Record number of BCS exam candidates this year

The number of applicants for the Bangladesh Civil Service (BCS) examination has increased significantly in the last few years.

This year's participation in the BCS examination has broken all previous records. A total of 31,381 applicants

applied for the 13th BCS examination for only 1134 posts. The number of candidates in 1990 were 30,677 for 1228 posts while the numbers in 1988, 1986, 1985 and 1984 were 28,419, 37,348, 33,504, 24,272 and 14,272 for 1247, 1629, 2498, 4263 and 1597 posts respectively.

The number of candidates for one post this year is 34 while the numbers in 1990, 1989, 1988, 1986, 1985 and 1984 were 25, 23, 23, 15, 6 and 9 respectively for the same number of posts.

The numbers of posts recommended by the Public Service Commission (PSC) for the 13th BCS is the lowest in the last seven years while the number of applicants is the highest within the same time-

Observers feel that the recent extension of the age-limit for government jobs from 28 years to 30 years announced by the government may have caused the increased participation in the BCS examination.

It may be mentioned that 922 persons elected in the 10th BCS examination have

The loss of life and property in recent cyclone in the coastal areas was greater as a result of deforestation and falling of trees, she said.

The Prime Minister said "as a free nation we cannot al low this process to continue which lacked farsightedness."

She called upon all to take a vow to regain the eroding forest resources and build a green and self-reliant Bangladesh for our future generation to lead a safe and beautiful life.

State Minister for Forest and Environment Abdullah Al Noman underscored the need for direct participation of the people for making the National Tree Plantation Drive a success. He said we want to make the programme people oriented one.

Arshad Pervez, a Canadian who was convicted in Philadephia of trying to export the metals in 1987 told Canadian Press the Habib European Bank put out 170,000 dollars to finance the purchase of specialty metals used to make nuclear weapons.

But Mogbool Ahmed Soomro, President of Pakistan's state-owned Habib Bank said his bank was never involved in the financing scheme nor had he ever heard of Habib European Bank.

He said Pakistan's Habib family started a second, bank. this time in Zurich, after their Pakistani bank was nation alised in the 1970s. But Soomro said the Zurich-based bank is called the Habib bank International AG. It also has a branch in Pakistan.

Soomro vowed to delve deeper into the accusation but said "so far we are unaware for youth to Japan over the next the bank's involvement in any such deal"

Omar Khan, the chief executive of the Canadian operations of the scandal-tainted Bank of Credit and Commerce International (BCCI) said BCCI was named as an intermediary in the deal, but only because the Pakistani bank lacked a Canadian office.

Anwar Querishi, Assistant Vice-President. Relation, for Habib Bank in Karachi, said the deal was supposedly made in the United States "so why would a Canadian bank be used as an intermediary for a deal in the United States?

The Pakistani bank has two branches in New York City.

Pervez was convicted in a Philadelphia court of conspiracy to file false documents to get an export licence to ship maraging 350 steel to Pakistan, of filing three false documents and of attempting to export beryllium.

Maraging 350 steel is strategic steel alloy needed to produce weapons-grade uranium. Beryllium is a metal used to boost the intensity of nuclear explosions. Pakistan routinely denies it

is making a nuclear weapon, although Washington suspended a 573 million dollars aid programme believing Islamabad had already crossed the nuclear arms threshold.

Sirajul Hossain surfaces with dissenting voice

Jatiya Party leader and former minister Sirajul Hossain Khan on Tuesday accused the JP Parliamentary Party of violating the party's constitution by voting for the Constitution 12th Amendment Bill reverting to parliamentary form of government.

"It was a gross violation of the party constitution which is in favour of the presidential system," he said at a press conference at the National Press Club.

Strajul Hossain Khan, who is a senior vice-president of JP and Acting President of its peasant wing, Jatiya Krishak Party, said, before voting for the amendment bill the party constitution needed to be changed The party's central commit-

tee had also decided to vote against the bill and accordingly the JP representative put a note of dissent at a meeting of the Select Committee of Parliament, he said. Referring to the recent

meeting between senior JP leader and Ershad in Dhaka Central Jail, he said, "I don't know what the party chief told our leaders in the jail and I would not like to comment on the statement of a man in the

Strajul Hossain Khan, who was a minister of the Ershad cabinet said, all the governments since independence, either under parliamentary system or under presidential system, were autocratic.

*From Awami League to Jatiya Party all the government in one way or other were autocratic," he said adding both parliamentary form and presidential system can give birth to autocracy."

Replying to a question as to why he served an autocrat like Ershad, Sirajul Hossain Khan said. I served under the Constitution of the country, not under any autocrat."
