BUET teachers' strike from Saturday

The Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology Teachers' Association (BUETTA) has called for a strike for indefinite period from Saturday next protesting the alleged anomaly in recruiting a Professor in the Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) Department.

In a meeting on Wednesday at the BUET the BUETTA expressed resentment at the "manipulation and distortions" of rules in appointing Dr Syed Mahbubur Rahman as a Professor in CSE Department.

The meeting presided over by Dr Aminul Haq, Acting President of BUETTA, demanded withdrawal of the decision immediately and appointment an "eligible" person through a fresh advertisement. The BUETTA also demanded formation of a probe body to enquire into the alleged irregularities and exemplary punishment for the persons responsible.

Dainik Shakti sued

Director of M M Ispahani Ltd Mirza Ali Behrouze Ispahani has filed a case with Bangladesh Press Council against Dainik Shakti for publishing "objectionable" reports, a press release of the Council said Thursday, reports UNB.

It alleged that the daily published an "objectionable and untrue" report titled "Speculations about Singapore conspiracy in the political and diplomatic circles" and an editorial titled "Singapore conspiracy and the Acting President" on June 9 last in order to be little the complainant socially and commercially.

All-party committee to prepare budget suggested

Speakers at a seminar on "Budget 1991-92" stressed the need for a national consensus on basic economic issues and policies of the country.

The two-day seminar organised by Jatiya Birtarka Manch (national debate forum) at the TSC auditorium on Wednesday was addressed by Mahmudur Rahman Manna, Hasanul Huq Inu, Pankaj Bhattacharya, Dr Ajay Roy, Dr MM Akash, Dr Mahbub Hossain and Khorsheed Alam with Dr Wahiduddin

Mahmud in chair. The key-note papers of the seminar were read out by Dr Selim Jahan and Najmuddin Mostan.

JSD leader Hasanul Huq Inu said the country had become a haven of corruption, irregularities and mismanagement. The economic crisis that aggravated in the decade-long autocratic regime, could only be solved by an all-party committee for preparing budget and economic policies of

the country, he suggested. Criticising different parts of the budget 1991-92 Janata Mukti Party leader Mahmudur Rahman said the most controversial Value Added Tax (VAT) brought good results to the economy of many countries, but as our administration was defective and inefficient it would bring us no good.

NAP leader Pankaj Bhattacharya said this budget was prepared at the behest of 'world capitalism' and there was nothing new in comparison with the previous budgets, prepared by the autocratic regime.

Dr Agay Roy said despite all limitations of our national assets a better budget could be prepared by proper utilisation of those. He said an open discussion should have been held before the budget for overcoming its shortcomings.

Dr M M Akash stressed the need for exercising democracy among the politicians in order to overcome all crises. He said our budget was completely dependent on the aid and debt of donor countries and World Bank. But many of their good suggestions were not followed.

Withdrawal of VAT from small industries urged

Different small and cottage industries on Thursday demanded withdrawal of Value Added Tax (VAT) imposed on their commodities.

VAT Protahar Sammilita Otkya Jote (combined alliance for the withdrawal of VAT) in a press conference at Jatiya Press Club said the items they produce were earlier exempted from excise duty but now face grim future for imposition of VAT.

Convener of the alliance, which comprise 11 industries, Abu Motalab, said the VAT will take the prices of the products beyond the buying capacity of the poor who are the principal consumer of the products.

He said the industries will ultimately close down. Most of the small industries do not have the capability to maintain record for VAT.

The members of the alliance include Bangladesh PP Polythene Industries Associ-

ation, Rubber Industries Association, Footwear Manufacturing Association, Drycell Manufacturing Association, Melamine Manufacturing Association, Sports Shoe Manufacturing Association and PVC Compound Manufacturers.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Enamel Manufacturers and Sellers Association in a press conference on Thursday also demanded the withdrawal of VAT from items which were earlier exempted from excise duty.

Moazzem Hossain Khan, Convener of the Association, said about 27 enamel factories have already been closed down since July 10 rendering ten lakh workers jobless. He said the factories will remain closed until their demands are met. He declared that the Association will go into greater movement including gheraoing the minister's residence to press home their demand.

Dateline Chittagong

1,600 tribal rebels surrender so far

CHITTAGONG, July 11: So far about 1600 tribal rebels known as "Shanti Bahini" surrendered to military forces.

An official source reported today that those tribal insurgents surrendered themselves separately to army outposts located at insurgency town in Chittagong hill districts.

Among them 52 persons surrendered over the past six months period. Most of them surrendered with arms and returned to normal life. The

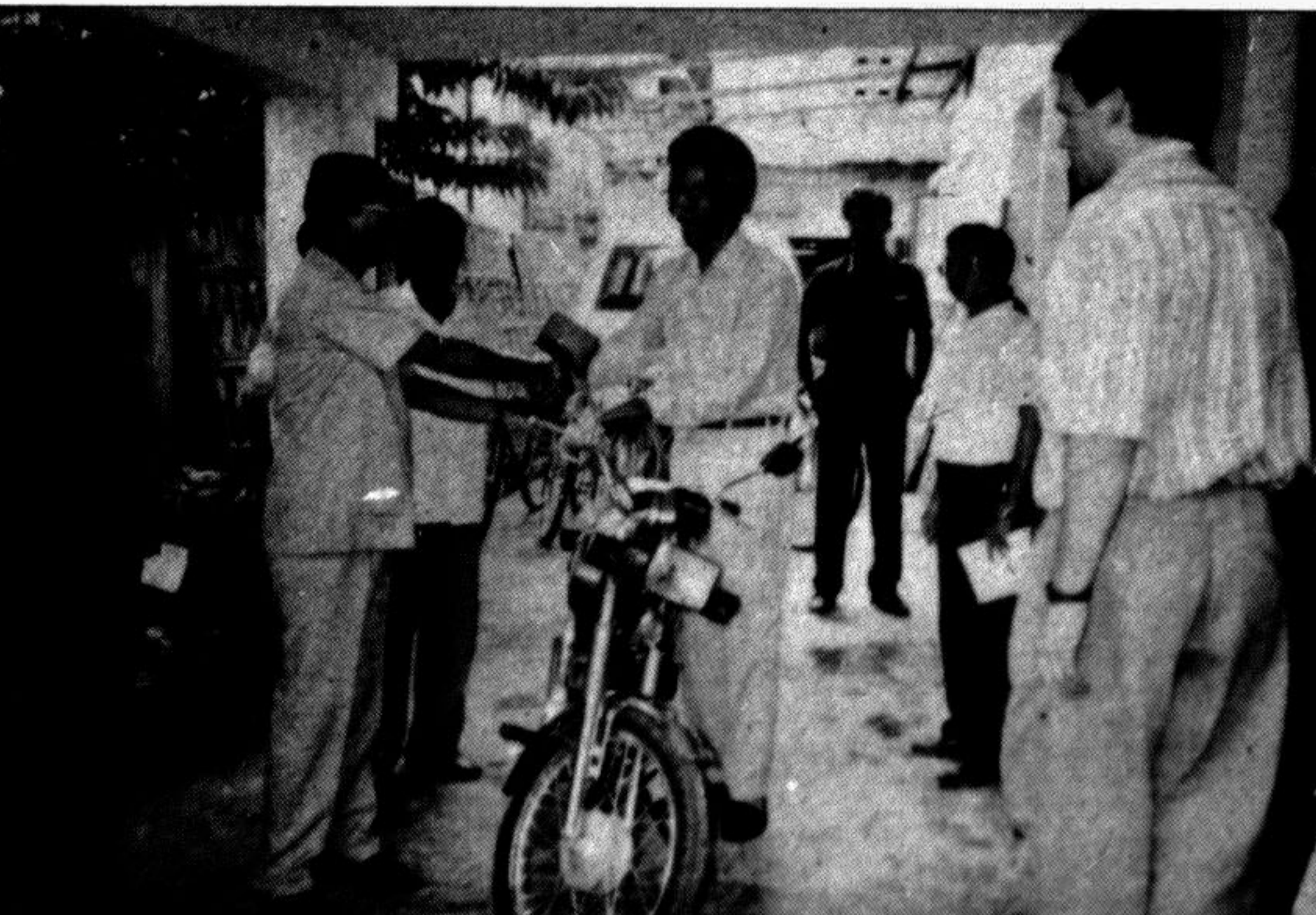
source added, a bulk of tribal rebels numbering 235 belonging to "Pariti" faction surrendered with arms in 1985 taking advantage of general amnesty declared by the three government. But another group known as "Larma" faction continued their fight and a large number of them laid down their arms at various times. About 5000 insurgents have been waiting since 18-year insurgency in Chittagong hill tracts for provincial autonomy.
