# RU closed sine die as gunbattle rocks campus

RAJSHAHI, July 26: Rajshahi University was closed sine die Friday following nightlong fierce gunbattle between activists of JCD and Chhatra Oikya Parishad that left at last 75 students injured, 21 with

A total of 125 rooms were also ransacked and set ablaze during the clashes that spread to seven residential halls during which the activists traded at least 500 rounds of fire and

cocktails. Deafening sounds of blasts were also heard that rocked the university campus and pancked the people of surrounding areas.

The 21 persons with bullet injuries were taken to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital. Seriously injured students were Mamun, Alauddin, Ali Ashrai Peer, Hashib, Kashem, Shaheen, Pias, Goni, Shanti, Uzzal and Ratan.

At around 6 am, the Vice-Chancellor Prof Amanullah Ahmed called an emergency meeting of the Syndicate which closed the university sine die, asked students to vacate the halls by 12 noon and deferred subsidiary examinations. Students vacated the

halls as directed. Provosts of different halls told The Daily Star that police did not come to the aid of the authorities during the clash.

Police came at 5-30 am and dispersed the clashing students by firing shots and tear-

The total loss due to the June 19 explosion at the Ghorasal Urea Fertilizer Factory will be Taka 250 crore.

The Toyo Engineering Corporation of Japan is to take the responsibility for the accident since it took place when Toyo was putting the factory under a trial operation. Industries Minister Shamsul Islam Khan said Friday.

The Minister told a news conference that the Chorasal Urea Fertilizer Factory ((GFF) had been turned into a losing concern by subjecting it to an

upgradation project opposed by the Planning Commission and the National Economic

Making public a report of a high-powered three-member inquiry committee on the accident at a news conference, he said that those who had done this by disregarding administrative procedures de-

served exemplary punishment. The explosion took place when production in the factory was about to be resumed following the completion of the Taka 350 crore revamping

project which, experts claim, was not needed at least before

The accident occurred as a 'carbon dioxide stripper' gave in to gas pressure, leaving II dead and 27 others injured. Loss in terms of equipment, production, and compensation for the deaths was estimated at Taka 25 crore.

A new production process called 'Advanced Cost and Energy Saving (ACES) which was to be installed under the project has been postponed for See Page 10 Col. 7

MOSCOW, July Soviet communists today backed President Mikhail Gorbachev's radical new programme which jettisons much of the party's Marxist legacy. but conservatives said the party could still split later this year, reports agencies.

Delegates to a plenary session of the party Central Committee said the meeting passed a resolution considering the draft programme "an acceptable basis for further

They said only a few dozen members of the 412 member

body voted against the resolution turning the document over to a commission and calling for it to be considered at a party congress later in the President Gorbachev vowed

Friday to do what is necessary to reverse Russian President Boris Yeltsin's edict abolishing Communists Party's means of control in Russian factories, schools and offices.

Gorbachev, speaking on the second day of a Central Committee meeting in the Kremlin, said he would issue a presidential decree if needed

to annul Yeltsin's order dismantling Communist Party cells throughout the Russian Federation, the largest of the 15 Soviet republics. He said the

Central Committee plenum had been deluged with mail protesting the abolishment of party cells, the mechanism that has allowed the ruling Communists to keep tight control on workers, teachers and government The 410-member Central

sion to draft a resolution con-

demning Yeltsin's decree.


