After the counting was done one key out of the six keys of the two locks of the trunk was lost in the court.

When all the lawyers began searching for the key Attorney General Aminul Haque picked up a piece of paper written in a clear hand.

The letter quoted a report in a section of the Bengali dailies that the Attorney General had passed a remark at Ershad saying 'you bloody shut up".

BEIJING, Aug 13 : Chinese leader Jiang Zemin announced Monday that his country favoured some international controls on conventional weapons sales, taking a further step on joining non-proliferation efforts reports AP.
