**Hiroshima tragedy to inspire
all to fight against war**

Speakers at a discussion in Dhaka Thursday evening called for an united and integrated thrust for consolidating national independence, durable peace and social justice to make the world free from threat of war and destruction, reports BSS.

Organised by 'Kathak Academy' in observance of Hiroshima and International peace day, the function was held at the conference room of the National Sports Council.

Ms Christine Sporel, Assistant Resident Representative of UNDP here, Mohammad Ishaque, Second Secretary of Indonesian Embassy in Bangladesh and Abdul Haq Meah, Director, Youth Deve-

lopment Department attended the discussion as special guests.

Academy Director General Abul Kashem presided.

Recalling the unprecedented havoc and loss of so many lives of the beautiful cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, the speakers observed that the tragic memories of that devastating incident of human history would inspire the mankind to fight against war and work for peace.

They said, the Hiroshima and Nagasaki tragedy would inspire all of us to work for sustaining men's undying dream for establishing human dignity, world peace and jus-

stice. The speakers underscored the need for total annihilation of all kinds of racial and communal disharmony for promoting unity, integrity and development of the mankind.

Expressing satisfaction over the recent development in world politics they said, the removal of super power rivalry would help eradicate international, regional and local conflicts between the nations.

They said we could hope for a peaceful world if we could eradicate cold war, lethal nuclear weapons and military build up and make our resources available for socio-economic development of the mankind.

**It Declaration to curb
terrorism sought**

All the political parties as well as the government must initiate joint efforts to eliminate terrorism from the campus as the problem was 'purely political', the Five-Party Alliance said on Thursday.

"Goodwill of the ruling party and sincerity of political parties and others concerned were the way out of the crisis," the Alliance Convenor Bimal Biswas told a press conference at the Taher Auditorium at Bangabandhu Avenue in the city.

Bimal Biswas was very critical of the government for its failure to take stern action against the terrorists on the campus and other parts of the society and warned it would be responsible for the consequences.

Alliance leaders including Rashed Khan Menon, Nirmal Sen, Hasanul Haq Inu, AFM Mahbulul Haq, Khalequzzaman Bhuiyan, Abdullah Sarkar, Nayeem Jahangir, Haider Akbar Khan Rono, Kazi Aref Ahmed, Moinuddin Khan Badal and Fazle Hossain Badsha attended the press conference.

Bimal Biswas in his written statement said the terrorism was a big threat to the budding democracy in the country. "Terrorism is a tool of autocrats and a great obstacle in the way of growth of democracy." Terrorism was patronised by those in power in the last 19 years to establish one-party and one-man rule and character assassination of the politicians, he observed.

Terrorism must be uprooted from the society to ensure security of public life and establishment of rule of law in the country, the Five-Party Convenor said.

People of the country hoped that after the fall of autocracy, the country's educational arena would be freed from violence.

But, he regretted, people's expectation suffered a jolt due to silence observed by the political parties for their own selfish ends.

Bimal Biswas proposed some primary steps towards ending terrorism in the country. Those include: Joint announcement by the political parties through the Radio and Television of their commitments to the matter, national leaders said to sever connections with the terrorists and expel those elements from their respective parties, allow the law enforcing agencies carry out their duties smoothly recover unauthorised arms and stern action against the suppliers of those and ban political activities of some government agencies.

Steps must also be taken to remove the problems facing the educational institutions and the student community, Bimal Biswas said and demanded of the authorities to materialise 10-point demand of the student community.
