A regional workshop on *public information of food irradiation' concluded in Bankok on Saturday recommending dissemination of information about safety and benefits of eating irradiated foods to protect the rights and interests of the consumers, a message received in Dhaka,

reports BSS. The workshop held the opinion that the people were over saturated with information on the harmful effects of nuclear radiation which created some psychological barrier in their minds against use of irradiated foods, which were not harmful.

It felt the need for public information campaign to counteract any undue fear of irradiation technology caused by "lack of information or dissemination misinformation."

Organised by UNDP, FAO and IAEA, the week-long workshop was participated by 15 journalists and consumer group leaders from 10 countries of South-East Asian region including Bangladesh. The other countries represented,

Irradiated food safe for human health

were Pakistan, Sri Lanka, the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, South Korea, China, Japan and the host country

Bangladesh is setting up a multipurpose demonstration irradiation plant in Chittagong which would irradiate frozen shrimps and sea food, fresh water fish, dry fish, potato, foodgrains, pulses, onions, different fruits, vegetables. pharmaceutical products. medical and family planning kits. It is expected to go into commercial operation by the end of this year.

Irradiation is a technique where food items are exposed to very low dose of nuclear radiation to prevent rotting, sprouting, pest infestation and growth of microorganisms.

The workshop was unani-

mous that labelling of irradiated products along with the radiation dose given should be mandatory to ensure free choice of the consumers. Labelling was also necessary so that irradiated products could not enter the market without knowledge of the government and the consumers, it ob-

It emphasised the need for proper packaging, storage and distribution of the irradiated products to prevent decontamination after irradiation was

Thai Minister for Science. Technology and Energy, Prof Dr Sanga Sabhasri in his opening remarks at the workshop said adequate information on the health and safety aspect of irradiated foods should be disseminated among the peo-

ple as he observed "the antiirradiation activists play on the lack of knowledge and fear of the consumers."

Assistant Director General and Asia Pacific Regional representative of FAO, A Z M Obaidullah Khan in his statement at the opening session of the workshop said food irradiation was now an established technique in reducing perishability through spout inhibition as well as reduction in mould, bacterial and insect contamination of food items. He said it was now important to demonstrate how these benefits manifest themselves.

According to a FAO report, bacteria and insects are destroying about 20 per cent of crops in the world each year, leading to billions of dollars worth of economic loss,


whereas nearly 15 per cent of the world population were not getting enough food, he said.

Khan said FAO would continue its effort to promote proven and reliable processes of food preservation including the irradiation technique to improve the quality for the benefits of the member na-

Experts at the workshop said enough experiments had been made on animals over several decades on the wholesomeness and nutritional values of irradiated food items and their safety, on the basis of which it was scientifically established that irradiated foods were safe for human

Worldwide, 37 countries including Bangladesh have approved irradiation for treating one or more food items for quarantine and other purposes. 47 commercial irradiation plants are in operation in 24 countries. More than 20 multipurpose irradiation facilities are under construction in various countries and it is expected that in the next few
