Artisans in the Dark

A Bangladeshi woman can almost never resist a venarashi. It's gorgeous, artistic and expensive. It also symbolises dignity. But the people who are making this saree, are very poor; most of them uneducated and are non-artistic in their living styles. They are, in fact, slum dwellers. The slum area located at Mirpur Section No 10 to 12 is completely different from other slum areas of the Dhaka city. Unlike other slums this area is occupied mostly by artisans who have been in this trade for long. This slum is famous for making venarashis, zamdanis, katans etc.

Making these sarees became a way of livelihood for them since the Pakistan days. Bihari weavers, who by family tradition were experts in making such sarees set up their small scale cottage industries in this area ever since. It is now claimed that there are as many as 3500 such cottage industries in Mirpur area alone.

If you go around this area, you will see weavers, young and old, tending threads in long lines beside the main road. After dying the expensive silk threads, they spread them for drying. Inside the area you'll see shabby looking tin-shed houses by hundreds. Look in and you will see weavers at work. These actually serve as factories. I met Nadim in

one such factory. He was knitting threads on the handmade weaving machine. He

is only 10. They said that learning to make a saree starts from childhood, Nadim, although a junior, can do a big part of a saree, but the complex finishing job is done on a separate machine by an elderly person. Nadim is an apprentice, his monthly salary is 200 Taka.

Riazuddin's factory is rather large. He owns 24 weaving machines. There are 24 skilled workers, 24 apprentice helpers and four women workers working in his factory. He makes expensive venarashis costing 8000 Taka apiece. He also makes relatively cheaper ka-

carn 1200 Taka for making one venarashi. Making one such sarce, however, takes a long time. A factory may spend three days to finish one saree in one weaving machine. And a sarce may have to go through three to four types of machines to be completed. In case of a venarashi, a weaving machine can hardly produce 3 sarces in one month.

Making these sarces are indigenous in all senses, except for the thread. The weaving machines are all locally made. Mechanics learned to make these machines from their

forefathers. The threads with which the sarces are made are expensive. The silk threads come from Japan and Rorea. Weavers buy it from the local wholesalers. One kilogram of Japanese nontwisted silk thread costs 2000 Taka and one kilogram of twisted silk thread costs 2400 Taka. These threads are used for both the base and finishing jobs. In some sarces Rajshahi silk is also used, but only for making base of a sarcc. This thread costs 1200 Taka per kg. Shahib Babu, manager of a factory said that Bangladeshi silk is not very good for the finishing job.

The designing of a sarce is done by a separate set of people. They also live in the same community. Uneducated, they have good aesthetic sense. They design from various graphs selected

cards are no bigger than 8 by 3 inches. When a saree is made, they sell it to the 1ocal wholesalers or individual customers. A local wholesaler may buy a saree for 4500 Taka and sell it to a shopowner for 5000 Taka. When the saree is finally sold to a customer the price may just be doubled. Huge profits are made by the middlemen and shopowners. But a weaver's income may hardly exceed Taka 3000 per
