# Sharif to take back stranded Pakistanis: Nasim Khan

Chief Patron of Stranded Pakistanis General Repatriation Committee (SPGR) Mohammad Nasim Khan Tuesday said, the process of repatriation of stranded Pakistanis to their homeland of Pakistan would begin before the end of 1991-92 financial year, reports BSS.

Addressing a press conference at the National Press Club Khan narrated the experiences of his visit to Pakistan between August 8 and 27 at the invitation of Kazi Husain Ahmed, Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami Pakistan.

During his stay in Pakistan Khan held fruitful meetings with Pakistan Prime Minister Mohammad Nawaz Sharif and other political leaders and par-

liament members. Khan also submitted a memorandum to Nawaz Sharif on behalf of the SPGR containing their various demands including the repatriation of the stranded Pakistanis.

Nasim Khan said, Pak Premier gave him a categorical assurance that the stranded Pakistanis would be taken back to Pakistan and would be rehabilitated in Punjab.

The Prime Minister also informed Khan that the Rabita Trust for Repatriation and Rehabilitation of Stranded Pakistanis had been reconstituted with Nawaz Sharif as its Chairman. Besides, the government had constituted a provincial board headed by Punjab Chief Minister for un-

dertaking measures to rehabilitate the stranded Pakistanis in Punjab.

Nasim Khan said, Pak Prime Minister assured him that the stranded Pakistanis would enjoy full citizen's right including right of franchise in Pakistan.

He said, on the basis of the assurances of Pakistan government and Jamaat-e-Islami Pakistan the SPGR has postponed its proposed second long march which was scheduled to begin from August 14 from different check-posts of Bangladesh to reach Pakistan.

## Arms recovered: one held

Police recovered a huge quantity of arms and ammunition from a room in a market in Wiseghat and arrested Muhammad Abu Taher (34) from the Buriganga Bhaban (Kola Market) in this connection.

According to his confession, police recovered the arms and ammunition from a fifth floor room of the Buriganga Bhaban. The recovered items include, an Italian-made revolver with six rounds of ammunition, three pipe-guns, one bayonet, five big knives, two kris, one ram-dao, five scissors, seven explosives and 22 cocktails.

Meanwhile, Dhaka Metropolitan Police arrested 98 persons on various crimes.

## Free-style movement of mastans on Khulna Varsity campus alleged

KHULNA, Sept 3: Leaders of political parties, lawyers, physicians, journalists and the local elite have expressed grave concern over the "free-style movement of mastans" on the Khulna University campus, reports UNB.

They alleged that an organised gang of mastans (musclemen) had been collecting tolls locally known as "mastani tax" from the contractors, one of whom was reportedly kidnapped a few days ago.

Contractors are now scared and want to discontinue construction works unless security of their life is fully ensured.

## Air Force Chief back home

Chief of the Air Staff, Air Vice Marshal Altaf Hossain Chowdhury returned in Dhaka Tuesday on completion of his week-long good will visit to Pakistan, according to an ISPR press release, reports BSS.

During his stay in Pakistan, he called on President Ghulam Ishaq Khan and Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif.

He also met Chief of Air Staff, Pakistan Air Force Air Chief Marshal Farook F Khan at the air headquarters and discussed matters of bilateral interests. During the visit, the Chief of Air Staff paid courtesy call on Admiral Iftikhar Ahmed Stroeby, Chairman, Joint Chief of Staffs Committee and Chief of Army Staff General Asif Nawaz Janjua.

Air Vice Marshal Chowdhury also visited different air bases, establishments, training institutions and Pakistan Air Forces Academy.

## 'AL reluctant to take verdict of people'

Minister for Education and Cultural Affairs and Deputy Leader of the House Prof A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury has called to the people to consolidate democracy through casting vote in favour of parliamentary form of the government in the coming referendum, reports BSS.

He said BNP has taken initiative to establish parliamentary form of government for materialising the hopes and aspirations of the people. He said Awami League was reluctant to take verdict of the people on the system of the government.

The Minister was addressing a series of public meetings at Burhanuddin and Doulatkhan upazilas in Bhola on Monday. Among others, State Minister for Religious Affairs Prof M A Mannan, BNP Central leader Mosharraf Hossain Shajahan and Advocate Abdul Malek also spoke.

The Education Minister said Shaheed President Ziaur Rahman has established multi-party democracy bringing an end to one-party rule which was introduced by the then Awami League government over night. He said BNP believes that the people are the source of all powers and shows due respect to their verdict. People have given their verdict in favour of BNP in all elections

## Zia introduced rule of law: Khaleda

Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia Tuesday declared BNP which came to power with people's support would always be guided by the people and the party workers, reports UNB.

Speaking at a discussion meeting organised by City BNP at the Engineers' Institution auditorium in the evening, Begum Zia called upon her party members to be tolerant and remain united against all conspiracies.

The meeting, arranged on the occasion of 13th founding anniversary of the ruling party, was presided over by City BNP President Lt Gen (Retd) Mir Shaukat Ali, MP.

The Prime Minister said the party founded by late President Ziaur Rahman had introduced multi-party democracy, rule of law and initiated politics of freedom.

The 19-point programme of President Zia is aimed at carrying the country towards self-sufficiency, she said.

"Those who didn't want

Bangladesh to stand on its own feet, conspired and killed President Zia, she alleged.

The Prime Minister said President Zia wanted to prove that the people who had fought for independence of the country could also make the country self-reliant if united.

Vicious cliques started conspiring against BNP when President Zia began to forge unity of the nationalist forces, she said.

Jatiya Jubo Dal President and Dhaka City Corporation Mayor Mirza Abbas alerted party workers against good-weather friends flocking to BNP to derive gains from the party in power.

City BNP General Secretary Salahuddin, MP, Farida Rahman, MP, Sarwar Rahman, MP, Barrister Zulmat Ali, Shah-e-Alam, Abdul Wajed Master, Kazi Abul Bashar, Shamsul Huda, Saifuddin Ahmed Milon, Habibur Rahman Mondal and Abu Mohammad Matinuddin also spoke on the occasion.

River Meghna wore a festive look during the fascinating rowing also witnessed by Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, who was in Daudkandi to lay the foundation-stone of the second Japan-Bangladesh Friendship Bridge.

The Prime Minister distributed prizes among the winners of the race, held in two categories on the vast expanse of water between Hasnabad and Daudkandi.

In the 25-oarsman category, Mohammad Shahjahan Talukder and his group from Munshiganj emerged first. Motiul Huq and party from Daudkandi second and Abdul Matin's team finished third.

Prodash Chandra Roy and his band of Kishoreganj lifted the first prize in the 50-boat category while its second prize went to Jahangir Alam's team from Daudkandi.

## EC urges parties to abide by rules of conduct during polls

Election Commission Tuesday urged all political parties to abide by the rules of conduct during the forthcoming by-elections, reports UNB.

The rules of conduct, set by the election commission prior to the parliamentary elections, are:

(a) Concerned quarters must follow the election related laws and by-laws.

(b) All political parties and candidates should extend necessary support and cooperation to the law enforcing agencies to maintain law and order situation.

(c) One must be aware of his democratic rights and should be aware of democratic rights of the others at the same time.

(d) All participating political parties and candidates should cooperate in discharging duties of the assigned officials by ensuring their security.

(e) A fair, effective and congenial election atmosphere has to be created so that the voters can exercise their right to franchise freely and at their will.

(f) Things that can create tension or can hamper the

election atmosphere should not be done.

(g) All exasperation and tension building comments or statements should be avoided during electioneering.

(h) All political parties should be vocal against all sorts of terrorism, and should cooperate with the law enforcing agencies in recovering illegal arms.

(i) Political parties should not take initiative for the release of any one held with arms during the voting hours or around the voting centres.

(j) All will have equal rights in the campaign irrespective of party and candidate. Meetings, processions, and other campaigns of the opposition can not be disturbed.

(k) Cooperation of the nearby law enforcing agencies has to be sought in opposing and defending any electoral crime.

(l) Everyone should be aware that it is an electoral crime to secure vote by bribing or temptation and using any transport or hiring the same for any voters excepting the relatives is a crime.

(m) Political parties should

harbour understanding among themselves to defend any attempts to capture voting centres through force or any other illegal activities.

(n) No candidate can make open or hidden pledge to pay subscription or any donation to any institution in the election area till the voting day for the greater interest of election campaign and voting.

(o) The election atmosphere and law and order should not be disturbed through any ill motivated rumour or conspiracy.

(p) No election camp of any candidate should be set up in and around the voting centres or restricted areas. No campaigning can be made inside the voting centres.

(q) Except the election officials and employees, only the voters will have the rights to enter in the voting centres. Political parties must keep their supporters away from roaming around the voting centres.

## RU likely to reopen Sept 20

**RAJSHAHI, Sept 3:** Rajshahi University is likely to reopen on September 20, official sources said today, reports UNB.

The residential halls of the varsity are expected to be opened for students on September 18, after about two months of closure.

The sources said the final decision would be taken at the Syndicate meeting scheduled to be held September 8 afternoon.

Prior to that, Vice-Chancellor Prof Amanullah Ahmed will meet Proctors, Proctor, Student Adviser and Deans on September 5 to discuss the reopening of the varsity besides ways of ensuring law and order on the campus.

The VC will also meet Islamic Chhatra Shibir activists. Earlier on August 31, he had a meeting with the leaders of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and pro-Awami League Chhatra League and components of Chhatra Oikya Parishad and discussed matters relating to campus reopening.

The university was closed on July 26 after armed clashes between JCD and Chhatra League and Chhatra Oikya Parishad activists on July 25.

## Parties urged to motivate people for referendum

Deputy Commissioner of Dhaka Nazmul Alam Siddique Tuesday called upon the political parties to motivate the people for their spontaneous participation in the coming referendum, reports BSS.

Mr Nazmul Alam, who is also the Assistant Returning Officer, urged the leaders to inspire the people for holding the referendum in a well-organised and peaceful manner for the greater national interest.

He was addressing a meeting of the leaders of political parties, at the conference room of the Dhaka Collectorate Building.

Various government measures for successful holding of the referendum and the government decision to strictly enforce law and discipline during the referendum were discussed, among others, in the meeting.

The meeting was also attended by officials related to the holding of referendum.

Later, the Assistant Returning Officer held two meetings at Talata Community Centre and Wari Community Centre with the city corporation officials and other related officials.

## Death condoled

Pulin Bihari Banerjee, an eminent social worker and a lawyer's assistant of Sakthira, died of old age complications at the Sakthira Modern Hospital late Monday night. He was 86, reports BSS.

Late Banerjee left behind his wife, seven sons, five daughters and a large number of admirers and colleagues to mourn his death. Sunil Banerjee, a Senior Staff Reporter of Dainik Bangla, is the eldest son of late Pulin Bihari Banerjee.

He was cremated at Palashpur burning ghat of the town.
