Slovenia, Croatia declare freedom

LJUBLJANA, June 26: The republics of Slovenia and Croatia declared independence from Yugoslavia Tuesday, report agencies.

adopted a proclamation of independence under which it will take over all functions of the Yugoslav state on its soil and gradually sever all ties with Yugoslavia.

Earlier, the Yugoslav parliament appealed to the army to prevent the break-up of the federation of more than 23 million people.

The parliament of Slovenia and Croatia proclaimed independence to thunderous applause and cheers on Tuesday. declaring they were "dissociating" from Yugoslavia and bringing to an end the united federation after 72 troubled years.

The federal government, representing all six constituent republics and two provinces, responded rapidly.

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia caps 100 days in office today (Thursday) appearing firmly in control of the state of affairs, leading the country's fledgling democratic government, reports UNB.

Can she lead this nation through the turbulent political course and economic morass?

This was the big question posed by many when 100 days ago she was appointed Prime Minister by Acting President Shahabuddin Ahmed who did so because of her party's majority in Parliament.

Once an ordinary housewife. Begum Zia was thrust into politics after the tragic assassination of her husband late President Ziaur Rahman in the brutal putsch of 1981.
