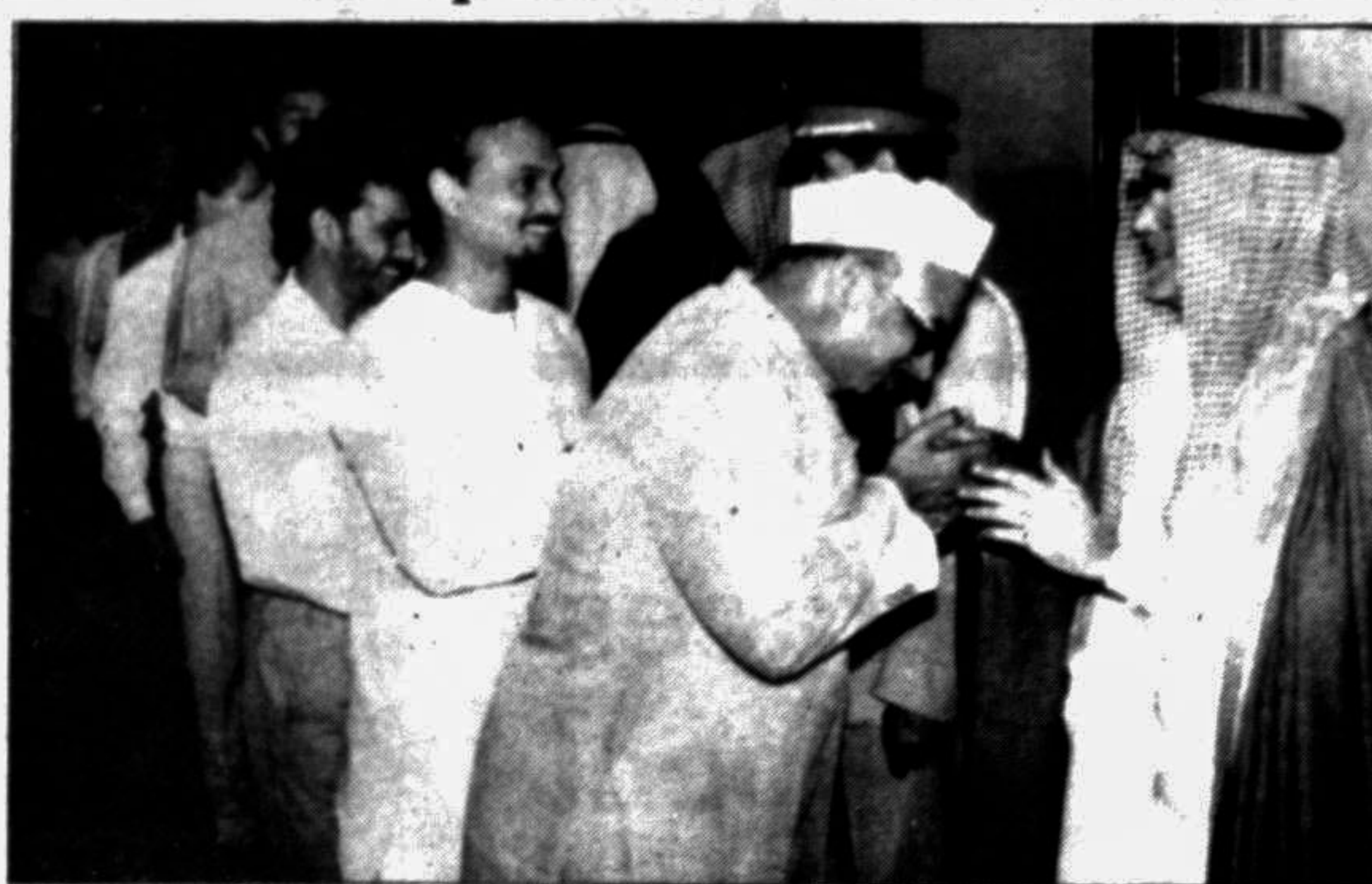
Dhaka's response during Gulf war recalled

Abdul Latif Abdullah Al-Maimanee, Saudi Arabian Ambassador to Bangladesh, Monday said the two brotherly countries of Saudi Arabia and Bangladesh were enjoying the best of political, economic, social and diplomatic relations to their mutual advantage as well as the advantage of the greater Islamic Ummah, reports BSS.

He said, "Saudi-Bangladesh relations have passed the test of time" and added that Bangladesh Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia's recent visit to Saudi Arabia has paved the way for further cooperation.

In a speech over Bangladesh Television Monday evening on the occasion of the observance of 60th National Day of Saudi Arabia, Maimanee recalled that Bangladesh's spontaneous response to Saudi Arabia's request for troops during the Gulf crisis showed Dhaka's immense anxiety for the protection and welfare of Saudi Arabia.

He further recalled that Saudi Arabia also in similar gesture extended friendly hands of sincere cooperation to Bangladesh when it suffered from severe cyclone in April this year.

He said that both the countries are the active members of a number of world bodies including United Nations, Organisation of Islamic Conference and Non-Aligned Movement and they possess almost similar outlook in those international organisations.

ernment of Bangladesh for providing help and assistance in materialising different development projects in Bangladesh and also for extending quick and timely assistance to the victims of flood and other natural calamities.

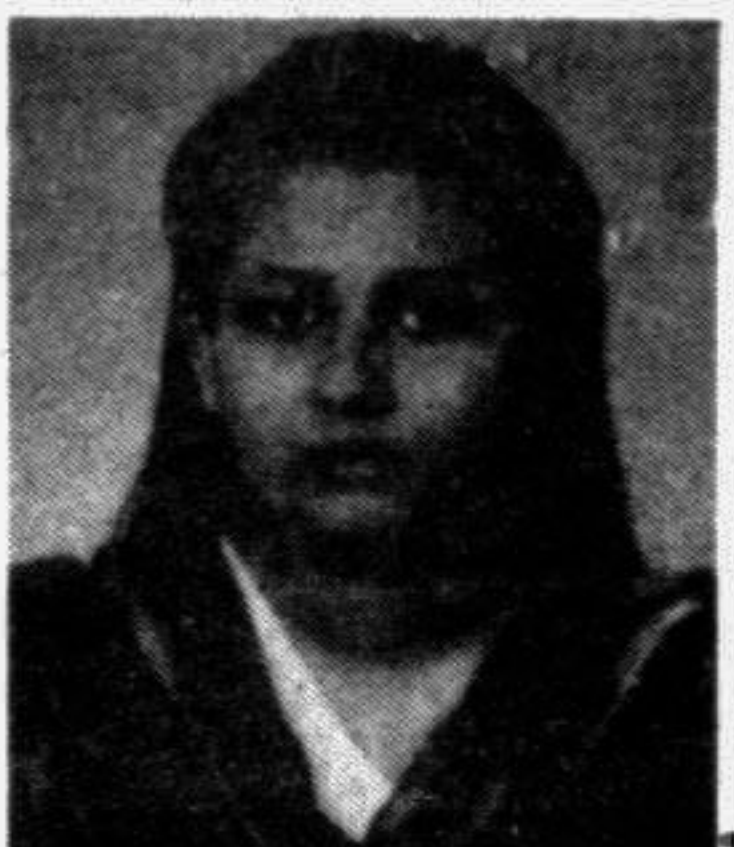
