River erosion takes serious turn

July 11: River erosion in Barisal and Bhola districts, which already washed away many villages, is feared to take a serious turn as rainfall intensified, réports UNB.

Thousands of families have been rendered homeless due to continuous erosion of the river Kirtonkhola in Charkana and Charmonai unions of the district. Hundreds of acres of cultivable land have also been devoured by the river.

In Bhola, at least 600 families were made homeless in Ilisha, Gazipur, Gangarampur, Kachia, Shibpur, Dhunia and Nazirpur areas along the Meghna and Tetulia rivers. Erosion engulfed at least 200 acres of land in these areas.

Hundreds of displaced families have taken shelter on the embankment and are living without any relief materials, according to sources.
