

LUXEMBOURG, June 30: European Community (EC) leaders said on Saturday that completion of the troubled Uruguay Round of world trade negotiations by the end of the year was top priority requiring tough policy decision, reports

But the final communique from their two-day summit did not mention reform of the EC's controversial common agricultural policy (CAP) which the US and other agricultural exporting countries have said is the main obstacle to an agreement in the negotiations aimed at sweeping away world trade barriers.

"The European Council (summit) considers the Uruguay Round to be the first priority in international economic relations and stresses the importance of concluding these negotiations before the end of this year."

"If a balanced agreement covering all areas is to be reached within that period important policy decisions will have to be taken without delay," the 12 leaders said in a communique.

Education Minister Dr Badruddoza Chowdhury told the Parliament on Sunday that rate of drop-outs at the primary level was 66.06 per cent every year.

The Minister also said that nearly 1.15 crore children get admission into the primary schools every year. This is about 78 per cent of the total school-going children.

North Sea oil output declines

LONDON, June 30: The effects of maintenance and safety work cut north sea oil production to its lowest level in two years in May, according to economists at Royal Bank of Scotland, reports AFP.

May output was down by nearly nine per cent on the previous month and its daily value of 16.2 million Pounds was down by approximately half from last September. when the Gulf crisis sent prices to a peak of just under 40 Dollars a barrel.

EC-Japan accord on joint declaration

He added France's stand was now the only factor threatening a planned signature when Japanese Premier Toshiki Kaifu visits the Hague after the London economic summit of the world's seven richest countries in July.
