

Weather signalling system fails to gauge storm intensity

Present weather signalling system operative in the country does not indicate exact intensity of the storm and tidal surge.

This was stated by an eminent space research scientist Dr A M Chowdhury in an interview with United News of Bangladesh (UNB) on Monday.

"The cyclone warning system prevalent in the country based on signal numbers upto 10 is rather cumbrous and is not in practice in any part of the world", he said.

Dr Chowdhury said, "Satellite study of tropical cyclones has revealed their complex character. Present classification of cyclones and severe cyclones does not depict its intensity."

He suggested adoption of classification of tropical cyclones based on satellite and aircraft reconnaissance. In order to make the cyclone warning system easily understandable to common
