Tk 10 cr agri rehabilitation programme

July 24: The government has taken up a rehabilitation programme in the agriculture sector during this season involving an amount of Taka 10 crore, reports UNB.

According to sources, small and marginal farmers of 117 upazilas of 18 districts and two thanas of Chittagong district will come under the programme.

It is learnt that in the first phase of the scheme, a total of Taka 6.50 crore will be spent for providing Aus seedlings. vegetable seeds and fertilizers.

The rest amount of Taka 3.50 crore will be spent in the second phase of the programme to supply power tillers, agri-equipment, saplings of fruit-bearing trees and for saving land from salinity and distribution of power pumps for irrigation.

The district-wise break up of the first phase allocation is: Chittagong district - Taka 166.76 lakh, Cox's Bazar -Taka 96.94 lakh, Noakhali-Taka 39.47 lakh, Luxmipur — Tk 29.67 lakh, Feni -Tk 19.38 lakh, Rangamati -Tk 29,73 lakh, Khagrachhari - Tk 19.74 lakh, Bandarban - Tk 20.75 lakh, Chandpur - Tk 6.31 lakh, Bhola -Tk 108.88 lakh, Patuakhali — Tk 28.89 lakh. Barguna — Taka 24.88 lakh, Barisal — Tk 30.79 lakh. Pirojpur - Tk 15.46 lakh, Jhalakatht -Tk 6.52 lakh. Khulna — Tk 1.13 lakh Bagerhat - Tk 1.40 lakh and Satkhira - Tk 3.30 lakh.

The Agriculture Extension Department, responsible for the implementation of the programme, will also execute the scheme in Panchlais and Double Mooring thanas of Chittagong district.

33,000 acres to be put under aman farming July 24: A scheme has been

undertaken to bring 33,000 acres of land under intensive transplanted Aman cultivation in four upazilas of the district during the current season, reports UNB. According to Agriculture

Extension Department, 25,000 acres of land will be brought under high-yielding variety, 1000 acres under Paijam and the rest 7000 acres under local varieties.

A number of demonstration plots have also been set up to acquaint the farmers with the modern methods of cultivation. Bangladesh Agriculture

Development Corporation has supplied seeds, fertilizers and other necessary inputs among the farmers to make the scheme a success.

With the implementation of the scheme, it is expected that at least 45,000 metric tons of aman paddy will be produced in the upazilas, it is learnt.

2 shot dead

July 24: Gunmen shot dead two members of a family and injured another Saturday midnight at village Kalamkhali in the Sadar upazila, police said, reports UNB.

The dead were identified as Shukur Mondal (50) and his nephew Isratl Hossain (16), a van driver. The injured was named Abdul Wahab(25), son of Shukur Mondal.

Witnesses said outlawed Sarbahara Party cadres kidnapped Abdul Wahab at gunpoint from his residence. His father and cousin accompanied by villagers rushed to rescue him. Wahab managed to escape, but his father and cousin were gunned down.

Shukur died on the spot and Israil succumbed to injuries at the Sadar hospital.

The bodies were sent for autopsy, and a case was filed in this connection.

Eight people have been killed in the district during the last 15 days in feuds between two underground political parties - Sarbahara Party and Biplobi Communist Party.

Police said none could be arrested. BETAGI

Health complex in disarray

July 24: Betagi upazila health complex has been plagued with manifold problems causing much inconveniences to the patients, reports UNB.

Scarcity of medicines, pure water supply, shortage of diet and absence of ambulance have aggravated the situation in the health complex.

Everyday a large number of patients are coming from far flung areas seeking treatment but most of them go back disappointed.

The health complex has no segregation ward. As a result the patients with infectious diseases are accommodated in the general ward.

About 30 to 50 patients are crammed in the tiny labour ward threatening health and sanitation of the pregnant mothers.

It is alleged that in the absence of surgical instruments number of critical patients died in the complex during the last few months.

The diet supplied to the patients of the health complex is quite inadequate and at times unfit for human consumption, it is alleged.

Besides, doctors, patients and other staff of the health complex are facing acute prob lems due to irregular water

Local people have urged the authorities to take immediate steps to solve the long-standing problems of the complex.

BKB to distribute Tk 60 cr agri-loan

July 24: Bangladesh Krishi Bank (BKB) will distribute Taka 60 crore agri-loan among the farmers of eleven southern districts during the current financial year, reports UNB.

Bank sources said under the lending programme. Taka 30.85 crore will be disbursed as short-term loan and Taka 29.15 crore as long-term loan in Patuakhali, Barguna, Pirojpur, Jhalakati, Barisal, Bhola, Madaripur, Shariatpur, Gopalganj, Rajbari and

Faridpur districts. Cultivation of rabi crops. processing and marketing of agricultural products, piscicul ture and distribution of fertil izer will be included in the short-term loan disbursement programme.

The long-term loan will be given for buying irrigation equipment, cattle rearing, pisciculture, agro-based industries and for increasing betel leaf production.

14 get life-term for murder

BAGERHAT, July 24: Mr. Md Alauddin Sardar, District and Sessions Judge of Bagerhat while passing his judgement in the sensational Abdul Kader murder case found 14 persons including two commissioners of Mongla Pourasava guilty and sentenced them to suffer rigorous imprisonment for life and to pay a fine of Tk. 5,000 each in default to suffer rigorous imprisonment for one year more. Five accused persons were acquitted of the charge brought against them

The prosecution case, in brief, is that at about 10-30 am on November 19, 1987 workers of different organisations of Mongla Sea Port brought out a procession at Mongla town to press home their demands. But with the instigation of the Secretary of Mongla Port Workers Association the accused persons attacked the procession with axes, knives. sticks and other deadly weapons, killed Abdul Kader, a watchman of Mongla Port and injured six others. The matter was immedi-

ately brought to the notice of Mongla police. After registration of a case in this regard police held an enquiry and submitted a chargesheeted to the court against 19 persons.
