He recalled the contributions of late Ruhul Amin Bhuiyan stating that he had always fought for establishing rights of the working people.

Chairman of the Mukti Joddha Sangsad Mahfuzur Rahman said Ruhul Amin dedicated his life for the workers but the condition of workers had not improved since liberation.

Among other Trade Union leaders Mujibul Haq, Hareesh, Kauser, Babul Shaheer, Abul Hal Bhasani and Advocate Golam Kibria spoke at the meeting.

**VAT to create anarchism in economy : SKSD**

Sramik Krishak Samajbadi Dal (SKSD) Friday called upon the government to withdraw Value Added Tax (VAT) from all heads excepting imported items, reports BSS.

A central committee meeting of the party held at its office with Acting First Secretary Nirmal Sen in the chair observed that the indiscriminate introduction of VAT would create adverse reactions in the country's economy.

The meeting observed that as the government had no systematic control over market prices the imposition of VAT would increase process of essentials beyond the purchasing capacity of the common people.

The meeting opined that the VAT was a modern system and only applicable for industrially developed countries.

The meeting opined that the introduction of VAT would create anarchism in country's national economy.

Among others, party leader Siddiqur Rahman, Amirul Islam, Khurshid Alam, and ABM Faruque took part in the discussion.

**Transfer of environmental know-how stressed**

A two-day environment congress of the Asia Pacific region held in Tokyo, Japan on July 4 and 5 last emphasised the need for transfer of appropriate and environment friendly technology to developing countries.

The congress, attended by a total of 70 delegates from the countries of the region, opined that extension of financial assistance to the developing countries was urgent for strengthening environment protection measures.

Dr. Harunur Rashid, Additional Secretary in charge of the Ministry of Environment and Forests represented Bangladesh in the congress which also called for coordinated efforts of all to halt global warming.

A Ministry of Environment Press release said the congress in its declaration observed that population, poverty and environment were interlinked. The declaration said human development efforts should be the prime target of all future programmes with a view to ensuring sustainable development.

**PDB activities cause hardship to villagers : REB**

The Palli Bidyut Samities Friday called upon the government to take effective steps to hand over all the power distribution lines in the rural areas to the Rural Electrification Board (REB) by July 31, reports BSS.

Abdul Mannan, President of Moulvibazar Palli Bidyut Samity (PBS) in a statement on behalf of 43 PBS of the country fervently appealed to the democratic government not to delay the implementation of this.

Mannan reminded that late President Ziaur Rahman, the initiator of Rural Electrification Programme had earmarked that all areas of the country except four metropolitan towns to be brought under Rural Electrification Board. He said the hopes and aspiration of the vast majority of the people remained unfulfilled because of the non-implementation of this pro-people programme by past autocratic regime.

Referring to the activities of a section of PDB employees in the delay handling the rural distribution lines, Mr Mannan said their actions were causing hardship to the village people. He cautioned that this heinous action could not go unchallenged.

Mannan claimed that as a result of better functioning, a number of samities are supplying power to the consumers at lesser cost than PDB charges. He opined that real development of the country would be possible only when the electricity was distributed at cheaper rates through PBS in vast rural areas.

Replying to a question from Mohammad Abdus Sobhan (Jamaat-Pabna), Sarkar told the House that Taka 9,64,08,892 was spent for installation of electric fittings while Taka 3,62,73,101 was spent for completing electric works of the President Secretariat.

Giving further details of the expenditure, the State Minister informed the House that out of the Taka 9,64,08,892 spent for International Conference Centre, Taka 1,91,77,307 was required for procurement and installation of internal electrification, kitchen equipment, water cooler and fire fighting tools, Taka 4,56,75,590 for

**Congenial academic atmosphere stressed**

CHITTAGONG, July 12 : State Minister for Environment and Forest, Fisheries and Livestock Abdullah-Al Noman Thursday said the present government under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia is determined to rehabilitate the affected people of cyclone and tidal surge of April 29, reports BSS.

He said special programme on emergency basis would be taken to rehabilitate the affected fishermen community and also every poor widow and women-fold of Bakalia in Chittagong city.

He was addressing a spontaneous gathering at Bakalia here.

The State Minister, earlier exchanged views with the student leaders of Chittagong University and city area.

He stressed the need for maintaining congenial atmosphere in the educational institutions.

He called upon the students to sink differences among themselves, to create suitable educational atmosphere.

He also held a meeting with the student of Chittagong Medical College.

**Smuggled wood seized**

A ship of the Bangladesh Navy during its routine patrol Thursday seized five boats from the coast of Kutubdia with about 5,000 cft of smuggled teak (segun) wood worth about Taka 50 lakh, according to an ISPR press release Friday, reports BSS.

The BN personnel also arrested 30 crew members of the boats. The boats are being escorted to Chittagong harbour for handing them over to the appropriate authorities.

Sarak is making the film "Thikana", basing its story on campus violence and how it destroys life of a student.

**Ultimatum to withdraw VAT**

Bangladesh Inter-Association VAT withdrawal Sangram Committee comprising 13 small and cottage industries associations on Friday said they would launch a joint movement for withdrawal of VAT from July 16.

Speaking at a press conference at Jatiya Press Club the Convenor of the committee, Alauddin Ahmed said they would not pay any tax until the VAT is withdrawn.

He said the VAT Bill passed in the Parliament was misleading.

Moreover, the system will imbalance prices of the same product for industries of under Tk three lakh and over Tk three lakh. As such, he said, the VAT exemption will not apply to smaller industries.

Alauddin said, most of the small industries can not import raw materials. They have to buy it from wholesalers. The wholesalers are not selling them raw materials with receipts to evade VAT, he added. This is the reason for which small industries can not enjoy the facility of VAT exemption on raw materials after production, he pointed out.

**Move to strengthen BNP city unit**

The city unit of Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), in an emergency meeting of Presidents and General Secretaries of the Thana branches of the unit Thursday evening, has undertaken massive programmes to further strengthen the organization, reports BSS.
