

1.50 lakh tons wheat for FWP allocated

The Government has allocated about 1,50,000 metric tons of wheat for an extensive "Food for Work Programme" in the cyclone battered and flood affected areas of the country.

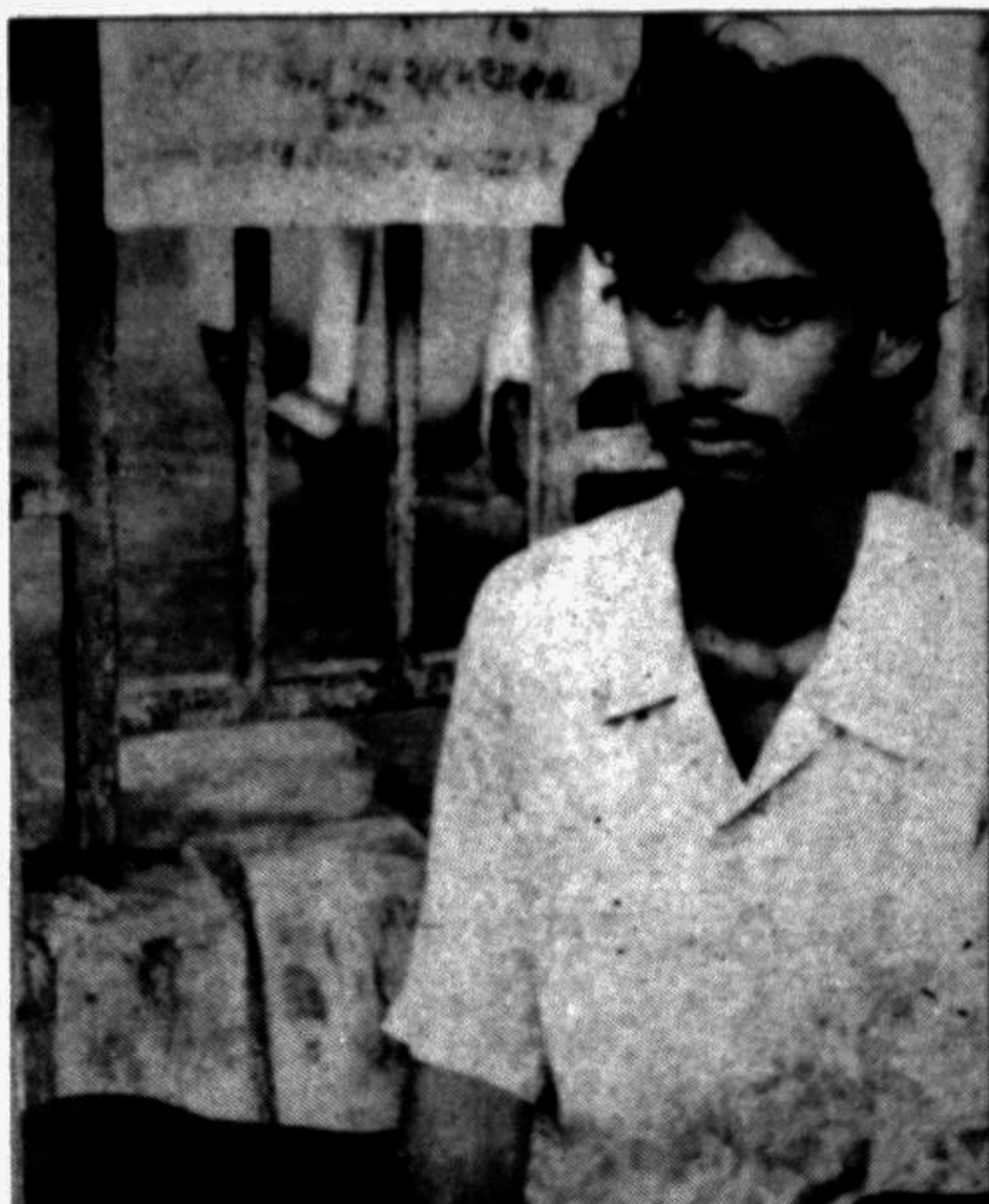
An official of the Ministry of Relief told UNB Tuesday that test relief works under the programme have already begun across the natural calamities-ravaged parts of the country.

He said the government was undertaking relief and rehabilitation works in the cyclone-struck areas in three phases. These will be implemented with assistances in addition to those provided from the Prime Minister's Relief Fund, friendly countries and international agencies.

In the already-completed first phase, he added, foodstuff and cash money were distributed among the cyclone victims under the short-term programme.

In the second phase, building materials including CI sheets and cash money are being provided to the cyclone survivors, the official said.

He informed that long-term rehabilitation programme will be taken after the submission of reports by the Task Force headed by Planning Commission Mustafizur Rahman.

Removal of CU V-C demanded: strike on

CHITTAGONG, June 4: Classes at Chittagong University could not be held for the third consecutive day today as Islami Chhatra Shibir continued to enforce strike to press for removal of Vice Chancellor Prof. Alamgir Mohammad Strajuddin, reports UNB.

Sangrami Chhatra Otkya, a platform of Shibir and its allies, today extended their strike for another 48-hour from today (Wednesday).

Striking students brought out processions and held gatherings in the campus during today's strike hours. They also staged a four-hour sit-in in front of the VC's residence from 9 am.

Shibir workers also forced to postpone a scheduled meeting of the syndicate which was due to be held at the University Club this afternoon. The Club is situated in the Chittagong town.

Witnesses said that about 100 striking students drove to the meeting venue from the campus at 4 pm and surrounded the University Club.

Police intervened, but the authorities postponed the meeting to avoid untoward incident. This is for the second time Shibir forced to postpone the syndicate meeting.

The growing unrest also made uncertain the holding of Senate election scheduled on Thursday as the Chittagong University Teachers Association (CUTA) continued its class-boycott programme since June 2 demanding removal of the VC.

Meanwhile, CUCSU Vice-President Nazimuddin and General Secretary Azimuddin in a joint statement today lashed out at Shibir for vitiating the academic atmosphere in the campus through repeated strikes.

The campus has been tense and most residential students excepting the Shibir activists left halls, the campus sources said.

Amidst continuing unrest, the sources said, the Vice-Chancellor was reportedly staying outside the campus for the last four days.

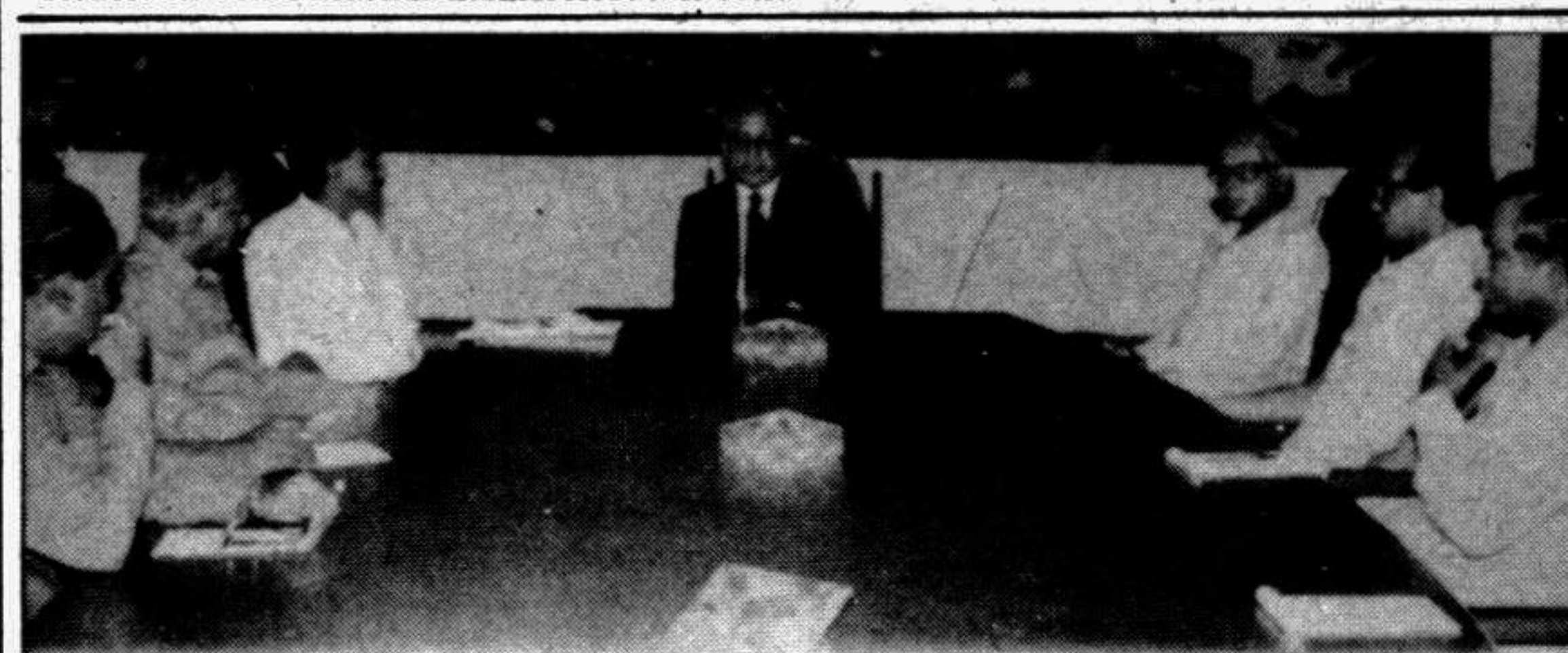
