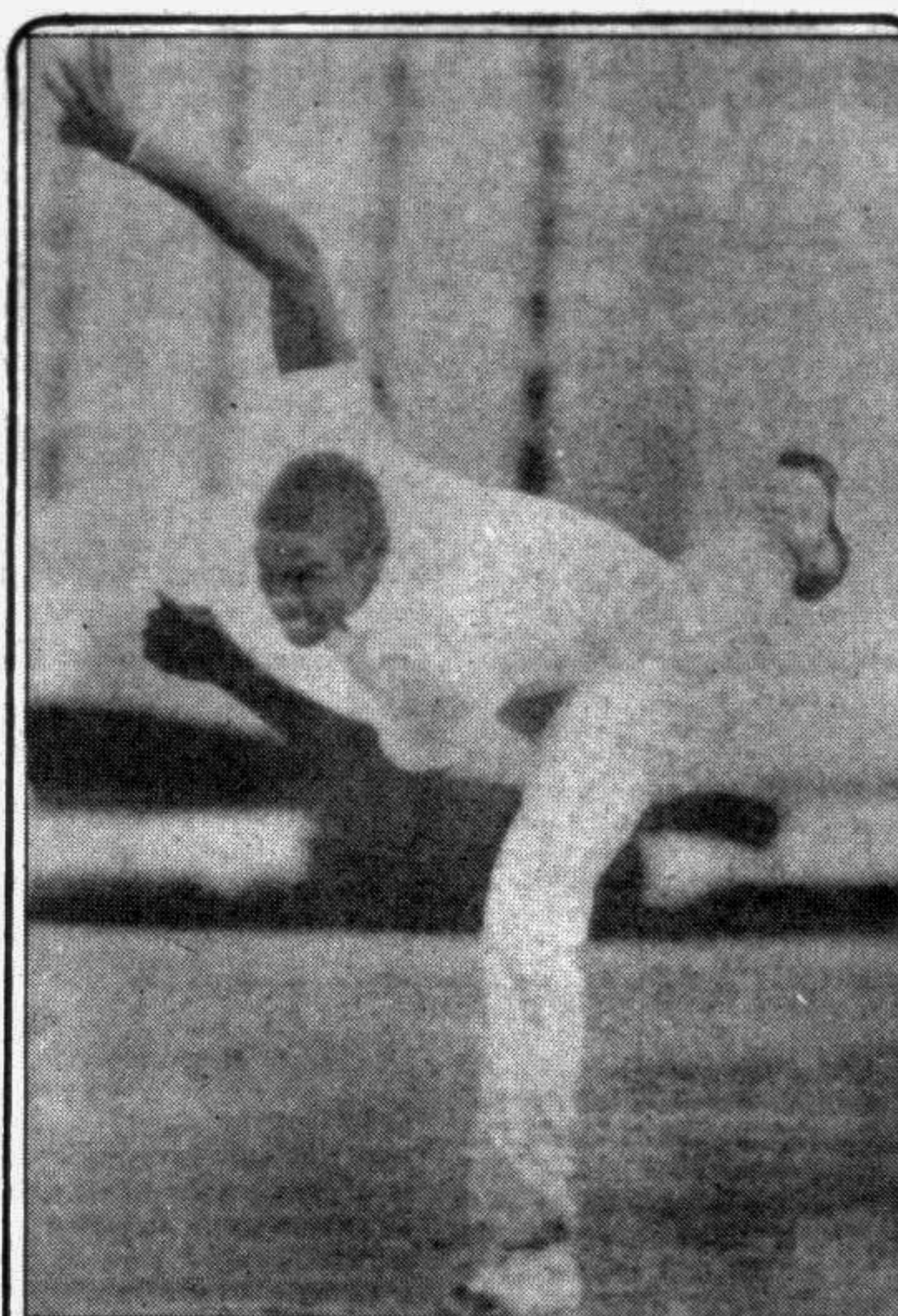

## Patterson scuttles cream of crops

LONDON, May 19: Fast bowler Patrick Patterson took five wickets but did not have things all his own way on the opening day of West Indies' three-day cricket match against Middlesex at Lord's on Saturday, reports Reuter.

Opener Ian Hutchinson took 14 runs off the big Jamaican's first over and he later came in for punishment during a lively last wicket stand of 48 in 33 deliveries between Norman Cowans (35) and Phil Tufnell (14 not out).

Patterson's first four overs of the day cost 31 runs but he hit back by dismissing four of the top five batsmen and ended with five for 88 as Middlesex were all out for 275.

LONDON, May 19: Pakistan Test star Salim Malik hammered a career-best 173 to lift Essex to a mammoth 544 in their English country championship match against Kent on Saturday, reports AFP.

## Jt Korean team named

# Walker mistake costs Forest Cup

LONDON, May 19: Nottingham Forest's England defender Des Walker headed into his own net in extra time to give FA Cup final victory to Tottenham Hotspur at Wembley on Saturday, reports AFP.

The 2-1 win was a spectacular end of an era at the financially troubled London club who could lose England stars Paul Gascoigne and Gary Lineker and manager Terry

Venables in the next few weeks.

Spurs fought back from going one down after only 17 minutes following a moment of madness by Gascoigne. Forest captain Stuart Pearce blasted home a 25 yard free kick resulting from a clumsy challenge by Gascoigne on Gary

Gascoigne was injured in the tussle and was stretched off moments after the kick off from Pearce's 16th goal of the season.

Despite his action in nearly giving the game away, a tearful Gascoigne was given a standing ovation from his fans.

He was taken to hospital with suspected knee ligament trouble that will not please his prospective Italian employers Lazio.

Gascoigne had looked at bursting point after the game started with the Wembley pressure obviously getting to him.

When the players were introduced to the Princess of Wales, Gascoigne brought a huge cheer by getting down on his knees and kissing her hand.

But he gave way a first foul in the first minute when a silly lunge that could have cost him a booking brought down Gary

Pearce's goal spurred Tottenham though, who seemed determined to deny Forest manager Brian Clough his first FA Cup win in 25

years.

The encounter was a classic FA Cup final topped off with Paul Stewart's second half equaliser after Lineker had one goal disallowed and a penalty saved.

Lineker was unlucky to have a 22nd minute shot from the six yard line disallowed by referee Roger Milford for offside.

Paul Allen hit the ball across from the right and Lineker looked to have come from behind the defence.

Milford blew up but television replays showed the England captain may have been harshly punished.

On 34 minutes, Lineker was given a penalty after he was brought down by Forest keeper Mark Crossley as he raced clear with only Crossley to beat.

But Crossley saved Lineker's shot and the England captain became only the second player to miss a penalty at a Wembley FA Cup final.

The equaliser eventually came 10 minutes into the second half.

Allen raced through the Forest midfield put through Stewart on the right hand side. The 1.7 million pound signing sent a powerful shot across the face of the goal, but Crossley's dive was in vain.

It was Stewart's first goal since getting the winner for Spurs in the third round against Blackpool in January.

Crossley made a spectacular save from a David Howells

header in the dying seconds and the match went into extra time.

Spurs continued to pile on the pressure in the first session of the extended match.

After only four minutes Paul Walsh looped a header onto the Forest crossbar and Crossley needed treatment after falling onto the post.

Seconds later a Spurs corner saw panic in the Forest defence and Walker, who has never scored for his club, headed the ball into his own net under pressure from Spurs skipper Gary Moubutt.

Both sides looked tired and struggled through the remaining 25 minutes.

But Lineker and Venables were able to show their joy as the final whistle went.

Lineker is known to be angry because he has been touted around European clubs behind his back as Spurs seek money to ease their off the field worries.

Venables may have at last won something with the club he has said he will leave if his takeover bid fails.
