Jute industry loses Tk 1986 cr in 8 years

With Taka 280 crore as operating deficit in 1990-91, the cumulative loss in the country's jute industry totalled Taka 1986 crore in the last eight year period beginning from 1983-84. The amount included loss of Taka 1287.52 crore by 34 mills in the public sector under Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) and Taka 65 crore by 32 mills in the private sector.

The loss represented the gap between total operational earnings by the jute industry as a whole, and its aggregate costs of production or opera-

But the gap between the national cost of production and the export prices including subsidy, both of which have been fixed by the government has persisted, according to BJMA.

BJMA figures showed that the deficit (representing the gap between national average cost of production and export price including subsidy) was Taka 3,679, Taka 4,113 and Taka 6,176 for each ton of hessian sacking and CBC respectively.

Private jute mill owners

have meanwhile complained that the government arranged funds to the tune of about Taka 80 crore during the Eid-ul-Azha and Eid-ul-Fitr of 1991 to keep the BJMC mills in operation and avert major dislocations to the units in the public sector. But no such funds were made available to the BJMA mills, inspite of several appeals to the government, the related

circles said. BJMA sources pointed out that the liquidity problems of the private sector mills had worsened in the past several months. The association has recently submitted a memorandum to the government. calling for availability of funds from the banking sector, at lest to the proportion of the government's cash transfusion to the BJMC, to help the private sector mills tide over the severe liquidity problems.

The BJMA has also urged the government to restore the previous practice of issuing yearly norms for jute mills' fi nance by Bangladesh Bank. This arrangement was earlier withdrawn by the central bank.

It has further suggested that the difference between the national average cost and the Minimum Export Price (MEP) for the years 1989-90 and 1990-91 should be calculated on the basis of actual export performance for the same years. The amount should then be reimbursed to keep the mills in operation until the government takes up a comprehensive policy for the jute industry.

1.86 lakh acres to be brought under aman cultivation

KISHOREGANJ, Aug 12: A scheme has been taken up to bring 1,86,555 acres of land under intensive aman cultivation in 12 upazilas of the district during the current season, reports UNB.

According to Agriculture Extension Department (AED) sources, 1.26,955 will be brought under high yielding variety (HYV) including Patjam while and 59.600 acres under local variety.

Of them, 21,800 acres will be cultivated in Hossainpur, 30,500 acres in Sadar, 26,500 acres in Pakundia, 30,000 acres in Katiadi, 32,000 acres in Karimganj, 8,000 acres in Tarail, 300 acres in Itna, 400 acres in Nikli, 105 acres in Austagram, 16,500 acres in Bajitpur, 15,950 acres in Kultarchar and 4,500 acres in Bhatrab upazilas, the sources added.

Meanwhile, the department has fixed the production target at 1.49,534 metric Tons of paddy during the current season.

For the successful implementation of the scheme. Bangladesh Agriculture Development Corporation distributed seeds, pesticides and other necessary agricultural inputs among the farmers at fair prices.
