The government under the on-going overall economic reform programme or what is known as Enhanced Structural Adjustment Facility (ESAF), supported by the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank, will take moves to restructure the jute industry. Indications are given about

such a restructuring programme in the Policy Framework Paper (PFP) under ESAF, dealing with the actions

and reforms to be undertaken in 1990-91 and 1992-93. The PFP for the years was finalised jointly by the government, the World Bank and the IMF before the presentation of the national budget for the current fiscal year.

The sources said, a Jute Manufacturing Study is expected to be completed by January next. The details of the restructuring programme will be worked out then. The programme will deal with the issues connected with consolidation of manufacturing capacity in the efficient mills and phasing out uneconomical public mills. Reduction of excess labour in the public mills un-

By Moazzem Hossain der Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) with adequate compensation as well as decentralisation of wage determination will also be covered under the programme.

The World Bank estimates. as were shown in its last Economic Country Memorandum (CEM), put over-employment on the basis of required labour at between 20 per cent and 30 per cent for BJMC mills. The effect of overstaffing is high labour costs. According to the bank, the ratio of total compensation to value added is often close to or exceed 100 per cent for some public sector enterprises in Bangladesh.

The most important issue for restructuring the public sector jute mills which account for 65 per cent of total loom capacity is to maintain severance payments in connection with the voluntary retirement operation to reduce overstaffing, according to the

It thinks that if the voluntary retirement programme is successful, there may be justification for limited rehabilitation activities in the jute sector, in association with privatisation of selected public sector mills. The obsolete mills should be closed down, the bank suggested in its CEM while stressing the need for determining the scope for voluntary retirement programme at the very outset for restructuring of jute manufacturing sector.

Public sector investments or development expenditures in jute manufacturing sector showed a declining trend in recent years. At current prices, such expenditures stood at Taka five crore in 1990-91 compared with Taka 5.7 crore in 1989-90. In the early eighties, the amount averaged Taka 15 crore.

Meanwhile, the sources said that the forthcoming restructuring programme for jute manufacturing sector will focus on modernisation of efficient mills. Besides, financial restructuring of both public and private mills, strengthening of overseas marketing activities and organisational and managerial restructuring of the BJMC mills including privatisation will be covered under the overall restructuring programme for the sector.

Prices of essentials rise sharply

Prices of different essentials have shown a sharp rise in the last one week in the city markets.

Salt registered a price-jump to Taka nine a kg from the previous price of Taka 8 only a week ago. Dried chillies recorded the highest pricehike, selling now at Taka 85 to 90 per kg as against Taka 60 to 65. Soyabcan oil price also increased by Taka two per kg. It sells now at Taka 38 each kg in the open market.

Powdered milk price also increased by Taka five to eight a large tin it now sells between Taka 262 and 269.

Almost all the vegetables showed about Taka two to three increase in prices. No varieties of vegetables is now available below Taka ten a kg. Potato is also dearer it sells at

Taka seven a kg against Taka tour to five. Newly harvested potato is even costlier. The rice market also showed an upward trend in last week.

Price of rice has increased by about Taka two per kg. Rice which sold easier at Taka 13 per kg (medium category) sells now at Taka 15. Among different varieties of spices, onion showed a steep rise in price. It sells at Taka 18 a kg. The price earlier was around Taka 14. The retailers said prices of onion may further go up. Chicken is however cheaper compared with other essentials. The price of a medium sized chicken varied within the range between Taka 40 and Taka 45. Fish supplies are plenty in the market but the prices are still higher.
