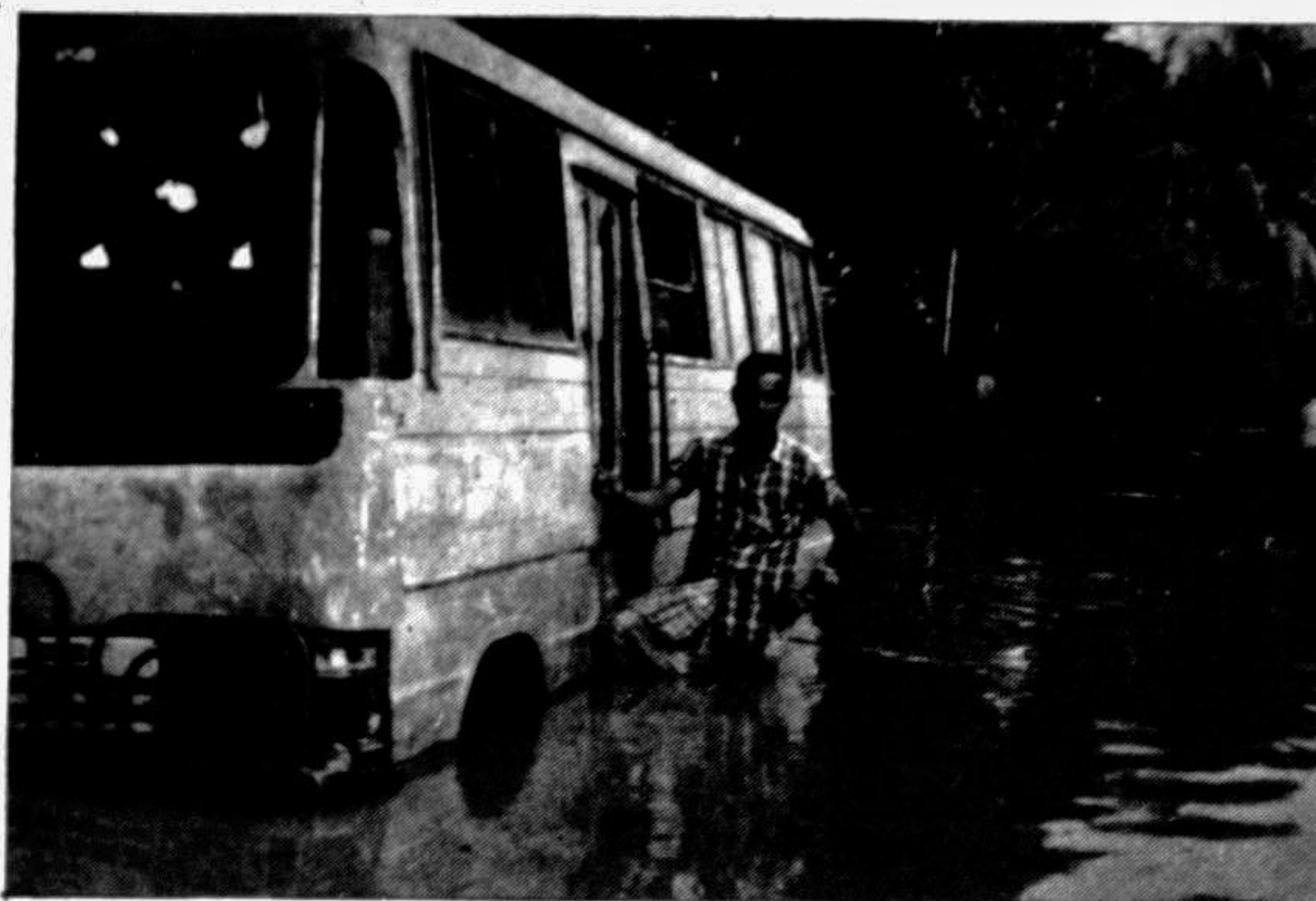

DU probe body formed

An emergency meeting of the Dhaka University Syndicate held Wednesday night constituted a committee to investigate all the incidents which took place on the campus from 9.30 Tuesday night to 10.30 am Wednesday including entry of police into Jagannath Hall premises, reports BSS.

A DU press release said, the Syndicate meeting, presided over by Vice-Chancellor Prof M Moniruzzaman Miah, expressed deep sympathy for the students who were injured in Jagannath Hall Tuesday night.

The meeting expressed deep resentment over the terrorist activities including ransacking of the office of the Vice-Chancellor, administrative building, residence of the house tutor of Salmullah Hall and the office and the residence of the Provost of Jagannath Hall. The meeting observed that the university had to incur heavy financial losses due to successive terrorism on the campus.

The meeting lauded the moral courage of the common students for helping in holding classes Wednesday despite massive terrorist activities on the campus. It also urged all student organisations and the general students to keep vigilance so that the academic atmosphere of the university is not disrupted following campus violence.

Apprising the Syndicate members of the incidents that took place on the campus between 9.30 pm Tuesday and 10.30 am Wednesday the Vice-Chancellor said, conflicting versions were received from hall, police and student sources regarding the entry of police into Jagannath Hall premises.

However, he said, the information received from hall authorities showed that all became bemused following sudden entry of police into the hall premises completely without any knowledge of the authorities. Before making any guess, the hall authorities heard the screaming of the fearful students who were moving hither and thither in panic. At the same time the sounds of bursting of tear gas shells and shootings were also heard from all around.

The provosts and some residential teachers while in their bid to know the cause of police action amid tear gas suffocation, where also injured, the Vice-Chancellor said quipping the version of the hall authorities.

The provost of Jagannath Hall then contacted over phone the Vice-Chancellor and wanted to know the reason of police action. The provost also sought intervention of the Vice-Chancellor to stop "inhuman" torture by the police. Meanwhile, the students who took shelter at the provost office for self-defence from police action also demanded of the Vice-Chancellor to immediately stop police action. The police left the campus at around 10.30 last night.

The Vice-Chancellor said

that after knowing the incidents from the provost and the students he (Vice-Chancellor) contacted the Inspector General of Police and wanted to know from him the happenings in the Jagannath Hall.

According to I G P, the VC said, the police entered the Jagannath Hall premises following secret informations that some outside armed miscreants took shelter in the Jagannath Hall.

At that time the students started brick batings towards the police who entered the hall premises. Amid brick batting the police left the venue firing tear gas shells. But the police did not enter any buildings of the hall, the VC quoted the IGP as saying.

The press release said, about 15 students were injured and taken to the hospital following clash between the students and the police. At one stage of the incident, the office and residence of the provost of the hall was ransacked and the provost and one house tutor were injured.

At about 1 am Wednesday,

the provost and all house-tutors came to the residence of the Vice-Chancellor and submitted their resignations en masse in protest against police action. However, at the request of the Vice-Chancellor they agreed to perform the supervisory activities of the hall temporarily.

Meanwhile, the press release said, after the Jagannath Hall incident, an anonymous telephone caller threatened the provost of Salmullah Hall that his residence would be blown up by bombs if police entered the hall.

The press release said, a group of students came out from Jagannath Hall in procession chanting slogans and assembled at the foot of the 'Aporajoy Bangla'. From there they went to the administrative building and ransacked all the floors of the building. During the ransacking one car was destroyed. Some typewriter machines, some furniture, telephone sets and window panes were damaged, it added.

They had died in 1988 flood while they were distributing relief materials.

The day's programme included discussion, milad mahfil and special prayer.
