Gorbachev poised to recognise independence of Baltic republics: Discussion today

Seven decades of Kremlin rule end

MOSCOW, Sept 5: Soviet lawmakers, bowing to Mikhail S Gorbachev's will, voted Thursday to end seven decades of monolithic Kremlin rule and set up an interim government to be dominated by newly sovereign republics, report

In a sign of the republics' new standing, Gorbachev was poised to formally recognise the independence of the three Baltic states. All but five of the 15 Soviet republics have declared independence.

The new State Council, the highest government body, still will run defense, security, law enforcement and foreign affairs during the tenure of the interim government.

Even Vladimir Lenin, the founder of the Soviet state, did not escape the upheaval. Before the Congress adjourned, it was proposed that Lenin's body be removed from its stately mausoleum in Red Square and reburied in Leningrad beside his mother.

MADARIPUR, Sept 5: Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia said here today that the BNP government was determined to solve all problems of the farmers, workers and the totling masses to ensure their welfare and also increase production in fields and factories, reports BSS.

Addressing three huge public meetings at Shibchar Hatir Began Math, Char Mogoria High School and Rajoir High School here, Begum Zia said the elected government also attached importance to the solution of all local problems along with carrying out the overall development activities.

The local leaders had a great role to play in this regard she said and called for electing honest, dedicated and sincere representatives in the coming

by-elections to bring about local development.

Among others, Flood Control and Irrigation Minister Majid-ul Haq, Health Minister Chowdhury Kamal Ibne Yusuf, Mrs Selima Rahman, MP, Abul Khair Chowdhury and BNP candidate Motahar Hossain Siddiqi, and Atiqur Rahman addressed the meetings.

Begum Zia referred to the misrule of the past autocratic regime and said the so-called development of that government was nothing but an eyewash. She said "wherever went during the past five months, I only saw problems and problems

Begum Zia said national wealth were plundered and public-owned enterprises were handed over to private owners at nominal prices in the name of development.

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Sept 5: With the rise of water level in four rivers of the district, overall flood situation has deterforated in Chapainawabganj. The Mahananda crossed the danger mark and was flowing 10 cm above the danger level

According to informed sources, a huge quantity of water has been released through the Farakka barrage. that has swelled the Padma and inundated a vast area of Alatuli, Narayanpur and Bagdanga union under the Sadar upazila and, Durlavpur and Panka under Shibgani upazila.

The Mahananda has already eroded parts of Poladanga and Altshaspur of Bholaghat upazila. Standing 'Aman' and other crops on three thousand acres

UNB adds from Sylhet Overall flood situation turned serious in the greater Sylhet district Thursday due to incessant rainfall and onrush of waters from the Indian state of Meghalaya submerging new areas in Sylhet and Sunamganj.

The river Surma at Sunamganj was flowing 20 cm above the danger mark while the water level of the Kushiara at Shaola and Surma at Kanaighat was rising alarmingly, officials said.

Goainghat, Kanaighat, Companiganj and Joiyantapur of Sylhet district are the worst affected upazilas where about 20,000 acres of cropland were submerged.

In Kanaighat, about 80 per cent crops have been inundated while in Companiganj 70 per cent crops went under water. Road communications with the Companigani upazila headquarters was disrupted.

People in several villages of Joiyantapur upazila have been marooned. Seven of eight unions of Goainghat upazila were badly affected by the

ment and selection as importers under ADB assistance who can fulfil the following criterion for enlistment as private importer of fertilizers under \$ 35.00 million ADB credit fund. The applications should reach the following address on or before September 11, 1991 within Govt. office hours (Office closes at 2-30 P.M.).

Criterion

- Documentary evidence showing presence in the domestic market as a fertilizer distributor indicating quantities lifted from different local factories/ports during the last two years.
- 2. Provide evidence of available logistic facilities in the form of storage capacity (tonnage), transport capacity (number and tonnage), and marketing network (number of dealers).
- Certificate of credit worthiness from a schedule commercial bank specifying positive and unconditional commitment to finance of fertilizer import. Maximum of financial commitment should be certified by the bank.
- A list of the prospective importers will be prepared based on the above criteria.
- 5. Selected importers would be required to follow ICB procedures for obtaining

Sheikh Hasina has said discussion between Awami League and BNP was continuing on the Indemnity (Repeal) Bill and hoped the government would help pass it to write off the "black ordinance" without further delay, reports UNB.

"I hope the BNP government will pass the bill in the shortest possible time to help establish democracy and rule of law in the country." The Awami League chief

and Leader of the Opposition, during her return journey from Bhola on Thursday was talking to a group of reporters who accompanied her to cover electioneering in the Bhola-2 constituency.

"Some senior ministers and the Deputy Speaker have already discussed with me the bill.... and discussion continues between BNP and Awami League," she told the news-

Asked why her party did not initiate any move to repeal the ordinance in 1979 and 1986 parliament, Hasina said, *The situation was not favourable as the military dictators were in power at that
