

Iran allows 'women only' sports

TEHRAN, Sept 3: In a further move to break its international isolation, Iran is allowing women to take up sports again, but the Islamic Republic has ruled out mixed contests, reports AFP.

Two years ago the revolutionary Komitehs in charge of enforcing Islamic code banned women from taking part in Rassanjani, who had vowed morning gymnastics that were being organised in the parks by the Tehran municipality.

The Komitchs also patrolled the streets of the capital to ensure that women were covered from head to toe and wore no make-up, jewellery or sheer hose in infringement of the Islamic dress code.

But these restrictions have been eased in recent months and now the authorities are encouraging women to take to the tennis courts, indoor gyms and swimming pools.

An international women's sports tournament is planned

for January and Iran has invited 47 countries to take part in basketball, gymnastics, swimming, table tennis and volleyball competitions.

Faezeh Hashemi, Director of the National Olympic Committee and daughter of President Ali Akbar Hashemi after his election in July 1989 to introduce reforms.

The government is also planning many sports programmes for women and we have decided to play things for them just as we would for men," Vice President Ghafouri Fard said recently.

Brasilia to bid for 2000 Olympiad pollution free, blessed with

BRASILIA, Sept 3: Brasilia will enter a bid for the Summer Olympics to take place in the year 2000, hoping to bring the Games to Brazil for the first time despite the South American nations' current economic woes, reports

"Brasilia is a candidate because it is the fruit of optimism, of faith in the future, of dynamism, and of the Brazilian people's capacity to realize dreams, said Sports Secretary Bernard Rajzman here.

Brasilia's bid, organized by the pro-Olympiad 2000 committee, must be presented before the International Olympic Committee before April 15, 1992, the selection will take place in September, 1993.

Brasilia, which was inaugurated on April 21, 1960, as the city of the future deep in the heart of Brazil, is relatively

ample space, and has an adequate hotel network with which to receive the thousands of people who flock to Olympic Games, Rajzman explained. In addition, the federal dis-

trict's government currently is investing in the expansion and modernization of Brasilia's communications and transportation systems, including the construction of a commuter rail network, he added.

Brasilia, whose population is expected to reach three million by the year 2000, faces stiff competition in its bid however, going up against strong bids from a newlyunited Berlin and Beijing, along with those of Sydney and Manchester, England.

One question that surely will be asked by the IOC is whether Brazil, which has a public-sector debt of more

than 120 billion dollars, can raise the millions of dollars necessary to stage an Olympiad

Rajzman said the Brazilian government would not fund the Games, and that the dozens of athletic and other facilities would be built by private investment, which he estimated at some 1.8 billion dollars.

To help their cause, members of the pro-Olympiad 2000 committee will lobby other Latin American officials for their support to bring the Olympics Games to South America for the first time in its history, Rajzman said.

As a possible warm-up to the Olympics Brazil also will make a bid for the 1999 Pan-Am Games, according to Andre Richer, President of the Brazilian Olympic Committee.
